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CONGRESSIONAL CANDIDATES REMAIN LARGELY UNKNOWN WITH THREE WEEKS UNTIL PRIMARY

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DURHAM, NH – With three weeks left before the September 11th primary, candidates for the 1st and 2nd Congressional Districts have largely not achieved widespread name recognition among residents of their districts.

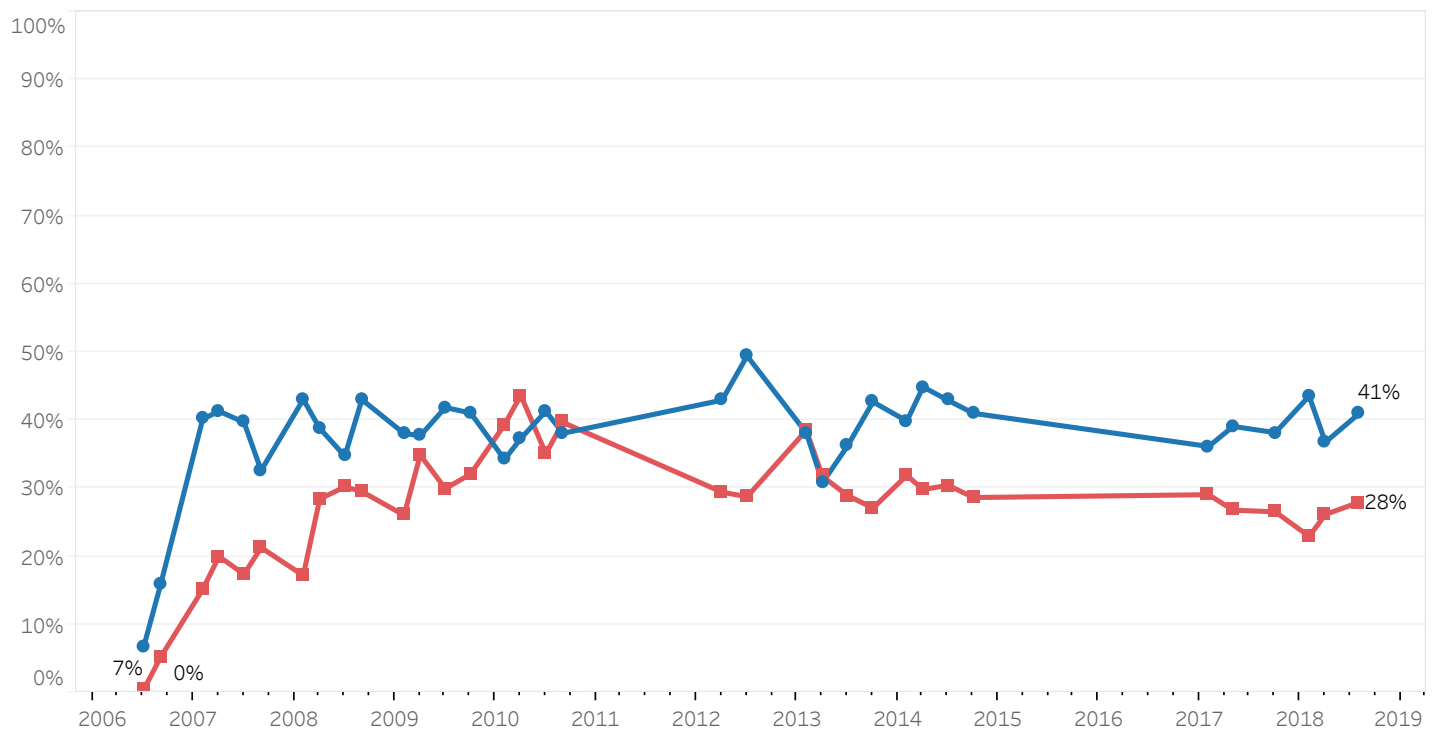
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and one (501) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between August 2 and August 19, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. Included were 278 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.9%) and 223 from the Second District (MSE +/- 6.6%).

Favorability - Carol Shea-Porter

Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who will be retiring from Congress at the end of her current term, remains somewhat popular in New Hampshire's First District. Currently, 41% of residents in New Hampshire's First Congressional District have a favorable view of Shea-Porter, 28% have an unfavorable view of her, 5% are neutral, and 26% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +13%, largely unchanged since April (+11%).

Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +65%), while Independents are neutral (+8%) and she is somewhat unpopular among Republicans (-29%).

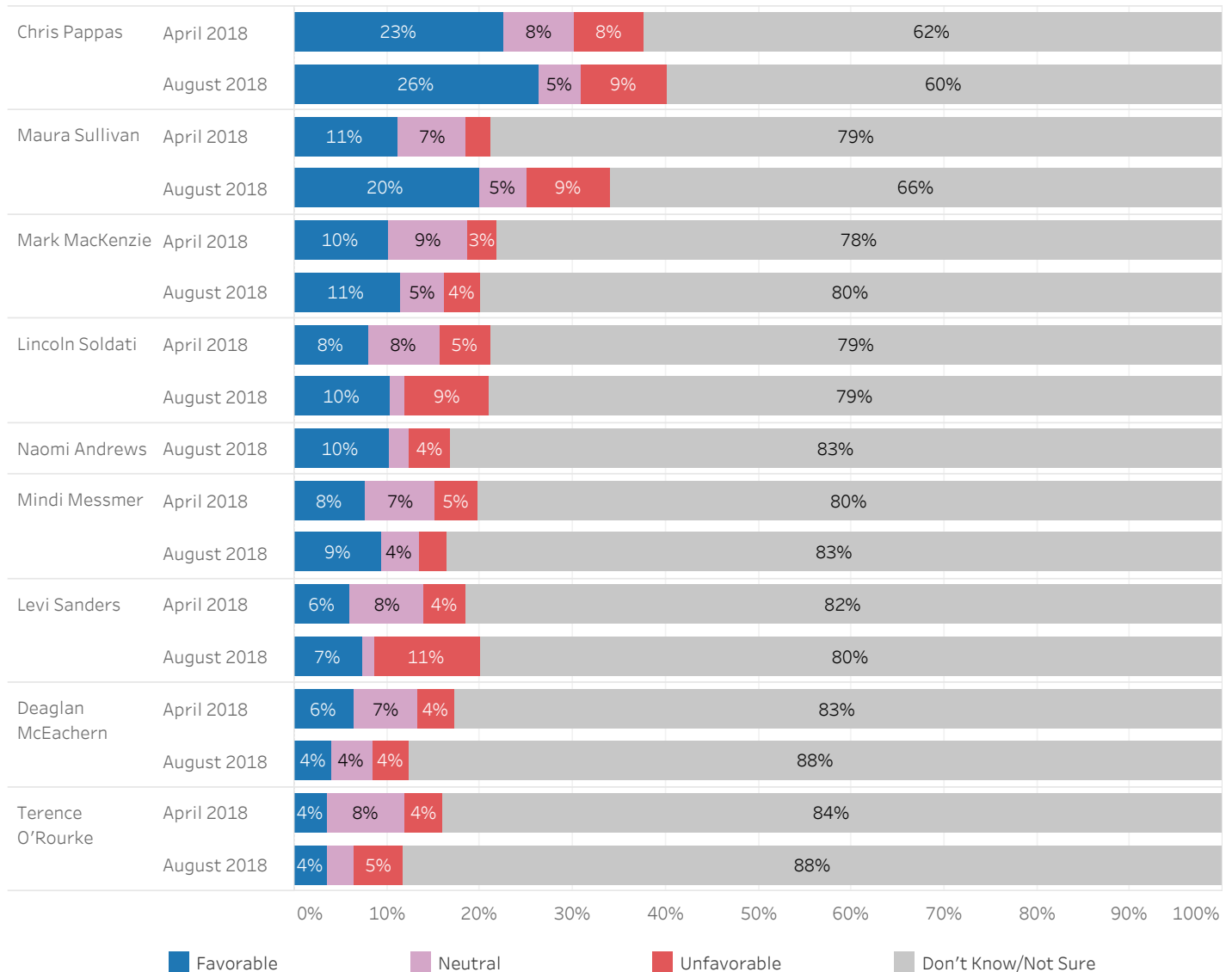
Favorability - 1st Congressional District Candidates

The race to replace Carol Shea-Porter for the Democratic nomination features many candidates. Despite the Democratic primary being less than a month away, nine candidates seeking to replace Carol Shea-Porter remain largely unknown to New Hampshire First District residents.

Executive Councilor Chris Pappas and former U.S. Defense Department Official Maura Sullivan are the most well-known candidates in the contest. A quarter of First District residents (26%) have a favorable opinion of Pappas, 5% are neutral, 9% have an unfavorable opinion, and 60% don't know or have never heard of him. One in five (20%) have a favorable opinion of Sullivan, 5% are neutral, 9% have an unfavorable opinion, and 66% don't know or have never heard of her. Pappas's favorability is largely unchanged since April (23% in April, 26% in August) while Sullivan's has increased since then (11% in April, 20% in August). Among Democrats, 38% have a favorable opinion of Pappas while 28% have a favorable opinion of Sullivan and among those who describe themselves as strong Democrats, Pappas has 57% favorability while Sullivan has 31%.

Fewer residents have a positive opinion of State Representative Mark MacKenzie (11%), former Somersworth Mayor Lincoln Soldati (10%), former Congressional Chief of Staff Naomi Andrews (10%), State Representative Mindi Messmer (9%), attorney Levi Sanders (7%), businessman Deaglan McEachern (4%), or Rochester City Attorney Terence O'Rourke (4%). At least three-quarters of residents don't know or have never heard of each of these less well-known candidates and there has been little change in their favorability since April.

1st District Democratic Candidates Favorability



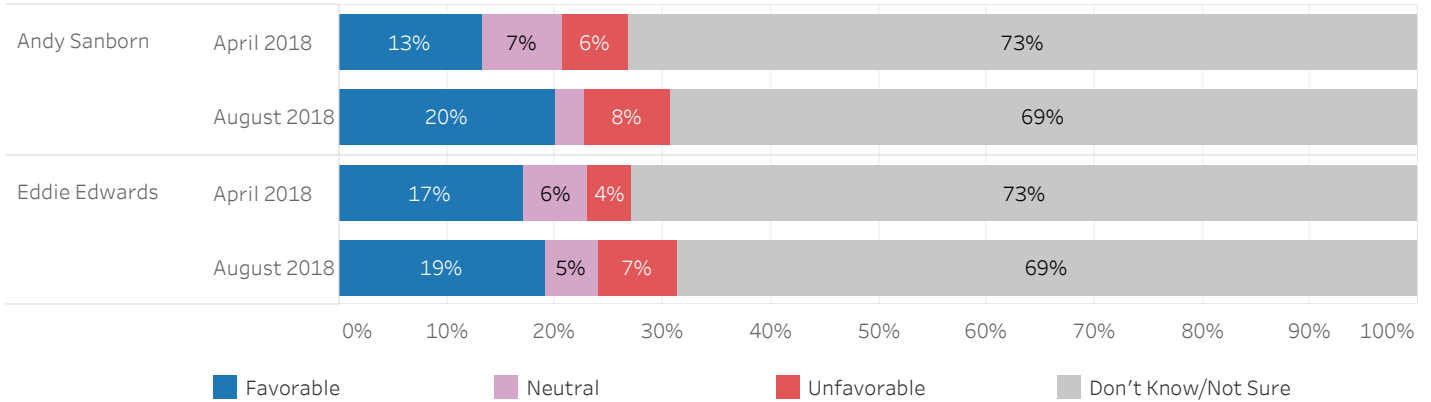
Two candidates seeking the Republican nomination for the 1st Congressional District, Former NH Liquor Enforcement Chief Eddie Edwards and State Senator Andy Sanborn, have become slightly better known since April but remain unfamiliar to two-thirds of First District residents.

Twenty percent have a favorable opinion of Sanborn, 3% are neutral, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, and 69% don't know or have never heard of him. Sanborn's favorability (20%) has increased since April (13%) while his unfavorability (8%) is largely unchanged since that time (6%).

Nineteen percent have a favorable opinion of Edwards, 5% are neutral, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, and 69% don't know or have never heard of him. Edwards's favorability (19%) is largely unchanged since April (17%).

Among Republicans, 28% have a favorable opinion of Sanborn while 30% have a favorable opinion of Edwards.

1st District Republican Candidates Favorability

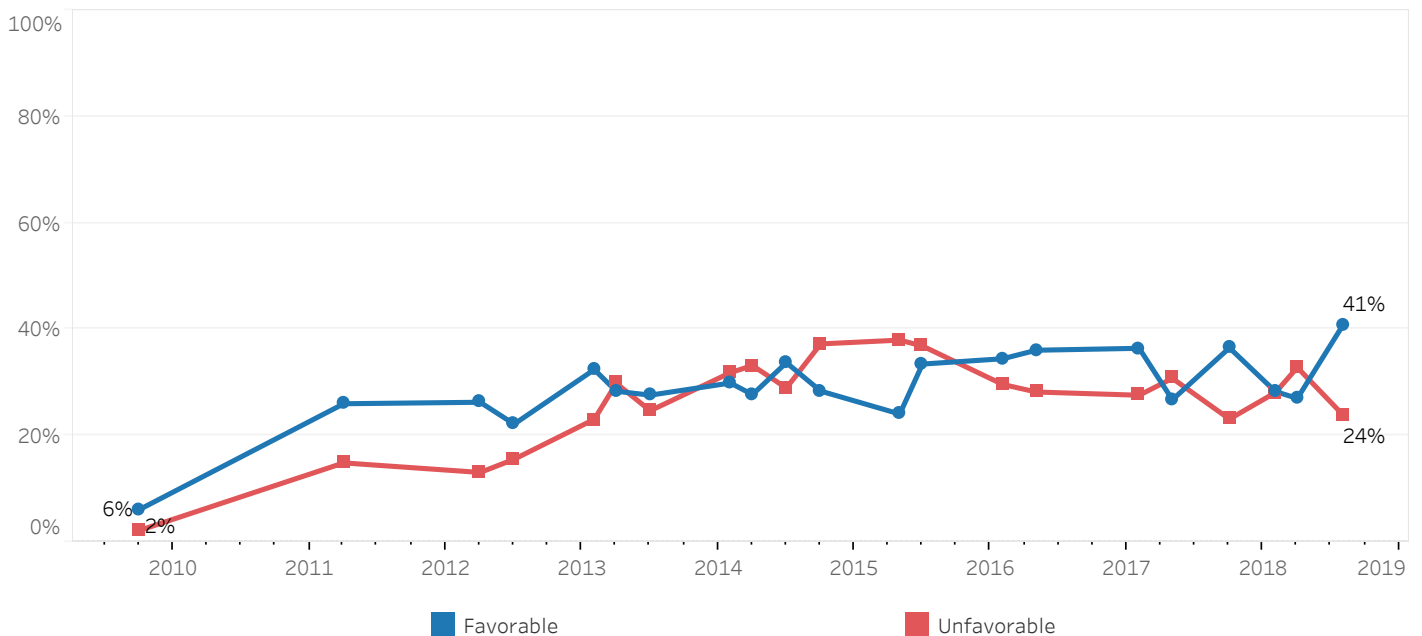


Favorability - Ann Kuster

Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster has become much more popular among Second District residents. Currently, 41% of residents of New Hampshire's Second Congressional District have a favorable view of Kuster, 24% have an unfavorable view of her, 5% are neutral, and 31% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +17%, up from -6% in April.

Kuster remains popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +60%), Independents are neutral (+3%), and she is unpopular among Republicans (-38%). All three groups view her more favorably than in April.

Kuster Favorability Rating - Second District



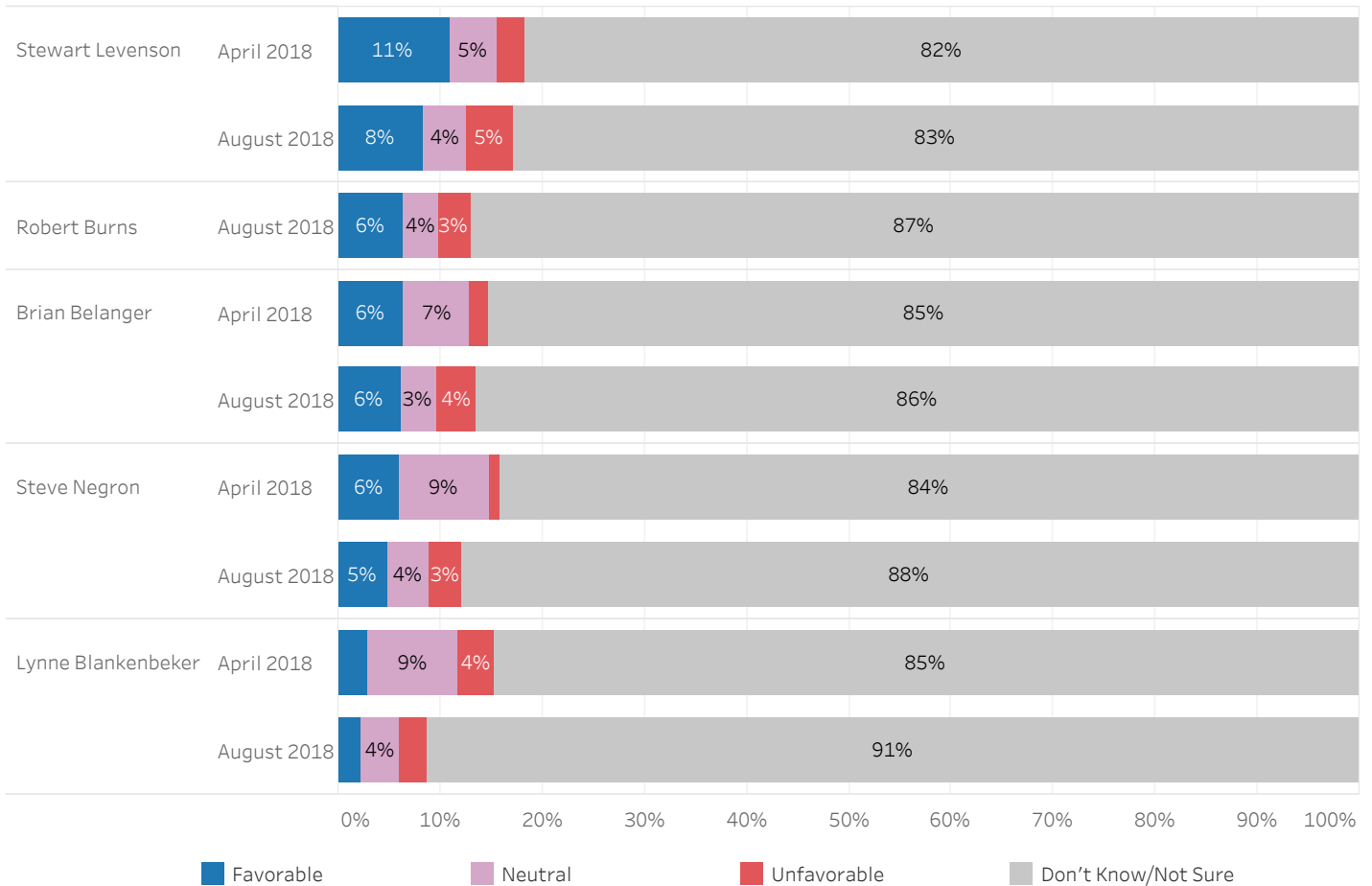
Favorability - 2nd Congressional District Candidates

Five of the Republicans challenging Kuster in the Second Congressional District continue to be very poorly known.

Eight percent have a favorable opinion of former Veterans Affairs Physician Stewart Levenson, 6% have a favorable opinion of former Hillsborough County Treasurer Robert Burns, 6% have a favorable opinion of Businessman Brian Belanger, 5% have a favorable opinion of State Representative Steve Negron, and 2% have a favorable opinion of former State Representative Lynne Blankenkemper. More than 80% of residents don't know or have never heard of each of these candidates and awareness of these candidates has decreased since April.

"It is not unusual for Congressional primary candidates to be largely unknown," said UNH Survey Center Director Andrew Smith. "Voters tend not to pay much attention to these races until after Labor Day, if at all, making it very difficult to predict who will win these contests."

2nd District Republican Candidates Favorability

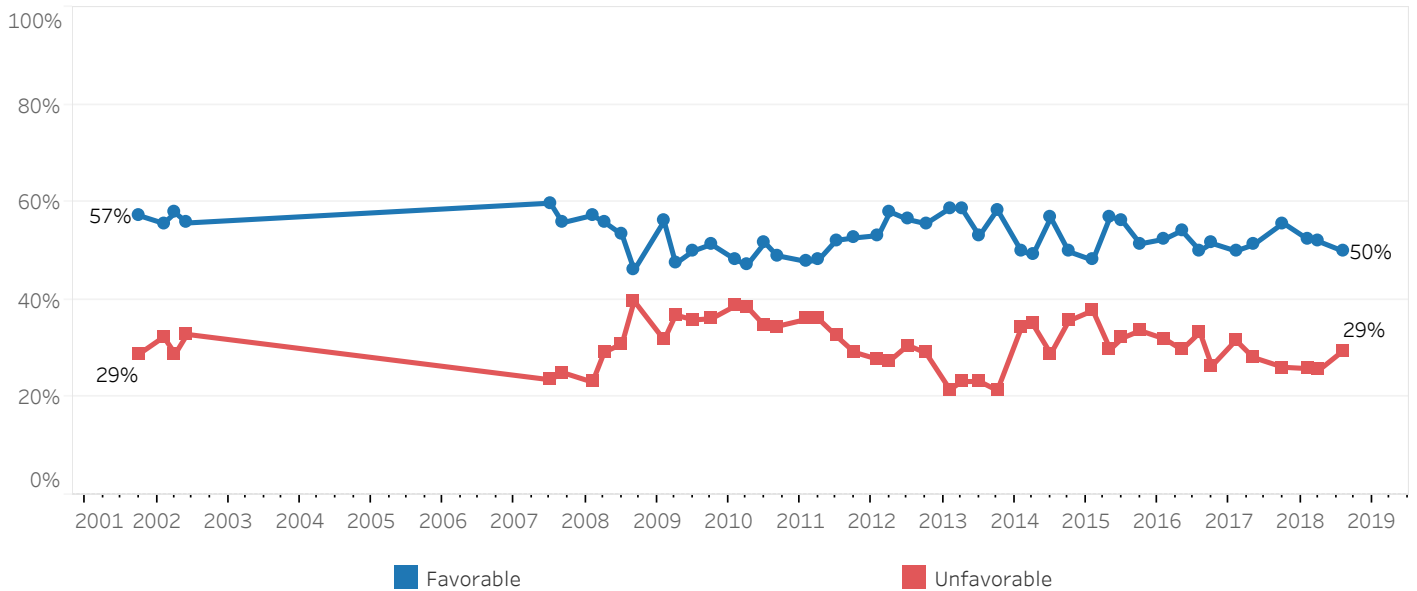


Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire senior Senator and former Governor Jeanne Shaheen remains popular in the state, but her popularity has fallen for the third consecutive quarter. Currently, 50% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral, and 13% don't know enough about her to say.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-identified Democrats, self-described liberals, NHPR listeners, *Boston Globe* and local newspaper readers, those aged 65 and older, Seacoast residents, and those who have completed postgraduate work are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Those who voted for Donald Trump or did not vote in 2016, self-identified Republicans and Independents, conservative radio listeners, and self-described conservatives are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen.

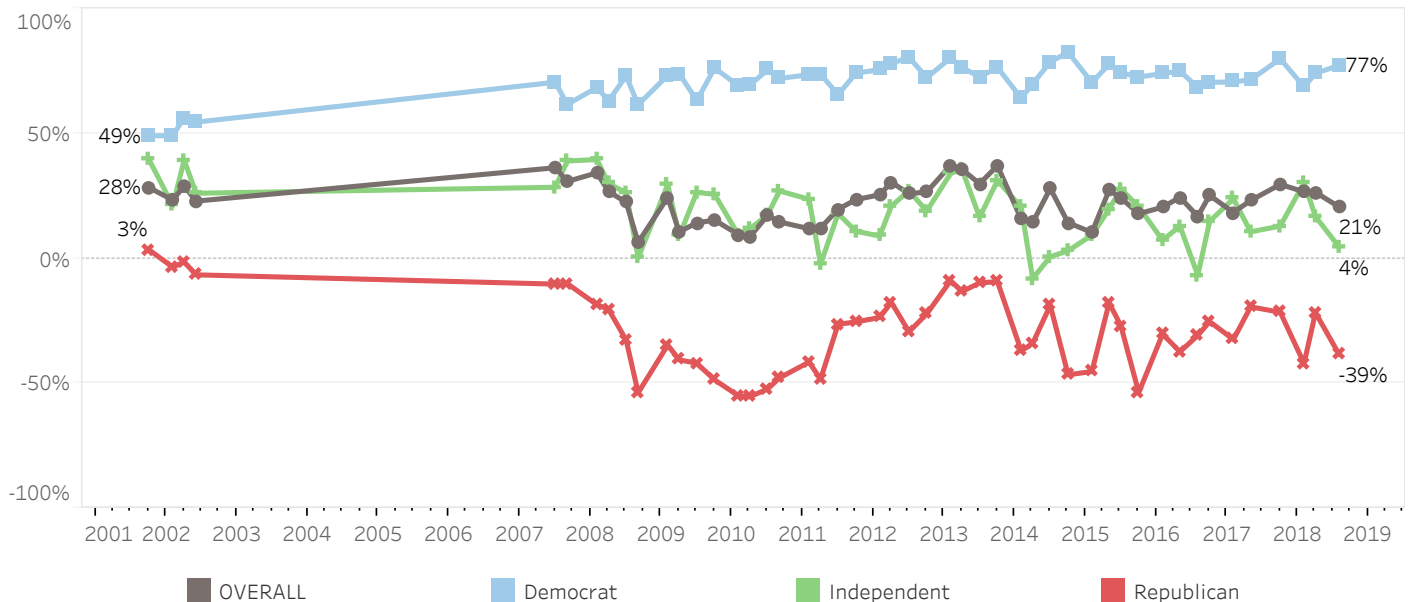
Shaheen Favorability Rating



Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have a unfavorable opinion) is +21%, down from +26% in April. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +77%) and unpopular among Republicans (-39%) while Independents are neutral (+4%). Shaheen's net favorability has declined among Independents (+17% in April, +4% in August) and among Republicans (-22% in April, -39% in August).

Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

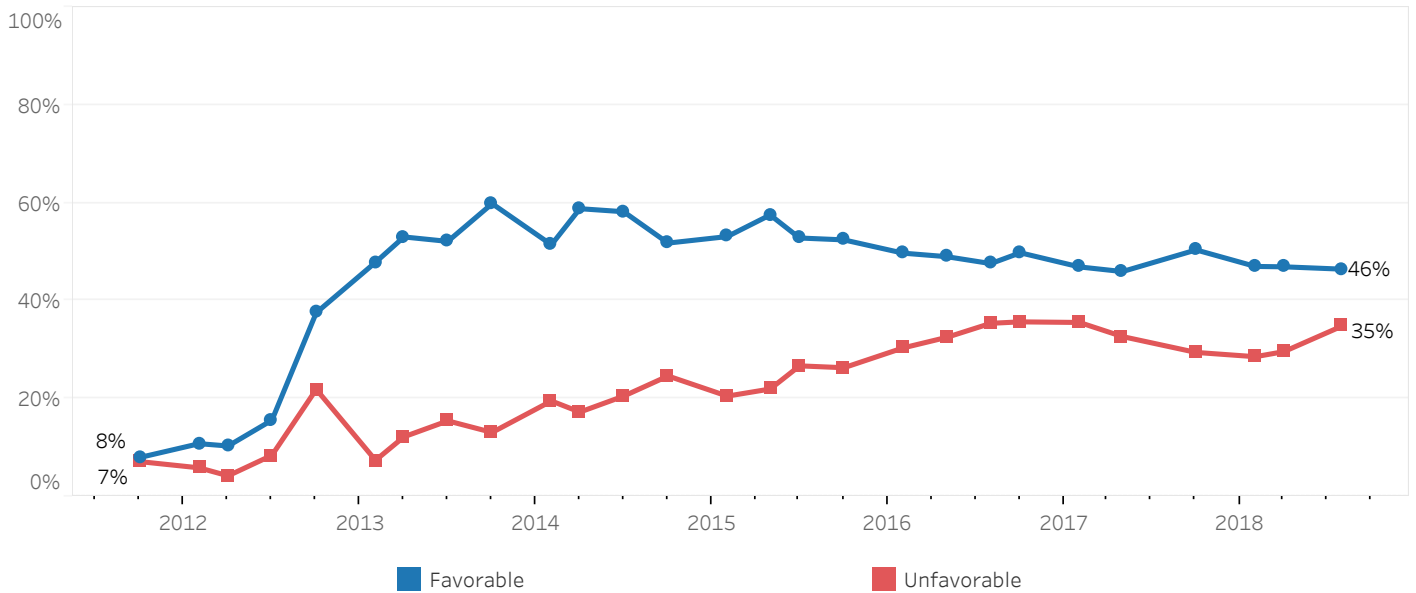


Favorability - Maggie Hassan

New Hampshire's junior Senator Maggie Hassan is slightly less popular than Shaheen. Currently, 46% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 35% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 3% are neutral, and 16% don't know enough about her to say.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, self-identified Democrats, *Boston Globe* and local newspaper readers, NHPR listeners, those who have completed postgraduate work, and those aged 65 and older are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Conservative talk radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump or did not vote in 2016, self-identified Republicans and Independents, self-described conservatives, those with a high school education or less, and those who attend religious services once or twice a month are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.

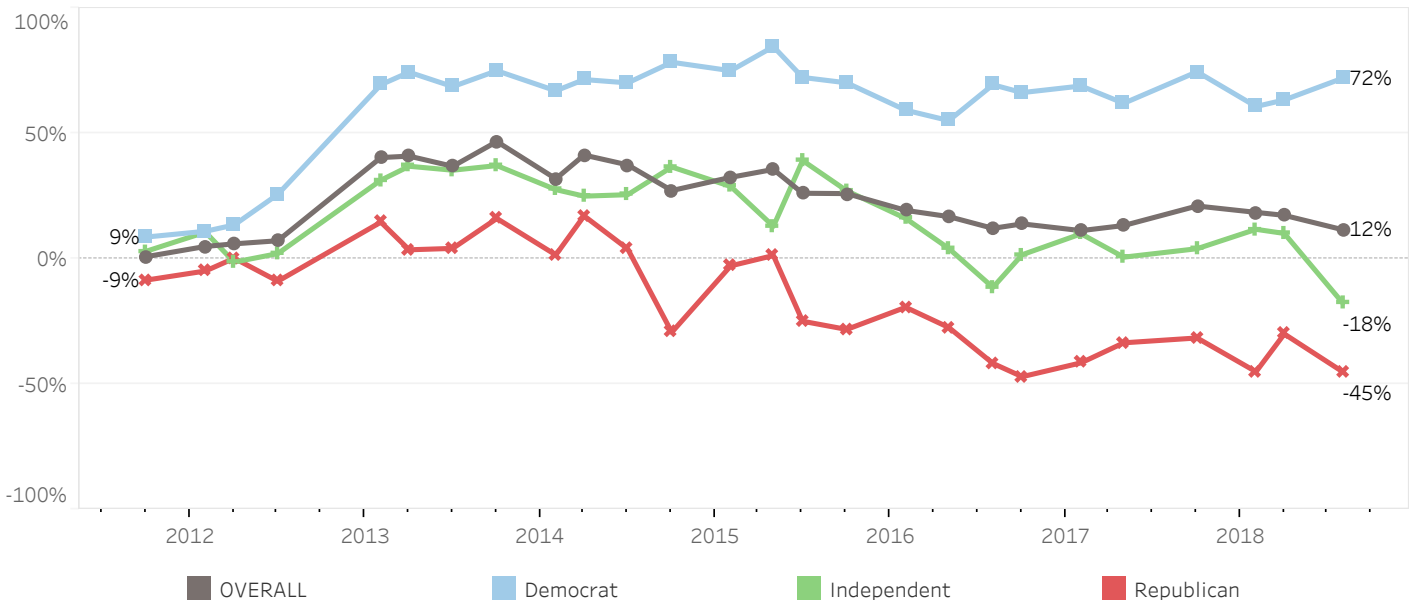
Hassan Favorability Rating



Hassan's net favorability rating is +12%, down from +18% in April. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +72%) but is somewhat unpopular among Independents (-18%) and unpopular among Republicans (-45%). Hassan's net favorability has increased among Democrats (+63% in April, +72% in August) but has fallen considerably among Independents (+10 in April, -18% in August) and Republicans (-30% in April, -45% in August).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and one (501) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between August 2 and August 19, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. Included were two hundred and seventy-eight (278) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.9%) and two hundred and twenty-three (223) from the Second District (MSE +/- 6.6%). The design effect for the survey is 1.3%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
