Record of Special Town Meeting

Weare, N. H., Sept. 13, 1932.

At a special town meeting held on the 13th day of September 1932.

The meeting was called to order and the Warrant read by Charles F. Eastman, Moderator.

ARTICLE 1. On motion of Gerald H. Hight, voted that we split this article up and act separately on the same.

On motion of Denton Dearborn, voted to raise the sum of \$3,582.00 offered by the State as a loan without interest.

On motion of C. Ernest Leeds that this money be expended on the road from North Weare to Riverdale by way of East Weare. The motion was lost. On motion of C. Ernest Leeds that this money be expended on the road from North Weare to East Weare. A ballot was taken upon which 108 voted in the affirmative and 76 in the negative and the motion prevailed.

Record of Town Meeting

Weare, N. H., March 8, 1932.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of Weare, on the 8th day of March 1932, at nine o'clock in the forenoon.

The meeting was called to order and the Warrant read by Charles F. Eastman, Moderator; also the posting of the Checklist by the Supervisors. Whole number of names on the Checklist 800.

ARTICLE 1. Proceeded to ballot for town officers.

The Moderator called a recess for 30 minutes.

Met after recess and proceeded to ballot for town officers.

The whole number of votes given in was 401.

Necessary for choice, 201.

For Selectman for three years. Denton Dearborn had 2; Hiram E. Grant had 145; Gordon W. Porter had 242 and was declared elected by the Moderator, and in open meeting, took the oath of office by law prescribed.

For Town Clerk. Charles F. Davis had 1; Frank H. Peaslee had 389 and was declared elected by the Moderator, and in open meeting, took the oath of office by law prescribed.

For Overseer of the Poor. Eva Leggett had 1; Ralph Perkins had 1; George Gunn had 1; Albert Edmunds had 1; Fred C. Jones had 1; George Waterman had 1; G. W. Porter had 1; Blanche Gunn had 2; Richard Welch had 5; Harold T. Wood had 6; Hiram E. Grant had 320 and was declared elected.

For Treasurer. May Hadlock had 1; Blanche Gunn had 1; Frank Tucker had 368 and was declared elected by the Moderator, and in open meeting took the oath of office by law prescribed.

For Road Agent, South Division. Albert S. Farmer had 1; Malcolm Dearborn had 2; Charles F. Davis had 2; Frank A. Philbrick had 359 and was declared elected by the Moderator, and in open meeting, took the oath of office by law prescribed.

For Road Agent, North Division. Lewis C. Ilsley had 2; George G. Hood had 155; Charles F. Bennett had 227 and was declared elected by the Moderator and in open meeting, took the oath of office by law prescribed.

For Road Agent, East Division. Bernard L. Phelps had 132; Fred E. Purington had 242 and was declared elected by the Moderator, and in open meeting took the oath of office by law prescribed.

ART. 2. Upon motion of Allen W. Sawyer, voted to raise the sum of \$2,250. dollars to defray town charges.

ART. 3. Upon motion of Cleves G. Ellsworth, voted that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Allen W. Sawyer for Trustee of the Trust Funds. This being done the Moderator declared Allen W. Sawyer elected Trustee for three years.

ART. 4. Upon motion of J. Hardy Legge, voted that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Jennie W. Eaton, Trustee of the Library. This being done the Moderator declared Jennie W. Eaton elected Trustee for three years.

ART. 5. Upon motion of Fred C. Jones to raise the sum of \$4,478. dollars for the repair of highways. George A. Waterman offered an amendment to the motion to reserve

25% of this amount for Winter Roads. The motion as amended was carried.

ART. 6. Upon motion of David C. Whitaker, voted to raise the sum required by law to obtain State Aid.

ART. 7. Upon motion of Maurice J. Grant, voted to raise the sum of \$100. dollars for observance of Memorial Day.

Upon motion of Maurice J. Grant, voted to take up Article 17 at this time.

ART. 17. Voted to dismiss the Article.

ART. 8. Upon motion of Denlon Dearborn, voted that it be left with the Selectmen to make provision for the collection of taxes.

ART. 9. Upon motion of Forrest Dearborn to dismiss the article. The motion was lost.

Upon motion of Frank H. Peaslee, voted to allow a discount on all taxes of 3% May 1st and 2% July 1st.

ART. 10. Voted to dismiss the Article.

ART. 11. Upon motion of Denton Dearborn to use the Australian ballot at all Town Meetings.

Alfred Osborne offered an amendment to the motion that the town use the Australian ballot at all annual Town Meetings. The motion as amended was carried.

ART. 12. Upon motion of Denton Dearborn to raise the sum of \$200. dollars for band concerts. A division was called for. A division being had 254 voted in the affirmative and 0 in the negative and the motion prevailed.

ART. 13. Upon motion of Ren W. Philbrick, voted to dismiss the Article.

ART. 14. Edward T. Breed offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Resolved: that the town of Weare raise and appropriate the sum of \$500. dollars as a bonus for Dr. Whitcomb of Contoocook, provided he will locate here as a resident physician, to be paid to him \$50. dollars each month in advance. If at any time his practice should be ample for his support these payments are to discontinue. The resolution was rejected.

ART. 15. Upon motion of Forrest Dearborn, voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of payment of taxes.

ART. 16. Upon motion of Frank H. Peaslee, voted to approve the By-Laws as adopted by the Selectmen regarding Sunday sports.

By-Laws: The game of football, baseball, golf and hockey where admission is charged, or collection is taken, shall be allowable between the hours of 1 to 7 P. M. It shall be lawful to sell foodstuffs, gasoline, automobile sundries, printed matter, tobacco, candy and soft drinks.

ART. 18. Upon motion of Frank Tucker, voted to dismiss the Article.

ART. 19. Upon motion of Allen W. Sawyer, voted to exempt the Osborne Memorial Hall from taxes for a period of ten years.

Upon motion of J. Hardy Legge, voted to exempt the Halestown Grange Hall from taxes for a period of ten years.

Upon motion of Cleves G. Ellsworth that the State Road be built in the South Division beginning at the garage and going in the direction of Deering line. The motion was lost.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Weare in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Weare on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To choose by separate ballot one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.
4. To choose by separate ballot one Trustee of the Library for three years.
5. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways, including the winter roads.
6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the amount necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways.
7. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
8. To make provision for the collection of taxes.
9. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount of 3% on taxes paid on or before May 1st, 2% July 1st and 1% September.

10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any property which may be acquired through Tax Collectors deeds.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.) for white pine blister rust control to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for band concerts.

14. To see what action the Town will take in regard to buying a chassis for the fire truck and raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the same.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.) to be used with one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) furnished by the State for the construction of a State Aid road from Dunbarton line to the State Aid road at Robie's Corner.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

ART. 2. Voted that Roland Barnard cast one ballot for Gertrude W. Osborne for clerk for the ensuing year, which was done, and the said Gertrude W. Osborne was declared elected clerk, and in open meeting took the oath of office prescribed by law.

ART. 3. The whole number of tickets given in for a member of the School Board was 88, upon which Roland Barnard had 3, Helen F. Dearborn had 37, and Roland A. Barnard had 48, and the said Roland A. Barnard was declared elected a member of the School Board for three years, and in open meeting took the oath of office prescribed by law.

ART. 4. Voted that the clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Bert O. Sawyer for treasurer, which was done, and the said Bert O. Sawyer was declared elected treasurer for one year.

ART. 5. On motion of Frank L. Eastman, voted that we pay our School District officers three dollars (\$3.00) per day.

ART. 6. On motion of Allen W. Sawyer, voted that we accept the report of the School Board as printed in the Town Report.

ART. 7. On motion of Edward T. Breed, voted that we elect auditors to audit the school accounts.

Voted that Charles F. Eastman, Theodore Flanders and Edward T. Breed audit the school books.

ART. 8. Moved by Frank L. Eastman and seconded. that we cut our teachers in this town 25%.

On motion of Edward T. Breed, voted that we amend the motion so that it will read 10% instead of 25%.

Division of house: Yes, 64: No, 3.

Voted that we cut the amount of money called for in the appropriation for teachers' salaries 10%.

On motion of Helen F. Dearborn, voted that transportation be let out to the lowest responsible person who puts in a bid.

On motion of Albert J. Nichols, voted that the janitor's job at our High School be let out to the lowest responsible bidder.

A petition from Riverdale was read as follows:

Riverdale, N. H., April 6, 1932.

To the School Board of the Town of Weare, N. H.
Gentlemen:

The undersigned citizens of Riverdale respectfully request of your honorable board that a public school be kept the coming year in the school house at Riverdale.

We submit :

That in the number of scholars to be taught in this and the River Road district that they are approximately the same. Not more than one or two difference at the present time.

That the school house on River Road is out of repair—unsanitary and ill situated. That the yard is wet and small.

That the school building at Riverdale is in perfect repair, with a dry yard in which children may play.

That in the matter of transportation, two or three scholars at Riverdale have been obliged to travel nearly one mile in order to be transported to the school at River Road whereas the scholars from there would be carried directly from their homes to the Riverdale school house. For these and other reasons which might be enumerated we claim that the Riverdale school house is the logical and sensible place in which to teach the children of these two districts and we trust that this favor may be allowed.

The figure that shows most conspicuously on the preceding table, is that of the number of tardinesses per pupil. Weare has more than twice as many as the average of the state as a whole. Examination of the school registers shows that more than two-thirds of all the cases of tardiness in the district can be traced to the children of eight families—one family of four children having a total of 148 tardinesses for the year.

OUR SCHOOL BUILDINGS

In an effort to save expense, no extensive remodeling was undertaken on any building during the past summer. The primary room at East Weare received a repainting inside. Some other buildings needed a few minor repairs.

At about the time of the opening of school in September, complaint was made to the State Board of Health that the River Road building was unfit for school purposes. State officials then directed the Weare school board to make certain specified repairs on that school if it was to continue in use. The use of the Riverdale school instead was considered, but the expense of remodeling that building to meet standard requirements promised to be greater than the cost of putting the River Road school in condition to merit approval. Accordingly, the school board decided upon the less expensive plan: and the River Road school, at a cost of about \$100, has a new and substantial floor, rearranged windows and desks, and a fresh coat of interior finish. One more window will be needed to meet the standard for lighting, but the State Board agreed to approve the building temporarily without this, as funds were lacking.

Among needed repairs for the coming year, the East Weare school demands attention. The roof has begun to leak, and toilet facilities, not decently adequate for any school, are especially unsanitary with the large number of pupils enrolled there.

OUR HIGH SCHOOL

This year we have the largest enrollment in the history of Weare High School. The total membership of the senior high school is 56—showing an increase of nearly 20% over our last year's enrollment of 47. Two of these are tuition pupils—one from Deering and one from Dunbarton.

An important change in the school curriculum was made at the beginning of the present school year. Bookkeeping, which has been offered hitherto as an elective subject for freshmen and sophomores, will now be made available for juniors and seniors instead. Such practical or vocational studies are of greater benefit if taken late in the course; there is then less time for students to forget before they have occasion to use their knowledge. In place of the freshman-sophomore subject thus moved ahead, a course in arithmetic and business forms, called Junior Business Training, is offered. This forms a good foundation for a course in bookkeeping, as it deals in a practical way with common business transactions such as bank accounts, borrowing money, insurance, taxes, etc. At the same time it provides valuable review in the study of arithmetic. This course in Junior Business Training has for two or three years been offered as a junior high school subject, but has proved rather difficult for seventh and eighth grade pupils.

To fill the gap in the junior high curriculum caused by the removal of the subject mentioned above, the eighth grade this year is devoting more time to United States history, with the related studies of civics and geography. These three branches together, for the lack of a better name are termed "Social Science," and are given two periods of each day instead of one, during the junior high school years.

Continuing its creditable record of winning prizes in competition with other schools, Weare's exhibits at Hopkinton Fair won the sweepstakes again in 1932. Our boys also won the Fruit Judging Cup in the annual contest at Durham.

Opportunities for improved self-expression are offered to our students in various ways. The American Legion continues to cooperate by offering prizes for an annual contest in public speaking, open to seventh and eighth grades. The senior high school is entering the prize speaking contest sponsored by the state university; and boys of the local chapter of the Future Farmers of America compete for state and district awards in public speaking.

ECONOMIES, EFFECTED AND POSSIBLE

The school board has undertaken to keep within the limits of its reduced appropriation by the following means:

- a. We have dispensed with the services of music supervisor.
- b. We have reduced the salaries of teachers.
- c. We have postponed school repairs, cutting expense for this item to the minimum.
- d. We have closed the Rockland school, transporting its pupils to East Weare.

Further opportunities for economy are hard to see, unless the district wishes to carry the policy of consolidation still farther, and close more of its small schools. Even this plan is not easy to apply, as we have no central graded buildings in which pupils from outlying schools can comfortably be accommodated.

The question of further reduction of teachers' salaries is undoubtedly in the minds of some who will read this report. Investigation of the living costs of teachers is being made, the results of which are not entirely available at the time this is written; but so far as can be judged from present information, the only item of a teacher's expenses which has materially decreased is that of clothing. Clothes cost about 25% less than they did three years ago; but every other item—board, travel, books, summer study, doctor's bills, insurance, etc.—is practically on the same level of cost as it was in 1930. Any further decrease in teachers' salaries should be matched by a proportionate cut in living expenses.

AGE OF ENTRANCE TO FIRST GRADE

Each year parents request the privilege of sending to school some children who are too young to do well the work of the first grade. These parents make the mistake of thinking that if the child gets an early start, his chances of progress through the school course will be improved. The opposite is likely to be the case; for the child usually finds new tasks coming to him from year to year that are just a little too hard for a child of his age to grasp, while the more mature members of his grade can learn them easily. The result is frequently a failure to be promoted at some point in the course, with resulting discouragement; or more often a case of being a little behind the others all the way along, and barely making the grade. If no pupil entered school until after he had passed his sixth birthday, the chances of success on the part of all would be improved; and a child would seldom lose by it if he should wait until he were seven years old before entering.

CONCLUSION

For the faithful work of the teachers, the willing cooperation of parents and school board members, and the friendly help of many people in the work of carrying on our schools during the past year, grateful acknowledgment is here made. In our efforts to carry on during hard times, and to make our tax dollars go farther than ever, let us not forget that our children can grow up but once; and that whatever luxuries or conveniences we must ourselves do without in these times, we must take no action that will stunt the physical, mental or moral development of those who will have to shoulder our burdens when we shall lay them down.
