Town Warrant

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield, in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, two Trust Fund Trustees, Auditor and all other necessary town officers.
- 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for
 - a. Town officers' salaries.
 - b. Town officers' expenses.
 - c. Election expenses.
 - d. Municipal Court expenses.
 - e. Care and repair of town buildings.
 - f. Police department.
 - g. Health department and Vital Statistics.
 - h. Sewer maintenance.
 - i. Highway and bridges.
 - 1. Snow removal.
 - 2. Town maintenance.
 - 3. Street lighting.
 - 4. General expense highway department.
 - j. Public library.
 - k. Town poor.
 - 1. Old age assistance.
 - m. Memorial day.
 - n. Memorial Field.
 - o. Soldiers' aid.
 - p. Band Concerts.

- q. Cemeteries.
- r. Interest.
 - 1. Temporary loans.
 - 2. Town debt.
- s. Sidewalk maintenance.
- t. Payment on principal of town debt.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club and American Legion, for public purposes, the free use of the town hall.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$375.00 to complete payment for construction of Little River bridge on the Bethlehem Road under State Aid law.
- 6. To see if the town will accept State Aid construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town roads, raise and appropriate for the purpose the sum of \$276.73.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate not to exceed the sum of \$1,200.00 to be paid to the Whitefield Village Fire District for hydrant service for the coming year, and for services of the fire company and apparatus in fighting fires outside of said District, but within the limits of the town.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate not to exceed the sum of \$500.00 to build a cement sidewalk on Highland Street from end of present walk near Snow tenement to end of walk at Sawyer place.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to make reasonable contributions in the form of supervision, materials and | or equipment on projects which

require the expenditure of Federal funds by Works Progress Administration or any other public body.

- 11. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds of the town to an amount not exceeding \$11,300.00 for the purpose of refunding outstanding indebtedness of a like amount as authorized by Chapter 48 of the Laws of 1935 and under the provisions of the "Municipal Bonds Statute."
- 12. To see if the town will vote to lease the Easterly Factory Building, with rights connected therewith, upon a cancellation of the present lease with the Gardner Pad Company.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to make certain changes in the present lease to the Mellin-Quincy Mfg. Co. of the Westerly Factory Building.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to approve of a transfer and assignment of the present lease to the Gardner Pad Company of the Easterly Factory Building.
- 15. To see if the town will appoint a zoning commission to consist of five members, to recommend boundaries for zoning districts in said town and to recommend appropriate regulations therefor, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 42 of the Public Laws.
- 16. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds, or otherwise.
- 17. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.
