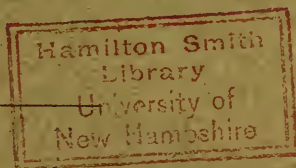

The number of scholars registered in our schools for the year is eighty-five.

The number of children enumerated by the Truant Officer between the ages of five and sixteen, eighty-three.

New Grammars were purchased for our schools at the beginning of the Spring term, and other changes in text books are much needed.

We are sometimes asked if we are *satisfied* with a school. We are *gratified* with the progress which has been made in our schools, but we should be *satisfied*, only with perfection in our work, and that we do not expect to attain.

It is very important that pupils be present at the beginning of the term and attend faithfully from day to day their several classes; otherwise they can hardly have a proper interest in their studies, and must lose much of the benefit they might receive. We would like to have all children come from their homes with the determination of being industrious and obedient.

We would like to have every scholar on the list of those who will not be tardy or absent without good reason.
