

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Chatham:

This report will deal almost entirely with financial matters.

The estimated total expense of operating the school for the current year is \$4,500. As revenue available you have approximately \$3,750, leaving an anticipated deficit of \$750.

This situation has arisen, 1 think, because the district has in the past failed to expend the money allowed by the state for the items for which the state granted the allowance, but has expended the money for other school expense for which no allowance is given. Naturally any such sums not expended under the conditions of the grant are regarded as indebtedness of the district to the state, and consequently the \$1,400 to which Chatham was entitled this year has been reduced to \$828.24 in satisfaction of \$571.76 due the state on previous payments. This, of course, leaves Chatham square with the state but it leaves the district also with an accumulated deficit of \$750. The only business-like course is to raise the money and start in next year with an appropriation sufficient to meet the needs of a carefully considered budget.

The equalized valuation of Chatham for next year is \$316,423, and the amount of the five dollar tax will be \$1,582.12 You will be notified before school meeting of the amount of state aid to be given next year, and if this added to \$1,582.12 does not equal your operating expense you should appropriate enought extra to balance your budget. I should expect that next year you would receive a very substantial amount from the equalization fund.

The interests of the school children are well cared for this year, and 1 wish to express my appreciation of the sincerity and co-operation of all of our teachers.
