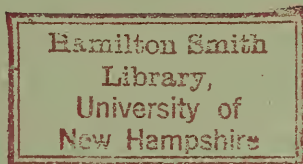

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hopkinton in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town hall in said Hopkinton on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- (1) Town officers' salary.
- (2) Town officers' expense.
- (3) Election and registration.
- (4) Expense and care of Town Hall.
- (5) Police Department.
- (6) Fire Department.
- (7) Vital Statistics.
- (8) Cemeteries.
- (9) Town Poor.
- (10) Interest on Notes.

3. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges in addition to that required by law, estimated \$4,000.00.

4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for general expenses of the highway department and street lighting.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate

the sum of \$2,464.50 for State Aid Construction Class II on the West Hopkinton Road, the State to appropriate the sum of \$2,464.00; or will accept State Aid Construction Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,091.18 the State to appropriate \$4,364.72.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept the following Cemetery Trust Funds, the income to be used as directed, subject to the provisions adopted at Town Meeting, March 1925.

1—From Mrs. F. Gertrude Goodwin for the Charles A. Morrill-Iddo K. Kimball lot in the Contoocook Cemetery, \$100.00.

2—From Col. David Corser, \$100.00 income to be used for the care of James A. Heath lot in Contoocook Cemetery.

3—From the Estate of Ida J. Hardy the sum of \$100.00 the income thereof to be used in caring for the Samuel A. Hardy lot in Contoocook Cemetery.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the building of sidewalks in the precincts of Hopkinton and Contoocook; the amount to be divided as follows:—\$250.00 to Contoocook and \$150.00 to Hopkinton; the appropriation to either precinct to be void unless said precinct raises a like amount; the amounts to be spent under supervision of the executive committee of the precinct and the selectmen of the town.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for control of White Pine Blister Rust.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used in cooperation with the State Highway Department for highway and village improvement purposes in Hopkinton Square.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of Hopkinton Free Public Libraries.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for observance of Memorial Day.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the employment of a District Nurse and the other health expenses.

13. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of 1936 tax levy.

14. To see if the town will vote to allow two per cent discount on all taxes paid on or before July 15, 1936.

15. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to distribute inventory blanks not earlier than April first.

16. To act upon reports of town officers, library trustees and committees.

17. To hear and transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

From the above table it may be noted:

1. That about four less days of school were lost than the previous year.
2. The percent of attendance was slightly lower. Every parent should make a strong effort to keep his children in school unless they are ill.
3. The amount of tardiness has slightly increased. We hope for a better record next year.

HEALTH

The report of the school nurse, Mrs. Agnes M. Milton, shows a very successful year's work in the number of corrections made. The number of pupils found with defective vision was six, of whom four had corrections made. Five were reported with defective hearing and three corrections made. Seven of the ten cases of defective tonsils received corrections, and seventy of the one hundred having defective teeth. Toxoid treatment was secured for sixty.

ACTIVITIES

In March joint debates were held among the three high schools of the union, including Henniker, Hopkinton and Warner. The series was won by Hopkinton, and its debating team went to Lewiston, Me., to partake in the annual interscholastic debates held there under the auspices of Bates College.

The pupils of the West Hopkinton School, with the assistance of their teacher, purchased a piano for school use. Funds were raised by various means, by the pupils.

ADULT EDUCATION

Beginning in November weekly classes in cabinet making were held at the shop of Mr. Francis Blanchard, the instructor. This was a Federal Emergency Education Project. This year the same work is being carried on by Mr. Blanchard as a W. P. A. project.

IMPROVEMENT OF SCHOOL GROUNDS

By means of funds furnished by the Contoocook Woman's Club, substantial swings and see-saws with steel pipe frames

were installed at the Contoocook elementary school. This was greatly needed and is a valuable addition to the equipment of the school. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the Club for their interest and timely assistance. When the playground back of the school building is smoothed and the few boulders remaining there are removed, an ample and suitable place for all outdoor games of the school will be provided.

The plot of land in front of the school has been graded and covered with loam. A gravelled horse-shoe shaped drive has been put around it. With the final seeding down of the plot next spring, and the judicious placement of a few shrubs, the appearance of the schoolgrounds will be vastly improved. This work was begun as a W. P. A. project in the fall of 1935. When it is fully completed the district may well be proud of the school and its surroundings.

At the Main Road School a fence was erected between the driveway and the cement road, leaving a passageway at each end. This prevents the thoughtless or accidental running of the pupils down the steep bank into the much travelled road. A safety patrol has been organized at this school to enable the pupils to cross the road without accident.

GIFTS

A large Victrola and records, in excellent condition, were given to the Hopkinton Grammar School, by Mrs. Alice Turner, in memory of Miss Ellen C. Roberts.

The Tyler School received a reed organ, the gift of Mrs. Frank Kenyon.

Both these instruments are very useful in promoting the school work in music. In behalf of the pupils and teachers of the schools mentioned, we wish to give public recognition of the interest of the donors, in the advancement of music appreciation in the district.

CONCLUSION

We have found our work with the teachers and the board of the district very pleasant. "Work together", the motto of the chairman of the board, Mr. Charles H. Peaslee, has been the principle followed by the teachers, Superintendent and Board. It is only by following this principle that the educational interests of the district can be advanced.
