SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the School Board of Jefferson:

On the basis of last year's budget a deficit in this year's business was anticipated as the state aid plus the \$5 tax on equalized valuation did not equal the estimated cost of elementary schools. Through certain economies in administration, and good business management on the part of the school board, we shall close the year with all bills paid and a small balance.

Two schools were closed this year. The Highlands school was combined with the school at Starr-king and the Cherry Mountain school was closed by a satisfactory arrangement with parents and a saving to the district of several hundred dollars. The same plan with regard to both the Highlands and the Cherry Mountain school should be continued another year if possible. There are too many pupils and too many grades at the Meadows school for one teacher. I recommend that you have two teachers in this school next year.

Estimates for next year's budget are based on the above recommendations.

The High school situation will never be satisfactory until there is a reorganization by which the principal and assistant can give their entire time to grades 9 to 12 inclusive. That, however, would increase the appropriation for the high school about \$600 as we would lose the state aid we now receive on account of teaching the seventh and the eighth grades as part of the high school. The estimate for the high school in the budget for next year is based on the present arrangement. If a change is desired it is up to the voters to decide.

The high school needs new seats and will have to have them soon. Modern adjustable desks would cost them about \$450.

The Riverton school needs painting inside and out and some work will need to be done at the Meadows school. The estimate of \$300 for repairs will only take care of what is absolutely necessary.

We have been fortunate in our teachers this year and without exception they deserve our thanks for their loyalty and conscientious work.
