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**MINUTES OF TOWN MEETING**  
**MARCH 4th, 1975**

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Meeting called to order by Moderator Frederick Branscombe at 7:30 P.M. to act upon the following subjects.

**ARTICLE #2**

To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

George McGee Sr. moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,386.00 necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year. Laurence Gilman seconded the motion. The vote was affirmative.

**ARTICLE #3**

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Court expenses.

Laurence Gilman moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,830.00 to defray District Court expenses. David Mayhew seconded the motion. The vote was affirmative.

**ARTICLE #4**

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation and maintenance of the Town Building.

George McGee Sr. moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,850.00 for the operation and maintenance of Town Buildings. David Mayhew seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

**ARTICLE #5**

To see how much money the Town of Lincoln will vote to raise and appropriate for Employees Retirement and Social Security Taxes.

Earl Rannacher moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500.00 to defray costs for Town Employees Retirement and Social Security Taxes. Robert Leclerc seconded the motion. The vote was affirmative.

## ARTICLE #6

To see how much money theTown will vote to raise and appropriate for a Contingency Fund.

Roland Bourassa offered the motion that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used as a Contingency Fund. Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #7

To see how much money theTown will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department.

David Mayhew moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$48,515.00 to defray Police Department costs for operation. Roland Bourassa seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #8

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

Joseph McInnis moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,394.00 to defray the cost of Fire Department operations. Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #9

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to cover payment of premiums for all forms of insurance.

Robert Leclerc moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,777.00 to defray payments of premiums for all forms of insurance. The motion was seconded by Clifton Dauphine. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #10

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.

Clifton Dauphine moved that The Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be used in the Civil Defense Program. The motion was seconded by Dosilva Dutilly. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #11

To see how much the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Health Department.

Earl Rannacher moved and George McGee Sr. seconded the motion that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,898.00 to defray the cost of the Health Department.

David Mayhew moved to amend Article 11 to increase the amount recommended by \$5,180.00 for a total appropriation of \$16,078.00. The motion to amend was seconded by George McGee Sr. The vote on the amendment was in the affirmative. The vote on the original article as amended was in the affirmative.

George McGee Sr. moved that the town consider article #46 at this point. Robert Leclerc seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #46

To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to convey a portion of a certain tract of land described in the deed of the Roman Catholic Bishop of Manchester to the Town of Lincoln dated July 23rd, 1970 by deed or mortgage to the Industrial Development Authority, a corporation and agency of the State of New Hampshire or Burndy Corp., a corporation of the State of Connecticut upon such terms and in such form as the corporation may require in connection with the use of such premises for the construction of an industrial building or facility.

George McGee Sr. moved that the Town of Lincoln authorize the Selectmen to convey a portion of land that portion being approximately 10 acres from the tract of land owned by the Town and described in the deed of the Roman Catholic Bishop of Manchester dated July 23, 1970 to either the Industrial Development Authority, a corporation and agency of the State of New Hampshire or Burndy Corp., a corporation of the State of New York for the sum of \$1.00 so long as the described land be used for the construction of an industrial building or facility, and that the Selectmen be authorized to negotiate with the owner a sum of money to be paid in lieu of taxes. The motion was seconded by Dosilva Dutilly. The vote was in the affirmative by majority. There was one nay vote.



## ARTICLE #12

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to operate and maintain the sewer system.

George McGee Sr. moved and Laurence Gilman seconded the motion to have the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,430.00 to defray the cost of operation and maintenance of our sewer system. David Mayhew moved that the sewer maintenance budget be amended by the sum of \$10,000.00 to be used to provide the extension of the sewer system into the Town owned land commonly known as The Old Airport Site. The amended total to be \$22,430.00 for sewer operation and maintenance. The motion to amend was seconded by Clifton Dauphine. The vote on the amendment was 62 yeas and 0 nays. The vote on the article as amended was 69 yeas, 0 nays.

## ARTICLE #13

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to operate and maintain the Town Dump

Dosilva Dutilly moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to defray costs of operating the Town Dump and to authorize the continuance of the Study Committee as appointed last year to complete the dump study and report its conclusions and recommendations to the voters. The motion was seconded by Clifton Dauphine. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #14

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the snow removal from private driveways.

Maurice Clark moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for snow removal from private driveways. The motion was seconded by Roland Bourassa. Lawrence Woodward moved to amend the Article to read that business properties plow their own properties and be excluded from the service of the Town plow for their driveways. Daniel Bourassa seconded the amendment. The vote on the amendment was yeas 20, nays 30. The amendment defeated. The vote on the original article was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #15

To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance.

Robert Leclerc moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$32,100.00 to defray the cost of Town Maintenance for the ensuing year. Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion.

David Mayhew moved the Highway Maintenance Budget be amended by the sum of \$10,000.00 to be used in the extension of a Town Street into the land commonly known as the Old Airport Site. The total Highway Maintenance Budget to now read \$42,100.00. George McGee, Sr. seconded the motion to amend.

The vote on the amendment was in the affirmative. The vote on the original article as amended was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #16

To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for Street Lighting.

Robert Leclerc moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 to defray the cost of Street Lighting. Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #17

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.72, the State to contribute \$838.15 for Town Road Aid.

George McGee, Sr. moved and David Mayhew seconded the motion for the Town of Lincoln to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.72 as the Town's share of the Town Road Aid Program, and appropriate the sum of \$838.15 as the State's share on the same program. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #18

To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Town Public Library.

Earl Rannacher moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,332.00 to defray the cost of Library Operations. Lawrence Woodward seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #19

To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of Town Poor.

Laurence Gilman moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the support of Town Poor. The Motion was seconded by George McGee, Sr. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #20

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Robert Leclerc moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to defray cost of Old Age Assistance. Clifton Dauphine seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #21

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Recreation.

Earl Rannacher moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 to defray the cost of operating a summer and winter recreation program. Roland Bourassa seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #22

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to operate and maintain the Water Systems.

George McGee, Sr. moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,670.00 to defray cost of operation and maintenance of the Municipal Water Systems. Laurence Gilman seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #23

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

Lawrence Woodward offered the motion that the Town Of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to defray cost of Cemetery Operations. Earl Rannacher seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #24

To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for Advertising and Regional Associations.

George McGee, Sr. moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,150.00 to be used in support of our Advertising and Regional Associations. The breakdown to be Chamber of Commerce \$500.00, White Mts. Regions Asso. \$500.00, and the Humane Society \$150.00. The motion was seconded by David Mayhew. The vote was in the affirmative with one "nay" recorded.

#### ARTICLE #25

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Joseph McInnis moved that the selectmen be authorized to hire money in anticipation of taxes. Motion seconded by Roland Vezina. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #26

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to expend on the projects, and/or debt retirement schedules voted in this warrant that may develop from monies paid in the town by the state or federal government.

Roland Vezina moved that the Town of Lincoln appropriate and authorize the selectmen to expend on the projects and or debt retirement schedules voted in this warrant that may develop from monies paid to the Town by the state or federal governments. Helen Gilman seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #27

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to convey any real estate obtained by tax collector's deed and to execute any deed or deeds thereof in the name of the Town.

Roland Bourassa moved that the Town authorize the selectmen to convey any real estate obtained by Tax Collector's Deed and to execute any deed or deeds thereof in the name of the Town. David Thompson seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #28

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of all Debt Retirement Schedules due during the ensuing year.

Earl Rannacher moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$296,463.25 for the payment of all debt retirement schedules due during the ensuing year. Laurence Gilman seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #29

To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to apply for and expend any monies that may be forthcoming for the Federal Emergency Manpower Program.

David Thompson moved that the Town authorize the selectmen to apply for and expend any monies that may be forthcoming for the Federal Emergency Manpower Program. Roland Goodbout seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #30

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Legal Expenses.

David Mayhew moved the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to defray cost of Town Legal Expenses. Robert Chase seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #31

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Patriotic Purposes.

Earl Rannacher moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as the Town's share in any and all Patriotic Purposes. Daniel Bourassa seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #32

To see if the Town will vote to have the New Hampshire Tax Commission audit the Town Books.

Richard Chase moved that the Town acquire the services of the Division of Municipal Accounting, N. H. Department of Revenue Administration to audit the Town Books. George McGee, Sr. seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #33

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the General Administration Account \$10,000.00 for the purpose of Public Safety.

George McGee, Sr. moved that the Town withdraw the sum of \$10,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to be applied to the Appropriations for Public Safety. David Mayhew seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #34

To see if the Town will vote to rescind article #2 of the Special Town Meeting of September 11, 1972 authorizing the appropriation of \$17,500.00 as the local contribution to the cost of the construction and maintenance of A Public Medical Facility.

David Mayhew moved and George McGee, Sr. seconded the motion that the Town rescind its past action as inacted under article #2 of the September 11, 1972 Special Town Meeting, whereas it appropriated \$17,500.00 as the local contribution to the cost of construction of the Medical Center. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #35

To see if the Town will vote to create, establish and maintain a Mosquito Control District.

George McGee, Sr. moved and Laurence Gilman seconded the motion that the Town of Lincoln would create, establish, and maintain a Mosquito Control District. A committee to serve on the Control Board will be appointed by the selectmen. The vote was in the affirmative.

## ARTICLE #36

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Planning and Zoning.

Laurence Gilman moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,541.00 of which \$1,041.00 will be the Town's share for operation of the North Country Council for one year and \$500.00 to defray any cost of the Local Planning Board. George McGee, Sr. seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative with one "nay" vote recorded.

### ARTICLE #37

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs to the Water Reservoirs.

Earl Rannacher moved and Lawrence Woodward seconded the motion that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to be used in the repairs of the two Reservoir Dams. The vote was in the affirmative.

### ARTICLE #38

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Town's share of the repair of the Loon Mt. Bridge.

George McGee, Sr. offered the motion that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,844.00 for the balance of the Town share of necessary repairs to the Town Bridge at Loon Mountain which crosses the Pemigewasset River. David Mayhew seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative with one "nay" vote recorded.

### ARTICLE #39

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a Case Tractor-Loader.

David Mayhew moved and Laurence Gilman seconded the motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,750.00 for the purchase of a Case Tractor-Loader. The Vote was in the affirmative.

### ARTICLE #40

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a water line extension on the Maltais Farm Road.

Earl Rannacher moved that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to be used in the extension of the Municipal Water Line on Maltais Farm Road. The motion was seconded by Burt Larue. The vote was in the affirmative.

### ARTICLE #41

To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a portable generator.

Robert Leclerc moved and Ted Marden seconded the motion that the Town of Lincoln raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,-

000.00 for the purchase of a portable generator. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #42

To see what sum of money the Town will authorize the selectmen to transfer from surplus to apply against the appropriations authorized in this warrant.

David Mayhew moved that the selectmen be authorized to transfer such sums of money from surplus as may be required to maintain the present tax rate. Laurence Gilman seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #43

To see what sum of money the Town will authorize the selectmen to transfer from surplus to a Capital Reserve Fund pursuant to RSA 35:1 and as authorized under RSA 35:5 for solid waste disposal.

David Mayhew moved and George McGee, Sr. seconded the motion to pass over article #43 at this time as the Solid Waste Study Committee has not completed or unraveled the complexities of this problem, much less the state and federal government. The vote to pass over was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #44

To see if the Town will accept transfers of land from Linwood Development Corp. and, in exchange, deed to Lin-Wood Development Corp. certain parcels of land, in order that the Town may have title to the Class 5 Highway as constructed and presently maintained, and that the Development Corp. may have title to land not occupied by said highway.

George McGee, Sr. moved and David Mayhew seconded the motion that the Town of Lincoln accept transfers of land from the Lin-Wood Development Corp. and in exchange, deed to Lin-Wood Development Corp. certain parcels of land, in order to correct the survey of the road as built, including the right of way as deeded by Franconia Paper Corp. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #45

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to apply the unexpended balance of the Town Building Appropriation amounting to \$4,420.00 pursuant to Chapter 33, Section 3A to



the Town Building Renovating Project.

David Mayhew moved and Earl Rannacher seconded the motion that the Town of Lincoln vote to authorize the selectmen to apply the unexpended balance of the Town Building Appropriation in the amount of \$4,420.00 to the Town Building Renovation Project.

Roland Bourassa moved to amend the motion that the money be used for the exterior of the building only. The amendment was seconded by Daniel Bourassa. The vote on the amendment was in the affirmative. The vote on the original motion was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #47

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to group certain department appropriations on the warrant in the presentation of ensuing year's budgets.

George McGee, Sr. moved and William Hogan seconded the motion to pass over this article at this time. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #48

To see if the Town will vote to reconsider its action under Article #40 of the 1969 Town Meeting and repeal the adoption of the curfew law as provided in RSA 31:43A.

George McGee, Sr. moved and David Mayhew seconded the motion that the Town reconsider its action under Article #40 of the 1969 Town Meeting and Repeal the adoption of the Curfew Law as provided in RSA 31:43A and rescind the action of the previous vote. The vote was in the affirmative.

#### ARTICLE #49

To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Murray Clark moved that the Town rescind the action and vote taken on the amendment to Article #53 of the March 8, 1974 Town Meeting which stated that all delinquent tax payers be reported in the Town Reports by name. N. N. Bartlett seconded the motion. The vote to rescind the action was in the affirmative, with two "nay" votes recorded.

Discussion was held on the disposition of the ruins of the Lin-

coln Inn. There is at this time litigation involved in this matter and the Town can not move to resolve this hazard for the time being.

The motion to adjourn was made by N. N. Bartlett at 10:25 P.M., the motion was seconded by David Mayhew.

such federal, state, or other assistance as may be available for the improvement and enlargement of the Municipal Water Systems, and to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of said assistance as outlines in N.H. R.S.A. 33:7-B ET SEQ., as amended, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

39. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of preparing a Facilities Plan on sewerage and sewage treatment facilities which are requirements contained in the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 ET SEQ.) and will qualify the town for Federal Funds, such sum to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds or Notes not to exceed \$15,000.00 under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (NH R.S.A. 33.1 ET SEQ., as amended) and to authorize the selectmen to issue and negotiate such Bonds or Notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such Bonds or Notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Lincoln, and to allow the selectmen to expend such monies as become available from the federal government under the Financial Assistance Program of the Construction Grants section of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 ET SEQ.) and pass any vote relating thereto.
40. To see what sums the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of improvement and enlargement of the Municipal Water Systems including Pump Stations, Treatment Works, and such other related facilities inclusive of Land Aquisition, Easements, and Rights of Way as are required, such sums to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chap. 33 of the N.H. Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the selectmen to issue and negotiate such Bonds and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such action as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale, and delivery of such Bonds, as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Lincoln, and pass any vote thereto.



41. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to select either the N.H. Department of Revenue, Division of Municipal Accounting or a private accredited or professionally capable auditing firm to audit the Town of Lincoln Books.
42. To see if the town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the General Administration Account, \$20,000.00 to be applied to the maintenance and administration of the Police Department.
43. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and authorize the selectmen to apply to budget items the interest received on taxes and deposits.
44. To see what action the town will take in accepting as a town road the Entry Road to the Rutherford Property off Pollard Road.
45. To see what action the town will take in accepting as town roads the roads at Loon Mountain Recreation Area, i.e. Beechwood Acres so-called.
46. To see if the town will vote to apply such sums of money to this year's Budget Items as may accrue as surplus from past appropriations for repairs to the Loon Mt. Bridge, if and when Federal Assistance Monies are received.
47. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

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In 1975 the Lincoln Police Department investigated 515 recorded complaints. These included cases involving theft, assault, criminal mischief, theft of services, burglary, disorderly conduct, stolen vehicles and many others. The Police Department assisted in 3 search and rescues in 1975 along with N.H. Fish & Game Department and the Forest Service.

There were 47 misdemeanor and felony arrests made in 1975 which included possession of controlled drugs, knowingly present, resisting arrest, indecent exposure, burglary and the like. There were 166 motor vehicle complaints of which 17 were for driving under the influence. 76 motor vehicle accidents were investigated by the Lincoln Police Department in 1975. There were 74 persons incarcerated in the Lincoln Jail which is also utilized by Woodstock Police, State Police and other law enforcement agencies.

John S. Weeden resigned as Chief of Police on December 1, 1975 due to reasons of health. ## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Lincoln for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1975, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given to the Town Clerk to be retained as part of the permanent records.

### Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, District Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

### Financial Statements

#### General Fund:

#### **Comparative Balance Sheets — As of December 31, 1974 and December 31, 1975:** (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets disclosing the financial condition of the general fund as of December 31, 1974 and December 31, 1975, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the current unappropriated surplus of the Town decreased by \$48,771, from \$502,167 at December 31, 1974 to \$453,396 at December 31, 1975.

#### **Analysis of Change in Current Financial Condition:** (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of change in current financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

**Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues:**  
(Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of general fund appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1975, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$41,907, plus a net overdraft of appropriations of \$8,695, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$33,212.

**Long-Term Indebtedness:**

**Comparative Balance Sheets:** (Exhibit A-5)

Comparative Balance Sheets showing the outstanding long-term indebtedness of the Town, as of December 31, 1974 and December 31, 1975 are contained in Exhibit A-5. As indicated therein, the long-term debt decreased by \$241,350, from \$1,311,350 to \$1,070,000 during the year.

#### **Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, Encumbrances and Fund Balance:**

(Exhibit B-2)

A statement, showing the activity in the revenue sharing fund account in 1975, is included in Exhibit G. As indicated therein, there is an unappropriated fund balance of \$20,004 as of December 31, 1975.

### **Audit Procedure**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

### **General Comments**

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#### **Overdraft of Appropriations and Application of Municipal Budget Law:**

As indicated in Exhibit A-3, Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures, during 1975 budgetary expenditures exceeded total town appropriations and consequently resulted in a net appropriation overdraft of \$9,074, computed as follows:

In towns operating under the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law, R.S.A. Chapter 32, Section 10-A, when it becomes necessary to expend money in excess of an appropriation which may result in an overexpenditure of the total amount appropriated for all purposes, the Selectmen, with the written approval of a majority of the budget committee, must apply to the Commissioner of Revenue Administration for authority to make such expenditure. This procedure was not followed by the Selectmen with regards to excess expenditures which contributed to the appropriation overdraft incurred in 1975.

#### **Use of Unexpended Proceeds of Long-Term Notes and Application of R.S.A. 33:3-A:**

It is noted that under Article 45 of the Town Warrant, the 1975 Town Meeting voted "to authorize the Selectmen to apply the unexpended balance of the town building appropriation in the amount of \$4,420 to the town building renovation project."

The funds authorized for transfer under this article were actually unexpended proceeds of long-term notes issued under date of November 24, 1972 to defray the purchase price of the town building, the installation of a new boiler therein, and the costs of certain other improvements. The foregoing projects were all completed during the fiscal year ended December 31, 1972.

In connection with the disposition of unexpended proceeds of long-term notes, R.S.A. 33:3-A provides that if after long-term notes have been issued there remain proceeds thereof after completion of the project or projects for which the debt was authorized, a Town by a vote of two-thirds of the voters present and voting at an annual meeting may authorize the expenditures of the sum or sums on hand for any purpose for which long-term notes may be issued for an equal or longer period of time.

The minutes of the 1975 Town Meeting which were submitted to the auditors do not indicate that the motion to adopt Article 45, whereby the Selectmen were authorized to transfer the unexpended proceeds (\$4,420) of the November 24, 1972 issue of long-term notes, obtained the required two-thirds of the votes cast.

**Limitation on Powers of Towns to  
Raise and Appropriate Money:**

The 1975 Town Meeting, under Article 14 of the Town Warrant, voted "to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for snow removal from private driveways."

No statutory authority can be found in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated which allows municipalities to raise and appropriate money for this object of expense. Consequently, the vote of the 1975 Town Meeting in this regard was not proper.

It is recommended that such appropriations not be included or approved in any future annual or special town budget. In this regard, it must be stated that the power of Towns to raise and appropriate money is not absolute. Such power is derived solely from statutory provisions found in the Revised Statutes Annotated, which provisions restrict the power to appropriate to certain specified objects of expense and other necessary charges.

**Conclusion:**

The provisions of Chapter 71-A, Section 21, require that the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. Publication of the Exhibits contained in this audit report is optional at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen. This letter, however, must be published in its entirety.

We express our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lincoln for their assistance during the course of the audit.
