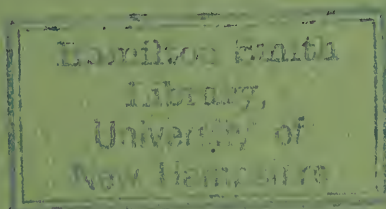

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the town of Milton in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for Town Officers, and to see whether beer or other alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 99, law of 1933.

2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding six thousand dollars (\$6,000) for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for Sidewalk construction and repair in Milton Village and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to pay for breaking roads for the fiscal year and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for oiling streets in Milton Village and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be expended on the highway lead-

ing from Milton Mills Village to Wakefield town line, known as the Jug Hill Road, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate seven hundred twenty-six dollars and fifty cents (\$726.50) necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the provisions of Chapter 35, laws of 1905, and amendments thereto, the joint sum to be expended on the highway leading from Milton Village, past the Nute High School, to Farmington town line.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding six hundred fifty dollars (\$650) for maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

9. To see what salary the town will vote to pay the First and Second Engineers and Firemen in addition to the amount allowed by law; to see how much per hour the town will vote to pay the Engineers and Firemen while fighting fires, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$2,250) for the maintenance of street lights for the ensuing year.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for the benefit of the Free Public Library at Milton Mills and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) for Memorial Day expenses.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the town a sum of money

necessary for the current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1934 and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town charges and expenses and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) for improvements and maintenance of the lots in front of the station and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

16. To see if the town will vote to purchase a two-ton Dump Truck with snowplow attachment for use on the highways, raise and appropriate or hire on notes of the town a sum of money necessary to pay for the same, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) to receive an appropriation of six hundred and sixty-six dollars (\$666) from the State, the joint sum to be expended on the road leading from Farmington to Middletown in said town.

18. To see if the town will vote to purchase a tractor and snowplow or a tractor to be used in the Sargent plow, raise and appropriate or hire upon notes of the town an amount of money necessary to pay for said tractor and snowplow and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

19. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

By petition of Fred McGregor and nine others, the following seven articles:

20. To nominate by petition a candidate for town office, to be voted for at town elections, it shall require the names of ten legal voters.

21. At the time of filing declarations of candidacy each candidate, or some person for him, shall pay to the town clerk one dollar, provided: no filing fee shall be required of candidates for Auditor or Trustee. The fees paid to the town clerk shall be paid to the treasurer of the town.

22. Nomination papers shall be filed with the town clerk six days prior to date of election. The number of days shall include Sundays.

23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding five hundred dollars for the purchase of snow fence.

24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars for the purchase of seats to be used in the town hall.

25. To determine the salaries, wages, other compensation and allowances for all persons serving the town.

26. To adopt the following by-law: All persons serving the town and receiving a daily wage, shall be paid weekly, if they so request.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF NUTE HIGH SCHOOL

*To the Superintendent of Schools and the Members of
the Board of Trustees:*

The forty-third year of this institution opened September 5 with an enrollement of eighty-three pupils. Transfers to other schools and withdrawals reduced the registration until at present there are 78 pupils divided as follows: Seniors, 11; Juniors, 18; Sophomores, 25; Freshmen, 24.

Reports from the State Board of Education show an increased rating by the Commissioner on the scholastic standard of the school over that of any previous year.

The following were especially commendable by Commissioner Pringle:

1. Exceeding the collateral reading in Latin I and II.
2. Very generous amount of supplementary reading performed in United States History and Economics.
3. Performance of 50 experiments and 60 demonstrations in Physics.
4. School above State Median in subtraction.
5. School above State Median in English forms.
6. School above State Median in addition.

The annual school inspection as registered by Deputy Russell Leavitt resulted in the following report being sent to Superintendent F. W. Dudley:

1. Condition of the building: Excellent.
2. Deportment of pupils: Excellent: Very Polite.
3. The fine tardiness record is commendable.
4. The fine attitude of the pupils towards their teachers and studies is highly commendable.

The Otis and Henmon-Nelson Group Intelligence tests have been given to show individual differences of abilities and general knowledge.

Again realizing the value of visual education, field trips have or will be made by various classes. The Physics class attending the launching of the U. S. Cachalot at Portsmouth and the Senior Government will visit the State Legislature, Federal Court, States Prison and other State Institutions. The Commercial department visits a modern office and sees up-to-date equipment used while the Physiography class enjoys field trips in and about Milton observing the makeup of soil, rocks and country in general.

Athletics have been self-supporting and furnished a surplus for purchasing a Ditto Duplicating machine for the Commercial department.

The school has been the recipient of a complete set of bound Congressional Reports of the 72nd. Congress from Congressman Wm. Rogers. These are used as reference in American Government.

Several outstanding booklets, papers and projects of work have been completed. A reproduction of a Medieval Castle is exhibited by Costandino DiPrizio, who is completing his four years of prescribed study in three years and doing so with honors.

Despite the stormy weather the attendance has been excellent and to date but four tardy marks are charged against the school which is even better than the splendid record of last year.

The excellent condition of the school property is due in a large measure to the untiring efforts of Care-taker Tetherly, whose personal interest is highly commendable.
