

Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Seabrook qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next, ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a town clerk, one selectman for a term of three years, town treasurer, collector of taxes, three constables, highway agent, three overseers of the poor and all other town officials for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the expense of the general government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for the support of the town poor and all other necessary expenditures for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money on anticipation of taxes, and to renew and refund town notes.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of forty (\$40.00) dollars for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 5. To see what sums of money the

town will vote to raise to defray the expense of collecting garbage from the residents of Seabrook Beach, the same being left in the hands of the Selectmen.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the protection of property at Seabrook Beach during the winter months, to be left in the hands of the Selectmen.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fourteen hundred thirteen (\$1,413.00) dollars for State Aid Construction, the State to give twenty-eight hundred twenty-six (\$2,826.00) dollars, total forty-two hundred thirty-nine (\$4,239.00) dollars, the same to be expended on the New Zealand road.

Article 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to deed back all property acquired through Tax Collector's deeds, on payment of all money due the town, before it is sold at auction.

Article 10. Local Option, Chapter 99, Section 22 of the Laws of 1933. To see if beer or other alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally.

Article 11. To see what action the town will take in regard to the clam flats, and to regulate the digging of clams.

- Article 12. To see what action the town will take in regard to property acquired through tax collector's deeds.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to sell the old road machine, now discarded, the same to be left in the hands of the Selectmen.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred ninety-one dollars and seventy-five cents (\$291.75) to take care of the overdraft for 1933, for Election and Registration.
- Article 16. To see what action the town will take in regards to erecting a flag pole, and improving the Walton Square at Smithtown.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for the care of the Gov. Weare Memorial, the same to be left in the hands of the Selectmen.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred twenty-two dollars and twenty-five cents (\$122.25) for bills contracted in the years of 1925 and 1928, remaining unpaid.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to contract for the removal of snow from town roads, by private owned trucks, by the hour, to pay the same price as the State.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the Fire

Chief, to inspect all chimneys in town, and other fire menaces.

Article 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in regard to putting in wells at Seabrook Beach for fire protection, to be left in the hands of the Selectmen.

Article 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the construction of a Municipal Building to be constructed in conjunction with the C. W. A., to be left in the hands of a special committee.

Article 23. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.
