WARNING OF THE ANNUAL MARCH MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stewartstown on Tuesday, the twelveth day of March next at Nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see what sum of money in addition to that required by law the Town will raise for repair of roads and bridges.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Winter roads.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of poor.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lighting.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay interest and apply on town debt.
8. To see if the Town will vote to accept Highway State Aid.
9. To see if the Town will raise \$4000.00 toward the Construction of Trunk Line road and authorize the Selectmen to borrow from the State (agreeably to House Bill No. 310) the balance necessary to complete this Trunk Line.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Maintenance and make appropriation for same.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$2600.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance.
12. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town House painted and make appropriation for the same.
13. To see if the Town will raise \$2500.00 to be used toward making permanent improvements on the Maine Street Road in West Stewartstown Village.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

February 1, 1928 to February 1, 1929

During this last year, I have made 190 visits of supervision and inspection in the various schools of the town.

Standard achievement tests have been given and the work of the various classes and individuals has been examined. Where pupils have been found deficient in any of the fundamental subjects as arithmetic, spelling or reading, an effort has been made to lay special emphasis on these particular subjects and improve the work if possible. However, some pupils seem to naturally be better spellers or readers than others. I believe home environment has much to do with this condition.

During the last complete school year ending June 30, 1928 all the schools were in session 360 half days with an average attendance of 93% which is a 1% improvement over the previous year.

It is hoped that this record of good attendance may continue for the present year. For a pupil to do the best work in his school, regular attendance is the first and most important requisite.

Considerable improvement has been made in the condition of the school buildings, notably the North Hill and Hollow, where the toilets have been arranged to conform to State Law and a new floor laid at North Hill. Painting inside and out at the W. Stewartstown building has made things much more presentable and sanitary. The South Hill school still needs some attention, while the heating in the Primary Room at W. Stewartstown has not been satisfactory for some years. Probably more steam pipes are needed in this room.

Several changes in the teaching force were made at the beginning of the school year. The new teachers have all either had considerable previous experience or normal training. The work as a whole has been going well and the teachers have been faithful and diligent in their work.

We bespeak the earnest and sincere co-operation of parents in order to secure best results for the child. If you think school matters are not going with your child as they should, do not hesitate to consult with the teacher. I am sure all teachers will welcome this interest and co-operation from the parents.

The school debt has this year been reduced by \$1700.00

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

I hereby submit my report on the work in the Stewartstown schools. I have made 50 visits to the schools of the town and to date have put in 191 hours of work in the town. The condition of the roads during the winter makes it impossible to do much active work in the schools. However, I hope to resume work in the spring.

The best results of the work is demonstrated by the lessened number of physical defects and the increase in correction among the school children. There are now 35% of the children in Stewartstown without apparent defect—which means they are a nearly physically perfect as they can come. Last year there were only 32% without defect. Their chance is great for a long, happy lifetime.

It is extremely difficult to correct all defects but it is very important to take advantage of the clinics as they offer themselves. Next year it may be too late to save that six year molar which is beginning to decay now. Why let the pus from diseased tonsils be absorbed into the system another year and retard the mental and physical development of the child? If you get notice that a child's eyes are defective it means that the eyes actually do not see the words, letters and figures in the classroom and the child with this trouble is greatly handicapped in his work. Besides this, permanent damage is being done to the vision by continued use of weakened eyes.

The health education in the schools is usually given by the teachers and has been very valuable. It helps to train the child in right living and to take the best possible intelligent care of his health.

Now Stewartstown, as well as the other towns in the school district, complies satisfactorily with the State Law on Vaccination. There was no necessity to report names to the Health Department as had to be done in many places in the State.

My work in Stewartstown has been very pleasant. I have had the co-operation of the School Board, doctors, and parents, and the children themselves have been most willing to help.
