TENTATIVE TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth in the County of Carroll in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Tamworth Schoolhouse in said Tamworth, on Tuesday, the twelfth, (12th) of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

- 3. Town officer's salaries: \$2,700.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 4. Town officer's expenses: \$750.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 5. Election and Registration: \$150.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 6. Town House and other buildings: \$700.00 approved by Finance Committee to include \$25.00 to the Tamworth Garden Club.
- 7. Clerical Work: \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.

- 8. Police Department: \$250.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 9. Fire Department and Red Network: \$1,-500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 10. Forest Fires and Fireman's Accident Insurance: \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 11. Printing: \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 12. Insurance and Bonding: \$1,200.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 13. Health Department including hospitals: \$2,300.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 14. Vital Statistics: \$50.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 15. Town Dump: \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee
- 16. Summer Highway Maintenance: \$13,000.-00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 17. Winter Highway Maintenance: \$8,000.00 approved by Finance Committee. This is broken down as follows: Care of roads, \$4,000.00; driveways, \$4,000.00.
- 18. General Expense of Highway Department: \$2,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 19. Town Road Aid: Town's share, \$852.58. This amount approved by Finance Committee.

- 20. Street Lighting: \$1,500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 21. Libraries: \$550.00 approved by Finance Committee. \$450 for Cook Memorial Library and \$100.00 for Chocorua Library.
- 22. Town Needy: \$3,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 23. Old Age Assistance: \$4,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 24. Memorial Day: \$50.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 25. Aid to Soldiers and their Families: \$100.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 26. Recreation: \$750.00 approved by Finance Committee. Tamworth Outing Club \$300.00; Red Cross Swimming Transportation \$450.00.
- 27. Cemeteries: \$500.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 28. Damages and Legal Expenses including damage by dogs: \$200.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 29. Social Security: \$250.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 30. Interest of all kinds: \$600.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 31. Payment on long term note: \$2,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.

- 32. County Tax: \$6,000.00 approved by Finance Committee.
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$214.03, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, for the Lakes Region Association for the purposes of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with other towns in the region. This amount approved by Finance Committee.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to pay \$1,000.00 to the Trustees of Trust Funds to reduce the amount of principal used by the town. This amount approved by Finance Committee.
- 35. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,240.00 as payment No. 1 (including interest) on the \$4,000.00 long term note for the new fire truck. Approved by the Finance Committee.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to sell the old roller house on Route 16.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to meet with interested Tamworth insurance agents to discuss town insurance. Recommended by the Finance Committee.
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of old route 25 which leaves the present road west of the house of Albert R. King, Jr., and returns to the present road approximately ½ mile West of King House.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to establish a committee to study the feasibility of constructing a

factory building, to grant said committee authority to acquire property, make contracts and take such other action as may be deemed to be in the best interests of the Town and to raise and appropriate such sum of money as seems advisable.

- 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 41. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of any property acquired through tax collector's deed.
- 42. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of assessment on April 1st.
- 43. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting and to vote at what hour to close the polls.

FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

DANGER FROM FIRES IN WOODLANDS

WOODLAND LITTER, WHEN DRY, IS HIGHLY INFLAMMABLE AND FIRES CAN QUICKLY GET OUT OF CONTROL. WE REQUEST YOUR CO-OPERATION TO CONTROL ALL FIRES SO THAT LIVES AND PROPERTY MAY NOT BE ENDANGERED OR DESTROYED, AND FORESTS BE KEPT GREEN TO FURNISH THE NATURAL BEAUTY WE ALL ENJOY AND TO GROW TIMBER WE WILL NEED.

WHAT IS "WOODLAND"?

The term "woodland" is defined by law to include, "cut-over land, slash and such other land as bears a sufficient amount of wood growth, wood, weeds, grass or other growth as to be likely to be burned over."

WHEN IN THE WOODS, YOU ARE EXPECTED TO EXERCISE CAUTION IN THE USE OF FIRE AND TO REMEMBER THAT

IT IS UNLAWFUL TO

Throw down lighted matches, cigarettes, or other burning substances from vehicles or otherwise.

Burn brush, rubbish, grass or other materials when the ground is not covered with snow, without written permission from the Forest Fire Warden.

Kindle a camp or cooking fire on land of another without permission from the owner or his agent.

Leave an open fire burning unattended.

Fail to report a forest or brush fire that is out of control.

VIOLATORS ARE SUBJECT TO THESE PENALTIES

Anyone letting a fire escape from control, whether or not he has a permit to kindle the fire, is liable for the costs of extinguishing the fire. Anyone found guilty of dropping inflammable material in or near woodland shall be fined not more than \$25.00.

A person failing to report an uncontrolled brush or forest fire is liable to a fine of not more than \$10.00.

For kindling a fire in woodland of another without permission of the owner, or for kindling any fire without a permit when a permit is required, a person may be fined not more than \$200.00, or imprisoned 60 days.

DAMAGES

Every person who shall set fire on any land, that shall run upon the land of another, shall pay to the owner all damages done by such fire.

BE SURE — GET A PERMIT

Incinerators should be tight, with a close mesh screen, and be on clean ground.

Open fireplaces used to burn rubbish are classed as incinerators.

Always clean a space about any open fire to prevent its spread.

Never burn in dry, windy weather.

Have incinerators inspected by the Forest Fire Warden and get his written permission.

TENTATIVE SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Tamworth qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Tamworth School in said district on the 6th day of April 1957, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriaion of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together

with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the district the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$94.95 to defray the district's share of the cost thereof.
- 10. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.
- 11. To see if the district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
- 12. If the plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the district will authorize the school board to execute on behalf of the district the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the district will designate the treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 13. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and accept in name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal Government or any department or agency thereof, or any other sources.

- 14. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for use for payment of the salary of the cook for the school lunch program.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Tamworth:

During the school year 1955-56 the teachers in the Tamworth School were:

Mr. Ronald Corkum, Principa	l Grade 6
Mrs. Elizabeth Brady	Grades 7 and 8
Mrs. Carolyn Pulsifsr	Grades 4 and 5
Miss Margaret King	Grade 3
Mrs. Dorothy Remick	Grade 2
Mrs. Ethel Berry	Grade 1

For the current year Mr. Corkum teaches the mathematics and science in grades 7 and 8, and Mrs. Brady teaches English and the social sciences; Mrs. Henrietta Kane, of Ossipee teaches grades 5 and 6; Mrs. Pulsifer teaches grade 4, and the rest of the staff teach the same grades as last year. We are most fortunate to have such a competent staff of teachers.

During the year the Tamworth School enrolled 177 pupils with an average daily membership of 168.6. As of the date this is written there have been 179 pupils enrolled.

There were 65 high school pupils enrolled at Kennett High School, one at Brewster Academy, and one at Fryeburg Academy. Currently there are 61 pupils enrolled at Kennett High School and 1 at Fryeburg Academy. Of these 12 are seniors. The present eighth grade has an enrollment of 17. The tuition rate in 1955-56 was \$290.00 and is \$305.00 during the current year.

The supervision of the health program was under the competent direction of Mrs. Thelma Roberts who continues in this position during the current year. The Salk Polio Innoculation Program initiated in 1954 was continued through the cooperation of the State Department of Health, Mrs. Roberts and local physicians.

The big event of the year took place when school opened in January and the first classes were held in the new building. The spacious and beautifully decorated rooms, the gymnasium, the modern kitchen, and all other excellent facilities have made a great contribution to a better education for Tamworth boys and girls. The teachers and pupils take great pride in the building and are taking excellent care of it. It was the intent of the school board and the building committee that the building should serve as a community center. Several community organizations have made quite frequent use of the gymnasium and other facilities. Custodian William Hidden is keeping the building in excellent condition.

The development of the athletic field by the Tamworth Foundation is proceeding under the direction of Mr. Richard Read. This is a very important contribution to the entire educational program and should prove to be of great value to the community.

Several other projects are providing valuable contributions to the educational welfare of Tamworth pupils. Among these is the school library service which is reported on these pages by the library committee. The stamp and bond saving project, quite generally carried on during World War II, has been renewed under the sponsorship of the Tamworth Women's Club. The P. T. A. has undertaken to raise

money to purchase a new motion picture projector to replace the old projector which has seen many years of service. Instruction in skiing, which has been provided for several years by the Tamworth Outing Club, is again functioning this year. We are most grateful for the interest shown by these organizations and for the many fine services provided.

The splendid cooperation of the school board, teachers, pupils, and citizens is most sincerely appreciated.

The Tamworth School now has the beginnings of a small but excellent library. A Library Committee appointed by Mrs. Chester Davis, P. T. A. President, solicited donations from Tamworth citizens. The P. T. A. Fair held in the school in July added over \$200.00 to the Library Fund. A local architect donated plans for the three book shelves in the front hall. A large number of good books, 2 dictionaries, and a set of enclyclopedias have been given to the school. Mrs. Myrick Crane, Mrs. Harry Damon, Mrs. Rolf Spicer, and Mrs. Parker Whipple serve as librarians one day each week. Mothers and teachers have help with catalogueing, and other dull but necessary work. Last year from January - June a total of 2,201 books were signed out, an average of 157 per week. An average of 200 books per week have been withdrawn during this school year. The librarians feel that this is due to the larger number and variety of books we have to offer. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have given of their ideas, time and money to make this important part of our school a success.

A dental clinic was held with Dr. Sullivan of Conway. Twenty-three trips were made with 128 children attending. Thirty-eight of these were completed.

Orthopedic Clinics:

Four Orthopedic Clinics were held at the Laconia Hospital with 8 children attending. One Orthopedic clinic was held in Center Ossipee with 3 children attending.

Salk Vaccine Clinics:

Three Salk Vaccine Clinics were held in the Tamworth School.

February 177 September 76 November 31 were innoculated.

Tuberculosis:

First, fourth, seventh, and eighth grades (90) pupils received Patch tests. 4 reactors. An X-Ray Clinic was held at the Center Ossipee School with 9 children attending.

Diabetic Detection:

In co-operation with the Carroll County Medical Society a Diabetic Detection drive was conducted in our school. One hundred and thirty-six children participated.

Orientation Day:

The day before school closed in June, the first graders stayed home and the in-coming first graders came to school. Sixteen children and twelve mothers spent a regular school morning with us. Each child was weighed, measured, teeth examined, throat, glands, skin checked, and the eyes were tested. This gave parents an opportunity to get corrections made before school opened in the fall. I attended a two weeks' summer session at Plymouth Teachers' College on Child Guidance which I enjoyed very much, and which proved very beneficial.
