To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority and in amounts indicated to take any action hereon:

9. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$2,099.65 for the Pemi Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.
10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$825.00 as the Town's share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1979.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to help support the White Mountain Region Association of New Hampshire.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to help support promotion and publicity for the Campton, Thornton, Waterville Valley Chamber of Commerce.
13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the completed roads in Woodwinds development as a part of the Town road system, once it has been approved by the Selectmen and Road Agent to meet TRA standards.
14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the road to Thornton Laundromat as a Town road, once it meets TRA Standards and approved by the Selectmen and Road Agent.
15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept the road located in land formerly known as the Old Karlson Property, subject to approval by the Town Road Agent that said road meets Town of Thornton construction standards. Said road is 50 feet in width and intersects with the Upper Mad River Road (near Gateway Village), thence runs easterly 600 feet more or less to a cul-de-sac 100 feet in diameter. Said road will be deeded to the Town free and clear.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the acceptance of certain roads and one road extension in the Rust Developments as follows:
 - High Brook (Road) 4,866 Feet
 - Cross Over (Road) 972 Feet
 - "Header" work to be done in Spring of 1980 on two above roads.
 - Tree Line (Road) 450 feet extension to circle, completing this road.
 - Meadow Way (Road) 425 feet to end of circle.These roads are at present up to grade and only lack penetration and sealing. ROAD AGENT REPORT

Additional Highway Subsidy Fund in the amount of \$693.75 was spent to replace a culvert and upgrade road in the Mill Brook section of Town. The balance carried over for use in 1980 is \$4,306.52.

Highway Subsidy monies were spent in the amount of \$8,449.50 for use in summer maintenance, winter maintenance, for the purchase of sand and gravel, and for salt purchase.

We currently have \$12,864.34 available from TRA funds, with another \$4,369.37 coming in 1980, provided we raise \$655.40 at the March meeting.

An amount of \$8,005.80 is expected from Highway Subsidy and the estimated amount from additional subsidy is \$6,687.91 in 1980. The majority of funds from TRA and subsidy are planned to be spent on the Thornton Gore Road, with balance to go on the Mill Brook Road, if agreeable with abutting property owners in those sections of Town.

It is interesting to note that of the \$23,396.13 spent on summer and winter maintenance only \$16,016.43 had to be raised by taxes. Of the \$4,894.45 spent for General Expenses for the Highway Dept. \$3,824.65 was raised by taxes.

We currently have close to \$9,000.00 in the Bridge Fund. Some of the bridges will need necessary work during 1980.

1979

The Thornton Public Library organized after Town election in March with Mrs. Grady, Chairman, Mrs. McDonald, Treasurer, and Mr. Benton joining us as Secretary.

With the professional assistance of Miss Helen Henry of Plymouth, we were able to complete the non-fiction sections in both Childrens and Adult over the summer months.

The library bought a total of 135 new books this year, 120 juvenile books and 15 adult books. We also purchased a National Geographic Index 1947-1976 to enable students to use our collection. We have added many more volumes that have been donated copies and we wish to thank all those who have given so freely to the library. The library decided also to buy three educational games—Battleship, Checkers and Hangman along with puzzles. We had a book sale September 15, 1979 over the Old Home Week week-end at Crawford's field. We had a great turn out of interested buyers with a total sale of \$13.60. **AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWNS OF
CAMPTON AND THORNTON**

It is agreed that Campton furnish fire protection to the Town of Thornton, for a period of three years from January 1979 to January 1982, subject to renegotiation by the Selectmen of the two towns at that time.

Campton agrees to pay 60% and Thornton agrees to pay 40% of operational costs of building and capital costs and maintenance of equipment. This percentage is subject to review every three years in January by the Selectmen of the two towns. An accurate record of all maintenance and capital costs shall be kept by the Fire Wards of the two towns.

In case of withdrawal by the Town of Thornton, capital costs of equipment shall be returned to said Town on the basis of the fair market value of such capital equipment and at the same percentage that exists at the time of the dissolution.

One year's notice shall be given by either town in case of dissolution.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FOREST FIRE CHIEF AND YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Prevention and control of forest fires is handled through a cooperative effort between town/city fire organizations and the State Forest Fire Service.

Since 1903, when the first forest fire laws were passed by our Legislature, the State Forester has appointed someone in each municipality as a Forest Fire Warden and charged him with the responsibility of forest fire prevention and control within his town/city. This person may ask the State Forester to appoint as many Deputy Forest Fire Wardens as may be necessary to efficiently carry out his charge.

The State Forester has divided the State into ten forest fire districts with a full time District Forest Fire Chief in each district. The State organization is charged with assisting the municipal forest fire organization in any way possible.

State personnel conduct fire training schools, assist with forest fire suppression, fire cause investigation, prosecution of fire law violators and forest fire prevention programs. Forest fire suppression equipment is purchased through State bulk purchasing ability and sold to local forest fire organizations at one-half cost. Excess military property is obtained and turned over to town/city fire departments at no cost to local departments for conversion into fire suppression units. This cooperative arrangement between State and municipality has resulted in one of the best forest fire records in the United States with less than one-half acre of woodland burned in each fire reported.

TOWN REPORT FOR 1979 FROM NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL, INC.

In Thornton, North Country Council provided information on solid waste and general planning matters.

This past year 1979 saw a mixture of planning and action for the North Country Council, Inc. Major contributions were made in rural and economic development, local planning, and transportation.

In rural development, the Council assisted approximately twenty-five communities in taking positive steps on such concerns as housing, downtown revitalization, water supply, and solid waste. The council has helped communities obtain needed housing resources. Working with appropriate state and federal agencies, the Council assisted targeted communities by preparing applications and by providing information so decisions can be made. In economic development, the Council assisted two communities with steps toward the creation of parks which will provide a necessary place for additional jobs. Energy development activities have encouraged the development of indigenous resources such as wood and hydro power. NCC has also been active in helping local companies with loan applications and business counseling, and in assisting a targeted community with the revolving loan fund. Additional business development services will be provided during the coming year to encourage existing area and other in-state businesses to expand or locate so that more jobs can be provided in the North Country. An industrial brochure has been published which promotes the quality of life in the region and the resources available for small companies.

Local planning assistance, such as master planning, subdivision regulations, zoning, review of development proposals continues to be a major function of the Council. This activity will take on greater significance with the NH Supreme Court's emphasis on local master planning as a basis for local regulations.

Technical reports have been prepared on Mt. Washington Valley's Seasonal Population and on wetland evaluation and management. Brief and informative fact sheets on community investment strategies, land capability and wetlands are also available.

To advocate North Country transportation needs at the state and federal level, a Transportation Committee has been organized with representatives from different communities and transportation sectors.

The Council acts as a "regional spokesman" with membership on the

Governor's Advisory Committee on Growth, the N.H. Environmental Law Clinic, and the State's Forestry Resources Committee. By sponsoring forums and conferences on growth in the forest industry, agricultural development, and regional land use, the Council has brought together people, ideas and resources to generate appropriate solutions.

We believe that the Council has a program that can assist its rural communities in meeting the challenges and opportunities of the 1980s. The Board of Directors, the staff and the entire Council greatly appreciate the support your Town has provided in 1979 and over the last few years. Dear Chairman:

1979 proved once again that the White Mountains Region needs tourism.

Have you ever seen a washout in March followed by a gasoline crisis? You did this year, and it pushed many businesses to the brink, and put a significant dent in the rooms and meals tax, business profits tax revenues, and many other tourism related tax revenues which aid Thornton. Yet, on the western side of the region, tourism accounts for 27.19%, or \$15,000.00, of the total annual payroll of that area, and on the eastern side of the region, 12.49%, or \$14,000,000.

Admittedly, without the support of all of the communities represented by the White Mountains Region Association, and flying in the face of economic predictions, the officers and directors courageously authorized the expenditure of \$17,000 in February to make the publication of the "Little Phone Book", and visitor Directory possible, and bring it into the homes of everyone in your community either in 1979 or 1980. What the directors correctly realized, as subsequently corroborated by a recent New England Regional Commission report, was that the primary reason why people visit New England was to visit friends and relatives. Thus, for this reason, the "Little Phone Book" and the WMRA visitor Directory, as part of the yellow pages, plays a useful role. Also, if trends continue, more people will be vacationing closer to home and here both the phone book and the visitor Directory will become an increasingly significant guide to vacationing/recreational activities in these mountains.

Therefore, your Region Association, in order to build upon this exciting project, as well as others, would respectfully request support for its work in 1980 from Thornton in the amount of \$1,411.26. The formula under which the Association makes this request is five (5) cents per \$1,000 of valuation based on the latest valuation table published by the NH Department of Revenue Administration. According to that table, Thornton's total equalized valuation was \$28,225,290. (Please use this as a guide, and put whatever is deemed affordable in the general budget article, if possible.)

1979 REPORT FROM THE PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY

The Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency invites the Town of Thornton to continue their membership in their home health care service. The availability of home health care in our community makes a most important reduction to the alternative of ever-soaring costs of hospitalization and nursing home care.

Service provided by the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency to the Town of Thornton for 1979, is included in the following:

Skilled nursing visits	244
Home Health Aid visits	40 hrs.
Trained Homemaker visits	125 hrs.

Blood pressure clinics were held bi-monthly at the Campton Baptist Vestry for the towns of Campton, Elsworth, Waterville Valley, and Thornton on the 3rd Thursday from 1:30-3:00 p.m.

Diabetic Screenings were available twice yearly. Immunization clinics were held bi-monthly on second Wednesdays at the American Legion Hall in Plymouth.

Skilled Nursing is performed in the home by registered nurses under orders from a physician, and covers hypodermics, catheter care, blood pressure's, diabetic screening, filling diabetic syringes, colostomy care, tracheotomy care, family instruction in patient care, and supervision of medications to name a few.

Physical Therapy is delivered in the home by a registered physical therapist under physician's orders, and covers ambulation, range of motion and other therapeutic exercises.

Personal Care of the Patient is delivered by a trained home health aide and covers patients bath, shampoo, foot care, catheter care, and maintenance of the patient's room.

Trained Homemakers are sent into the home when needed to do light housekeeping, run errands etc., or simply to give supportive emotional help to the lonely.

The agency also provides many unstatistical services besides the usual fiscal and immunization notices; aid in receiving other services such as meals-on-wheels, mental health etc., is given patients when needed. A little known service to the towns is the **Agency Equipment Lend-Out Closet**.

The closet contains hospital beds, walkers, commodes, canes, crutches, toilet risers, bed pans, wash basins, etc.; these items, which have been donated to the agency, are lent out with no obligation but to return them when no longer in use by the patient.

These services frequently add up to the great difference in the lives of those who receive them, of going home instead of a prolonged hospitalization or nursing home experience, or in staying at home for recovery, rather than becoming completely dependent on institutional care.

REPORT OF GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

To the Citizens of Grafton County:

In an effort to communicate more directly with the taxpaying citizens of Grafton County, we, the Grafton County Commissioners, are writing to you through your individual town or municipal reports.

Last year (1978-79) the total county tax raised was \$1,977, 142. These monies were appropriated by the County Delegation and administered by the Commissioners. Some of the ways this money was spent was in maintenance of our courthouse nursing home, county farm, sheriff's department, jail and house of correction, social welfare, etc.

The average number of patients in our nursing home is 140. The average daily census of the Jail/House of Correction is 25. We had a total of 349 inmates in the Jail and 114 inmates in the House of Correction during our fiscal year.

In addition to providing food for the nursing home complex and agricultural services for the community, the farm also continually shows a profit. In our fiscal year 1979 the farm profit was \$60,654, due in part to sales of pigs at \$5,500, cows at \$27,000, wood at \$1,800, hay at \$2,100, milk at \$135,444 and produce at \$48,129.

We have completed Phase II-Design of the sewage project and anticipate beginning construction under Phase III in the spring. The total overall cost of the project is approximately \$540,000, of which \$400,000 is federal grant, \$110,000 State share and \$30,000 County share.

We are making an effort to conserve energy, particularly in the courthouse building, and are taking a hard look at any modifications in this so called "modern" facility that will make it a less expensive consumer of fuel.

A trial dispatching service was instituted for 16 area fire departments and probably will be made a permanent function during the latter part of 1979. A yearly fee is charged for this service.

Grafton County employs 230 people of whom we are very proud. It is because of these people that Grafton County continues to operate efficiently and within budget.

There are many other concerns that we, the Commissioners, deal with. We invite the citizens of Grafton County to take part in any of our regular meetings held each Monday morning at the courthouse in North Haverhill.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE 1979

Many services have been provided by the school nurse to the students at the Thornton Central School during the past year.

Annual screening tests were conducted on all students. Each child had his vision and hearing tested and height and weight recorded. Blood pressure and posture were checked on the upper grade students. Those with possible problems in any of these areas were referred through their parents to their own doctor or a specialist. An effort was made to put the parent in contact with agencies providing special services.

In the area of dental health, students in the fourth grade are participating in a statewide program of brushing and flossing their teeth daily under the direction of Ann Knowles, their teacher, and Heberta Stark, a dental hygienist. Each week, all second and third graders have a cleanliness inspection with emphasis upon hands, teeth and hair.

A careful check is made each year of the immunization status of all incoming students in order to maintain the excellent levels of immunization that we have. Free immunization clinics are offered often in both Plymouth and Lincoln and all needing immunizations are encouraged to attend.

During the spring, preschoolers are offered a free vision and hearing check sponsored by the State of New Hampshire. Parents of 4 and 5 year olds were contacted and encouraged to attend. The Thornton School provides a preregistration program for all incoming kindergarten students. The child and his parent(s) visit the school and the child is screened by a speech pathologist for possible difficulties and a resource teacher for physical and emotional readiness. The kindergarten teacher interviews each parent and the nurse obtains a health history.

Throughout the year, films are shown that present many aspects of health and safety. I am always available as a resource person to parents, students and teachers.

I wish to thank the teaching staff, the many physicians, parents and students for their support.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE

Many parents think their child's intelligence is something that is fixed at birth and cannot be changed. This is simply not true. It has been said that this is one of the most important educational discoveries of the twentieth century. A child's level of intelligence is determined in much the same way as his strength. When children eat well and exercise their muscles, they grow strong and develop fully. With proper food and proper exercise, the brain also develops fully. How can parents help their children develop their intelligence?

At this point someone may be thinking: "Why parents?" Recently psychologists and educators have begun to realize how important the years before school entrance are for the development of a child's ability to learn. It is widely believed now that most of the child's basic intelligence has been formed by the time he reaches school age. This, of course, does not mean that by the time he is six years old, he has learned most of what he will know as an adult. What it means is that most of a child's ability to learn quickly and with ease has developed by the time he reaches school age. The people who are in the best position to supply these important experiences and exercises are the child's parents.

Two important ideas will be shared before specific activities and exercises are discussed. First, as parents, we are our children's first teachers. We help them form their attitudes toward learning, and it is vital to make their earliest experiences positive and pleasant ones. The second is that it is important to remember a young child has a short attention span; he/she is not able to concentrate on one activity for long periods of time.

The following represents a few suggestions that parents can use with children:

Listen to your child. Encourage him to ask questions, discuss ideas, and tell stories.

Play games, especially those that have educational value, like number games, guessing games, word games.

Teach your child about numbers, and explain that numbers mean "how many." A child who can count to ten does not necessarily understand numbers. The concept of each number must be taught.

Help your child learn to carry out simple projects and activities. Perseverance is a key to success in school and throughout life. It gives a child a feeling of accomplishment and builds self-confidence.

Training in chores at home, and training in understanding and following simple directions will help your child know what will be

expected in the classroom.

Set a good example. If you are interested in learning, your child probably will be too. For example; set a family reading time or some other organized learning activity and share experiences.

Your child learns in many places and in many ways. School, of course, is a major source of your child's learning, but learning at home is vital to your child's development. As a parent, you have an opportunity to make an enormous difference in how much and how well your child learns. **You are your child's most important teacher**, and a valuable partner of your child's teachers in school.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1978-1979

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district and their share of same. Said report shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrator, if any is in service in the union."

One-half of the school administrative unit expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the unit on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$25,500 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of School Administrative Unit #48 during 1978-1979 was made up as follows: \$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$23,000 was prorated among the school districts comprising the School Administrative Unit. Allowance for \$1,200 travel within the Unit was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1978-1979 was made up as follows: \$2,444 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$20,056 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,800 travel within the Unit was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.
