





Report of the Supt. of Schools

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF WINDSOR, N. H.

The report of the Superintendent of Schools for the year 1925-6 is herewith respectfully submitted.

It has not been the custom to print the report of the Superintendent of Schools in the annual Town Report, perhaps because there is no school in the district, but as the Superintendent works with the children of Windsor just the same as for other childern, a report from him, it would seem, should be a matter of record.

Children in school this year were Mabel Wheeler, 1st grade, 5 yrs. old; Norman Chapman 2nd grade, 6 yrs. old; Mary Chapman, 4th grade, 10 yrs. old, and Stanley Nelson, 8th grade, 13 yrs. old. Mabel and Stanley attended the Dole School in Washington, Mrs. Frances Wheeler, Teacher. Norman and Mary attended the Upper Village School in Hillsboro, Mrs. Belle C. Ball, teacher. Stanley completed the eighth grade in June, 1925, but he was young and his parents felt it was best for him to put off going to the High School, so he returned to the Dole School.

Pupils had an opportunity to attend school 174 days. They averaged 160 days attendance and 14 days absence, making a percentage of attendance of 92.2%, which is better than some schools to which the children all come from a much shorter distance. The tardiness record was good, there being five cases of tardiness for the four children for the whole year.

A great deal is learned by associating with other children, and it is an advantage for children to attend schools of the proper size, neither too large nor too small. The Dole school registered 17 children and the Upper Village School 37, during the year.

Visitors furnish an incentive to good work for both teacher and the pupils. There were 112 visits from parents and others, and forty visits by the Superintendent at the two schools.

Within recent years two kinds of tests have become popular. They are intelligence tests, and achievement tests. Intelligence tests, by certain devices and schemes, attempt to test the latent ability of the child, not the amount of his knowledge, but his inborn ability to learn. These have fallen into some disrepute, and must not be confused with achievement tests, which show just how much the child has accomplished, learned, achieved. They are even more valuable when they are standardized, by being given to hundreds of thousands of children, all over the country, to all grades and all ages, and the averages of their marks computed. This gives one a way of knowing just how our children compare with others of their grade and age all over our country. These standard achievement tests are given to pupils above the second grade, so that we had only two to take the tests, and they average above the standard for their age and grade.

Although the schools attended by the Windsor children are in other towns, yet Windsor parents and friends are always welcomed as visitors. We feel that good work is being done in these schools, and we would be glad to have you know what they are doing, from personal observation. Visit the schools on regular school days as well as on days of special observances.
