To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing, also one selectman for one year and one selectman for three years.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.

3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges.

4. To see how much money the town will raise for rebuilding of bridges.

5. To see if town will vote to accept Trunk Line Construction and raise \$750 for same.

6. To see if town will raise \$900 for Trunk Line Maintenance.

7. To see if town will raise \$150 for unimproved Trunk Line Maintenance.

8. To see if town will raise \$1,250 for State Aid Maintenance.

9. To see if town will vote to raise \$400 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

10. To see if town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.

11. To see if town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid before July 1.

12. To see what action the town will take relating to snow removal by tractor plow and, if desired, to raise money for same.

13. To see how much money the town will raise for the purchase of snow fence.

14. To act on any other matter that may legally come before the meeting.
