WARRANT.

The State of New Hampshire.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Ashland in the County of Grafton, in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Ashland on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To choose one delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the increase and support of the town library.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial day.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of the town debt and to defray the interest thereon for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the laying out, building and repairing of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the town will authorize the building of an iron and concrete bridge across Squam River near Squam Lake Lumber Co. mill, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 124 of the Public Statutes as amended by Chapter 76, session laws of 1905, as amended by session laws, 1907, relating to dealers in old metals.
- 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the current expenses of the fire department for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see what action the town will take as to the suppression of the gypsy and brown tail moths, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to buy two or more steel lattice jail cells and fix a place for the same, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to install a fire alarm box in Carr avenue with the necessary connections, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to enlarge the stage and install a heating apparatus at the Town Hall, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to place a street light on East Main street near the residence of B, K. Smythe.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to place a street light on West Main street near the residence of Mrs. Prescott.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to place a street light on River street, midway between the last two now there.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to place two street lights on North Highland street.

REPORT OF FIRE WARDS.

To the Citizens of Ashland we beg to submit the following report:

This has been another very fortunate year for the town as regards fire damage, for which we should be very thankful. On March 24, the house owned and occupied by Albert Huckins caught fire from an overheated chimney. This was put out with hand extinguishers and garden hose. The buildings were insured for \$1,800 and damage for \$42.50 was paid.

May 4, an alarm from box 66 was rung in for fire on the roof of Mrs. O. D. Thompson's building. There was no water damage at this fire. Buildings insured for \$6,500 and damage of \$10 was paid by the insurance company.

On May 5, the forest fire signal was rung in for fire on land of Mr. Rogers, and on May 10, for fire in New Hampton. May 12, July 1, November 9, small forest fires were attended to by fire warden and help.

January 30, 1912, a chimney fire in building of Mrs. M. A. Pierce was extinguished with no damage.

February 9, an alarm from box 68 was rung in for a bad chimey fire at the school house. A large hole was burned through the roof. The fire was extinguished with chemicals. Damage to the building \$25, insured for \$8,000.

On the night of February 16, the house and barn owned by Gus Moulton was totally destroyed. Cause unknown. The buildings were worth \$1,800, insured for \$800. Owing to the distance from town and the fire so well started when discovered the firemen did not make any attempt to render assistance.

The fire department is in first class condition and we think better organized than it ever was before. The fire wards recommend an approprirtion of \$500 to defray the expenses of the coming year.

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION.

ASHLAND SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT.

During the year several important changes have taken place in our schools.

The second year course of the High school has been established necessitating the employment of an assistant teacher, and we secured the services of Miss Bertha Payson, a graduate of Brown University, and she has filled the position in a very satisfactory manner.

There are now thirty-five pupils in the High school, eight of whom pay the district \$40 each a year, coming from outside district and other towns and we hope to increase this number in the near future.

This year the third year in the High school course will be established and it will be necessary to fit up a chemical laboratory.

Owing to the crowded condition of the graded building last fall, we were obliged to put the fourth grade in the town building for a few months, and in behalf of the district, we extend to the firemen, our thanks for the use of their hall.

The new High school building is completed and enough furniture installed for our present needs and the High school and seventh and eighth grades are now located there-

Owing to the small pox epidemic last fall, our attend. ence was somewhat broken up, and we would take this opportunity to urge all parents to see that their children attend all sessions of school unless prevented by sickness or some other unavoidable reason.

At the last school meeting the district voted to withdraw from the supervisory district, and this leaving us without a superintendent, Mr. William H. Buker, principal of the High school has had general supervision of all the grades, and has performed all the duties in a very able and satisfactory manner.
