1935 TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

STRAFFORD, SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Barrington qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby requested to meet at the Town House in Barrington, on Tuesday, March the 12th next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles.

- ART. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, one Selectman for one year, one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, and two Auditors for the ensuing year.
- ART. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- ART. 3. To raise such sums of money as are necessary for the payment of State and County taxes, support of poor, and all other necessary Town charges.
- ART. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of roads and bridges.
- ART. 5. To authorize the Selectmen to raise the money required to meet the State in the completion of the Depot Road, or any other sum to meet State or Federal Projects.
- ART. 6. To authorize the Selectmen to raise \$1,500.00 to pay the balance due the State on Locke Mill and Road job.
- ART. 7. To see if the Town will raise \$60.00 for the J. O. U. A. M. for Memorial Day.
- ART. 8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road and bridges thereon, from the Jessie

Porter place, to the G. P. Smallcon place, known as the old Locke Mill Bridges.

ART. 9. "To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act."

ART. 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Barrington:

During the past year progress has been made both in the material welfare of the schools and in their economical administration, as well as along the line of instruction. Improvements in schoolhouses included rebuilding of the shed at Pond Hill, so that now all five of our school buildings have toilet rooms opening out of the schoolroom. At Oak Hill, great improvement in lighting has resulted from enlarging the window area. At Waldron Hill, the entry ways have been rearranged, with an improvement in lighting and in closet space. I would recommend that the District provide one school each year with permanent playground apparatus. The Greeks regarded music and physical training as the fundamentals in education. Doubtless we would do well to make more provision for exercise in the open air. A new and improved primary reading system has been introduced into the primary grades, which is having excellent results.

The schools maintained are the same as those of last year.

Educational expenditures are carefully planned in the School Board's Estimate, drawn up in February and presented to the District meeting. This estimate is still further revised in October, when a Budget is passed upon by the State Board of Education for approval and allotment of State Aid. Thus the School Board has been carrying out the purpose and spirit of the new Municipal Budget Act for many years. While the median cost of Elementary Schools in the state increased last year \$4.47 per pupil, the same item in Barrington decreased \$1.54. Moreover, the "estimate" for next year is \$1,258.18 (or 12%) lower than that of a year ago. In regard to state expenditures, the Comptroller's report for the year ending June 30, 1934, showed education taking 8.21 cents of the state dollar, being exceeded by highways (42.82) and charities and correction (27.13).

But this financial support would not assure the success of education without the cooperation of parents and other citizens. The school authorities appreciate the efforts of every parent who sends the children to school every single day that it is possible. On the other hand, we also appreciate the judgment of a parent who keeps at home under observation for a day or two a child suffering from a severe cold or possible symptoms of a communicable disease. Under the direction of the School Nurse, the Woman's Club assisted in making a dental clinic possible, where fifteen pupils received complete dental care. This project was also helped by the Federal Child Health Recovery Program.
