This year you raised \$1,686.00 on an equalized valuation of \$337,361.00. The new equalized valuation of \$547,412.00 will require a tax of \$2,737.00 for elementary schools which is approximately half the entire elementary cost.

The average attendance of all pupils last year was 94.6 and indicates an excellent spirit of cooperation.
