## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury, in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Danbury on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Highways.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise \$200.00 for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust.
5. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the George Gamble Library.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
7. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to apply on the Trunk Line Construction Bond.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Cemeteries.

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid money of \$2,678.39 and raise \$456.00 for the same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction money of \$1,000.00 and raise \$456.00 for same to be expended on the North Road so called.

12. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the provisions of the Muncipal Budget Act.

13. To see if the Town will vote—that if a petition is signed by ten or more voters of the town, the petitioners must be given a hearing.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for a Playground or Recreation ground for the Town of Danbury.

15. To see if the Town will vote to have a playground committee appointed.

16. To see if the Town will vote to enlarge the Selectmen's room and raise money for same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to act upon all Articles except Article 1 at 2 p. m.

12 pupils showed diseased tonsils  
4 pupils had adenoids

Cod-liver oil was given at morning and afternoon recess to the underweight and needy children.

Twenty-nine children received  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint of milk during winter months.

Three tonsilectomies were done this summer at Memorial Hospital, Concord.

Four children were taken to Dr. Shaw, Franklin, to be fitted with glasses, funds for one received from local Red Cross.

Two High school boys taken to Dr. Dunbar, Lebanon, to be fitted with glasses.

Five children's glasses were changed.

A Dental Clinic was financed by the proceeds of a program presented by the pupils of the schools.

Twenty-two received free dental care.

Clothing was given to families during year.

Class room inspection was held once a month for symptoms of communicable diseases, and to control pediculosis.

Children were measured twice during year and weighed every month.

Ninety-eight visits have been made to schools.

Forty-one home visits have been made.

I wish to express my appreciation to Mr. Freese, members of the School Board, local Red Cross, Grange, and to thank the parents and teachers for their daily cooperation in making possible the health program.
