State of New Hampshire

 To the inhabitants of the Town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the town charges for the ensuing year, and appropriate money for the same.
3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
6. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for police the ensuing year.
7. To see what action the town will take in regard to raising and appropriating money for the maintenance of a trunk line road.
8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer and water maintenance.
10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Common.
11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the retirement of Municipal Bonds, and appropriate money therefor.
12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for District Nurse.
13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.
14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a public dumping ground.

15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for skating rink.

16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a sewer on Church Street Extension, West Side, opposite Catholic Church.

17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a sidewalk on North side of Lower Main Street; also for completing the repairs on Upper Main Street from Church Street to Messenger's.

18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the Noyes property on Prospect Terrace and give title; also the bridges which have been abandoned.

19. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote of 1927 authorizing the disposal of the Town Building on Androscoggin Street.

20. To see what action the town will vote in regard to Ornamental Street Lighting and raise and appropriate money therefor.

21. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee of two to act in conjunction with the firewards to investigate and report at a future meeting.

22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 as an amount additional to that raised and appropriated at the annual meeting of 1927 for the purpose of installing a water system for domestic purposes on Gorham Hill, and instruct the water commission to so expend it during the present year of 1928.

23. To see if the town will vote to establish an Information Bureau and erect a suitable building or booth for said purpose at some convenient place on Main Street, employ a suitable attendant during the tourist season and raise and appropriate money for the same.

24. To see if the town will vote to establish a free public parking place on the easterly side of Park Street and to do whatever grading may be necessary for the same and raise and appropriate money therefor.

25. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE

Sect. 1. Parking of motor vehicles on the public streets of the village of Gorham after 12:30 o'clock A. M., is hereby forbidden; provided, however, that parking of motor vehicles on any free parking place that may be established by vote of the town

may be continued after said hour whenever a dance or other public entertainment continuing after said hour is held in the Municipal Building.

Sect. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined a sum not more than \$5.00 and not less than \$1.00.

26. To see if the town will vote to rescind the following votes:

"May 16, 1922. Art. 30. It was voted that the annual report of the water and sewer commission hereafter contain a detailed statement of the kind and quantity of all material, tools and implements purchased for the water and sewer system during each year and prices for same.

It was voted that any amounts paid to any member of the water and sewer commission or to the Superintendent of the town system be reported under the heading of "Superintendance" instead of "Labor."

It was voted that any amounts paid to any member of the commission hereafter show the number of miles of mains in the original town system, and additions to same and size of pipe, and cost of same as laid, also the number of miles of pipe, size of same and cost of same as used in the Cascade Extension and additions to same; also the number of feet and size of all service pipe connected with the town system and a similar statement in relation to all service pipe laid in the Cascade Extension; also the kind and number of services connected with the original town system and the kind and number of services connected with the Cascade Extension."

"Year of 1923. Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to require its different town officers who have the expending of the town's money for their various departments to itemize in the annual printed report all moneys received, from whom, and when received; and each expenditure, showing to whom paid, for what purpose paid, and the work done or material furnished therefor, in addition to and supplementing the condensed uniform accounts prescribed by the State Tax Commission."

"Year of 1924. Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to amend the vote passed under Article 30 at the adjourned meeting of 1922, held on May 16th of that year, by inserting between the words 'It was voted that the' and the words 'annual report' in the first line of said vote, the figures '1923' and by striking out the word 'hereafter' in the second line so that said vote as amended shall read: 'It was voted that the 1923 annual report of the Water and Sewer Commission show the number of miles of mains in the original town system and additions to same and size of pipe and

cost of same as laid; also the number of miles of pipe, size of same and cost of same as laid in the Cascade Extension and additions to same. Also the number of feet and size of all service pipe connected with the town system and a similar statement in relation to all service pipe laid on the Cascade Extension. Also the kind and number of services connected with the original town system and the kind and number of services connected with the Cascade Extension.' And to further amend said vote by adding the following: 'And thereafter the Commission shall only report annually the same details for all new installations of mains and service pipe or other additions to the system made during each year in order to avoid the needless expense of reprinting each year the data contained in the 1923 report,' and to see that the different Town Officers' reports be condensed to a minimum form."

27. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

28. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Attached is a copy of the following recommendations :

The State Highway department estimate the cost of Trunk Line maintenance \$16,600. Of this amount the State will pay one-half. We therefore recommend that the town appropriate and raise \$8,300 for Trunk Line maintenance.

We recommend that a sewer be constructed to accommodate the houses on Church Street Extension, West side, opposite Catholic Church, and that the amount of \$500 be raised, the balance to be used from the unexpended balance left from Malloy sewer last year.

We recommend the amount of \$1,500 be raised and appropriated for sidewalks. This amount to be used in completing repairs to Main Street sidewalk from Church Street to Messenger's which was damaged by flood, and balance to be used for new walk on Lower Main Street.

We recommend that the following Article be inserted in the Town Warrant :

Article authorizing the Selectmen to sell the Noyes property on Prospect Terrace also the bridges which have been dismantled.

We recommend that the vote of 1927 authorizing the disposal of the Town Building on Androscoggin Street be recinded.

In regard to request for raising money for Gorham Hill water. The Budget Committee after conferring with the Water Commission as to the supply of water, and taking into consideration the amount of taxable property as it appears on the tax book, do not wish to make any recommendation.

There were other requests brought before the Committee for consideration but in order to keep our tax rate around last year's

figure we feel that these matters should come before the taxpayers at the regular Town Meeting.

We suggest the following Article be inserted in the Town Warrant:

To see what action the town will take for improved ornamental lighting and raise and appropriate money therefor.

The firewards express the opinion that something should be done to handle the Cascade situation, and favor purchasing a new truck. We suggest that a committee of two be appointed to act in conjunction with the firewards to investigate as to our equipment or requirements and report at a future meeting.

If no new projects appear more than are contained in our budget, the tax rate should be about \$30.00 per \$1,000.

This is to certify that we have examined the accounts of the various departments of the Town of Gorham for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1928, and report as follows:

The receipts of the Town as shown by the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer were checked as to source and amount.

The disbursements of the Town as shown by the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer were checked, but several errors were found in some of the payrolls and bills; these errors were not large in amount and could be corrected. The vouchers and checks were found to agree. The checks were signed by at least two of the Selectmen and countersigned by the Town Treasurer. The money turned over to the Town Treasurer was deposited in the White Mountain National Bank. The payrolls and bills were attached to the vouchers.

The books of the Water and Sewer Department were checked with those of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer. The receipts of the Department were turned over to the Town Treasurer. The disbursements of the Department were paid by the Selectmen and covered by suitable vouchers. The payrolls of the Department were signed by those who received the money.

The payrolls and bills of the Highway Department were checked with the books, vouchers and checks of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer with exceptions noted. Payrolls of the Department were signed by those who received the money.

The accounts of the Town Clerk were examined and the receipts were checked with the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer.

The accounts of the Town Library and District Nursing were examined and checked with the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer.

The complaints and warrants of the Municipal Court were checked with the docket.

The accounts of the Trustees of Trust Funds were checked.

The accounts of the Agent of the Municipal Building were examined and the receipts checked with the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer; this account does not include the \$500.00 received by the Town for the use of the rooms occupied by the Masons.

The Tax Collector's accounts of the amount committed for collection, the amount collected including interest, special taxes, on previous years uncollected taxes, property taxes sold and abatements were examined and checked with the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer.

The funds received by the various departments were turned over to the Town Treasurer and covered by proper receipts.

We again urge that careful scrutiny be given payrolls and bills before vouchers and checks are executed.
