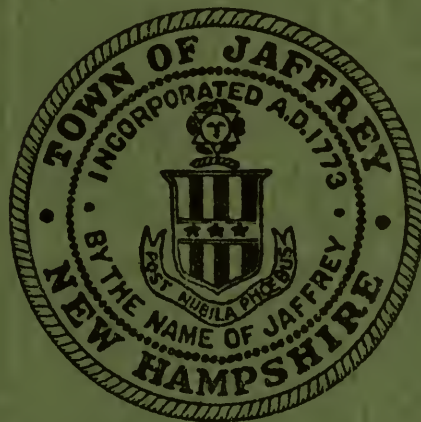

Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of
Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, in said Town,
on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at nine o'clock
in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years,
and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To hear all reports and act thereon.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be required for the
support of poor, building and repairing highways and bridges,
fire department, Memorial Day, street lights, and all other town
charges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen
to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate
the sum of \$2,751.75 for State Aid Construction, upon condition
that the State allot the sum of \$2,063.25 to be expended on The
Turnpike, so-called, beginning where the work ended last year,
or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Alfred S.
Despres and others.

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept the fire truck built
by the East Jaffrey Fire Department, or act in any way relating
thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00
in trust, the income to be used for the care of the Henry Cham-
berlain lot in the Cutter Cemetery, or act in any way relating
thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00
in trust, the income to be used for the care of the Edith E. Frost
lot in the Cutter Cemetery, or act in any way relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to have all side-walk and road
construction and repairs in the Town of Jaffrey by and under
the supervision and control of the elected road agent for the
district in which the construction or repairs are to be completed.
The completed work shall be accepted and approved by the
Selectmen of the Town of Jaffrey, as petitioned for by Donald
K. Sawtelle and others.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a
sum of money to be expended on putting a sewer through Char-
lotte Street, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned
for by Mabel P. Urquhart and others.

11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road
beginning at the corner near the residence of Harold C. Royce
and ending at the so-called Milton Baker place or act in any
way relating thereto.

12. To see what action the Town will take in regard to
raising the salary of the Judge of the Municipal Court.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum
of \$1,000.00 to be used for tarring one mile of new gravel road
on the so-called Fitzwilliam Road from the residence of George
A. Adams, extending West, one mile, or act in any way relating
thereto as petitioned for by Hugh Morgan and others.

14. To see if the Town will vote to lower the water main pipe on Main Street, in the vicinity of the Catholic Church, and to raise and appropriate money for same, as petitioned for by Rev. P. J. McDonough and others.

15. To see if the Town will vote to have a copy of the Town Warrant for the biennial, annual or any other meeting, and all other Town notices, printed in a newspaper circulated in the Town of Jaffrey, in addition to the form of notice prescribed by law.

The article if adopted to be included in by-laws governing notice of town meetings, as petitioned for by Edward T. Shields and others.

16. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under the act of the laws of 1933, Chapter 99, Section 22 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.

17. To see if the Town will vote to close with gates and bars the road leading from the Fitzwilliam line at Scott Pond to the so-called Marshall place, or act in any way relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to close with gates and bars the road leading from the old location of School No. 4 to the road leading from the Gay Farm, so-called, to the Rindge line, or act in any way relating thereto.

6. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
7. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
8. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
9. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.

Resolved, by the voters of Jaffrey in town meeting assembled this fourteenth day of March 1933, that while by the previous

vote of the town the Permanent Road Improvement money is to be expended "under the direction of the Selectmen" it is the sense of the voters that the Selectmen should assign direct control of the work to some suitable person under their supervision.

Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,878.50 for State Aid construction, upon condition that the State allot the sum of \$2,151.75, to be expended on the Turnpike Road, so-called, beginning where work ended last year.

Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to close the old road near Badger pond by gates and bars at both ends.

Voted to pass over Art. 7 (road discontinued in 1926).

Voted that the matter of laying a water pipe in the Old Town burial ground at Jaffrey Centre, be left in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds, with the suggestion that the surplus income of trust funds on lots in that cemetery be used to pay for same.

Voted to pass over Article 9 (Sewer Charlonne Street).

Voted that the town with sincere thanks accept the fire truck built by the Jaffrey Center Fire Department.

Voted that the Firemen be paid the same as last year.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate \$200.00 to provide a swimming instructor and life guard at Contoocook Lake to act under the direction of the Jaffrey Parent-Teachers' Association.

Voted to pass over Article 13. (to accept Parent Street).

Voted to adopt the following Ordinance by the Selectmen:

Town of Jaffrey, N. H.

In the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

An ordinance relating to the observance of the Lord's Day.

Be it ordained by the Board of Selectmen of the town of Jaffrey:

Section 1. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day, after one o'clock in the afternoon to conduct or participate in play, games, sports, and exhibitions of physical skill, whether or not admission fees are charged thereto; except public dancing, horse racing, prize fighting, wrestling, pool, billiards or bowling; and after six o'clock in the afternoon to conduct, participate in or attend concerts, lectures, theatricals, vaudeville or motion picture performances, whether or not admission fees are charged thereto. The Board of Selectmen may regulate to time, manner and areas of such plays, games and sports, to the end that no unreasonable disturbance of peace or quiet shall be caused thereby.

Section 2. Retail trade. It shall be lawful on the Lord's Day to sell at retail, newspapers, periodicals, flowers, nursery stock, ice cream, soft drinks, confectionery, fruit, bakery products, cigars, cigarettes, tobacco, smoking accessories, toilet articles, gasoline, oil, automobile parts and accessories and food for consumption on the premises.

Except as provided herein and Section 5 of Chapter 385 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire, it shall be unlawful to sell or expose for sale any merchandise whatever on the Lord's Day.

Approved by the Selectmen of Jaffrey, N. H., Feb. 27, 1933.

Voted not to raise and appropriate money for band concerts. The following resolution was presented and unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

Whereas: Peter E. Hogan served the town of Jaffrey faithfully as its Selectman for fifteen years—a longer period than has been served by any other Selectman: Therefore be it

Resolved, that the town of Jaffrey in town meeting assembled this fourteenth day of March, 1933, hereby express its appreciation of his long and helpful service: and its sense of deep loss at his death, and be it further

Resolved, that these resolutions be spread upon the records of the town and a copy be transmitted to the bereaved widow and published in the Jaffrey Recorder.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Jaffrey:

I submit herewith my sixteenth annual report as superintendent of schools, this being the twenty-fifth in the series under union supervision. The report of Headmaster Beal of Conant High School is included in this report.

The total school enrollment for the first twelve weeks of the present school year is 583, which is twenty-seven larger than the figures for the school year 1932-33.

The reduced school budget adopted last March necessitated the dropping of one teacher as well as the reduction of salaries of all teachers receiving more than \$900 per year.

Miss Dorothea Vanni, who had taught grades three and four during the past two years resigned July 1st, and Miss Elizabeth S. Bunker was assigned to grades one and two, and Miss Frances Jackson to grades three, four and five.

As will be noted in the statistical table, all teachers have large grades, and several of the high school classes have been divided on account of their size.

In order to retain our supervisor of music it was necessary to have Mrs. Whitcomb go on half time, coming to our schools once in two weeks. It is to be regretted that this change was required, but the work is being carried on in a very satisfactory manner.

Through an arrangement with the District Nursing Association and the State Supervisor of Health, Miss Margaret Harris began work as School Nurse December 1st. All pupils have been thoroughly examined and follow-up work carried on. Miss Josephine Cassidy, a graduate of Keene Normal School, was assigned to this union as a C. W. A. worker, and assisted Miss Harris from Dec. 1st until Feb. 15th.

An outbreak of measles just before and during the Christmas vacation delayed the opening of schools until January 8th. The week lost at this time will be made up at the close of the school year.

During the summer vacation the necessary repairs mentioned in my last report were made on the roof and walls of Conant High School, and on the roof of Union Hall annex. The expense of this work was greater than the original estimate called for, and the special appropriation was considerably overrun.

At the opening of school in September it was found that the old boiler in Union Hall building was unsafe, and a new steam boiler was installed.

During the spring term of 1933 a Dental Clinic was carried on for the pupils of the primary grades. The Parent-Teacher Association contributed \$100.00 toward this work, and Dr. Wilkins and Dr. Charles co-operated generously in making the clinic a success. Miss LaFreniere and the P. T. A. committee assisted greatly in the work of transporting the children and getting them ready for the dentists.

The school board budget will call for about the same regular appropriations as last year. No increases in salaries are anticipated, but with rising prices it does not seem wise to reduce the items that are necessary to carry on the work of the school efficiently. It must be remembered that our schools are constantly increasing in size and it is poor economy to allow them to be inefficiently equipped.

I desire at this time to thank the school board, teachers, pupils, and all interested citizens who have loyally supported our schools during the past year.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF HIGH SCHOOL

To Lewis S. Record, Superintendent of Schools, East Jaffrey, N. H.
The following is my fourth annual report as Headmaster of Conant High School:

Teaching Staff

All of our teachers returned this year to find conditions even more crowded than heretofore. We have had to divide several classes either because of the large number of pupils or on account of lack of available room.

Enrollment and Attendance

While the total enrollment for the year is one hundred thirty-one, the actual number of pupils on February 9 is one hundred twenty-two, forty-nine boys and seventy-three girls. These pupils are distributed by grades as follows:

Extra-Curricula Activities

Music. Mrs. Mildred Whitcomb has the supervision of the High School music again this year. Although Mrs. Whitcomb comes only once in two weeks, she has developed the chorus and Glee clubs as she did last year, and is planning a spring musicale.

Scholarship. At graduation last June the following awards were made: For highest honors in English, Kathleen Cournoyer; in History, James Fitzgerald; in Mathematics, Joseph Coll; best all-round girl, Barbara Messing; best all-round boy, Joseph Coll; in Typewriting, Emily George. Conant High Seniors made a creditable showing last year in the Keene Normal School Scholarship tests and also in the three customary State Department tests. Two Parent-Teacher scholarships of \$100.00 were awarded to Barbara Messing and Mildred Cutter.

Washington, D. C., Trip. The present seniors are planning to go to Washington during their Easter vacation. The system of saving for these trips has been explained in my 1933 report. In this connection future classes are asked to leave any bank balance for the benefit of other Washington Trip classes. I would like to suggest further that classes which have graduated and have small bank balances will these amounts to this Fund.

Athletics. In Athletics our programs have been curtailed on account of expense. However, a Field Day was held in October for the grades, and we have continued our baseball and basketball games in the Monadnock League.

Dramatics. On November 17 the Class of 1934 presented "In Came Mary Anne" to a large and appreciative audience. Then on February 9 the Class of '33 gave the play "Oh, Professor." Both of these plays were under the direction of Miss Margaret Cournoyer, teacher of English, and realized substantial sums for the Washington trips.

Conclusion. Our High School is still growing. With the graduation of the present senior class and the entrance of a Freshman class of over forty our total number of pupils next year will be over one hundred and forty. The eighth grade will number over sixty next year.

Parents should make certain that they see the report cards of their children every six weeks and interpret the marks correctly. I have known parents to be surprised to hear that their son or daughter was not going to graduate, when the report card has shown only continued failure for most of the year.

Due to contemplated changes in the curricula there has been no commercial subject for Freshmen this year. Beginning next year, however, the course in Junior Business Training will be prescribed for Commercial Freshmen.

Finally, I want to thank you for your encouragement and cooperation in working out our high school problems this year.
