





#### WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

### The State of New Hampshire

(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the Second Tuesday, of March next at 8:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Second—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Third—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the construction and repairs of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Fourth—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.

Fifth—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

**Sixth**—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to provide free Hospital Service for needy people, or act thereon.

Seventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association.

Eighth—To se what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library.

Ninth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library.

Tenth—To see if the town will take any action in regard to control the White Pine Blister Rust, and appropriate any money for same.

**Eleventh**—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Twelfth—To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes, if paid before specified dates.

Thirteenth—To see if the town will continue the inspection of milk and raise money therefor.

Fourteenth—To see if the town will vote to give prescription permits from May first 1933, to May first 1934, according to Section 99, Laws of 1919, to druggists who are registered Pharmacists doing business in Lebanon, to sell liquors for medicinal, sacramental, scientific or mechanical purposes.

Fifteenth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers and Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Sixteenth—To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Budget Committee and vote to accept their recommendations as printed.

Seventeenth—To see if the town will vote to direct the Selectmen to appoint a zoning commission for the purpose provided in Sec. 53 Chapter 42 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.

Eighteenth—To see if the town will vote to accept the regulation of the Selectmen, relating to the observance of the Lord's Day, or act thereon.

Nineteenth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,083.50 for State Aid Construction and to receive \$3,062.75 from the State, or act thereon.

Twentieth—To see if the town will vote to install an electric light in Suzor Court, on petition of ten legal voters, or act thereon.

Twenty-first—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Tax Collector to impose a fee of twenty cents on all Poll Taxes unpaid by July 15, said fee to revert to the town, or act thereon.

Twenty-second—To see if the town will vote to appoint a land agent to take over all property which the town has acquired a Tax Title from the Tax Collector, and make disposal of same, or act thereon.

Twenty-third—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to make a written lease of the Opera House and moving picture fixtures in the Town Hall to the Lebanon Improvement Society for moving pictures and theatrical purposes for a term not to exceed five years upon such terms and conditions as the Selectmen deem expedient for the best interests of the town.

Twenty-fourth—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to restore to the police officers of Lebanon a part of the 40% cut in wages which they have received by paying all police officers at the rate of \$4.00 per day and the Chief of Police \$5.00 per day, or act thereon.

Twenty-fifth—To see what action the town will take in regard to the collection of garbage, and raise money for the same, or act thereon.

Twenty-sixth—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road leading from State Road near Bakers Crossing over the overpass to the new State Road, or act thereon.

Twenty-seventh—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road leading from Bass Hill to Newport Road, known as the Downer Road, or act thereon.

Twenty-eighth—To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road leading from State Road near Buckman's at Mascoma, to Rudsboro Road, road not now being used, or act thereon.

Twenty-ninth—To see if the town will vote to elect an Advisory Committee, whose duties shall be to advise the Selectmen in regard to town affairs and that said committee shall in cooperation with the Selectmen act as the Budget Committee at the close of the fiscal year, or act thereon.

Thirtieth—To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Thirty-first—To choose one Selectman for the ensuing three years, and to choose one Selectman for the ensuing year, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and two Library Trustees for the ensuing three years, and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Thirty-second—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds of the town for three years.

Thirty-third—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to pass ordinances that will not conflict with the laws of New Hampshire relative to itinerant venders and hawkers who come in our town and sell their wares without paying taxes or license.

Thirty-fourth—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Overseer of the Poor and the Selectmen to raise the amount of groceries allowed the poor from the present rate of four cents per meal per person to not less than six cents per meal per person, or act thereon.

Thirty-fifth—To transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

#### Comments

Wherever possible we first determined the amount of money that should have been received by the different departments, officers and agents of the Town and then compared our findings with the records kept by the Town Treasurer and Selectmen. For example, in verifying the amount of money that should have been received from tax collections,

we made a detailed analysis of the tax blotter, thereby determining the amount turned over to the Collector for collection. Discounts given were investigated with respect to the dates on which payments were received.

The funds that should have been received from the State and County were verified by direct correspondence with the State Treasurer and County Commissioner. The receipts of other departments such as the Municipal Court and Town Clerk were verified through an audit of the records of the departments in each case.

We found satisfactory vouchers to support all disbursements.

#### REPORT OF MILK INSPECTOR

The work of Milk Inspection has been carried on about as usual as far as general routine is concerned in visiting the producers and going over the proper technic of cooling, method of washing and sterilizing bottles and utensils used in milking and straining etc. The general health condition of the cows other than tuberculosis, as Mastitis is prevalent in some sections and if such milk is allowed to be furnished the people of Lebanon serious results would be expected as we are using raw milk No pasteurization plant is in operation in town.

The samples of milk are taken during delivery on the street. These are placed in special iced containers and expressed to the State Laboratory of Hygiene for analysis. A report is then sent to the producer. If the Bacteria count, Butter Fat, Solids or B. Coli are not satisfactory the technic of that producer is gone over again and a sample taken the following week and so on until the milk is up to the required standard.

The number of milk producers have greatly increased this year, several from out of the State as in Norwich, Hartland, Sharon and Randolph.

We have had no outbreak of disease this year traceable to our milk supply. Some work has been done in testing the milk for pus organisms on herds showing high Bacteria Count. This is very important in that we here find the cause of Septic Sore Throat.
