TOWN WARRANT The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, polls to close at 6 p.m. to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to approve of having two sessions for the annual Town meeting in this Town, the first session for choice of Town Officers elected by an official ballot and other action required to be inserted on said official ballot and a second session, on a date set by the Selectmen, for transaction of other business.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt, Amendments numbered, Article III Part A New Developments Sec. 2, 4, & 5, and Article III Part B Trailer, Semi-dependant Mobile Homes, and Mobile Homes Sec. 4 and Article III Part C Tenting and Camping Trailer Parks Sec. 1 & 2, and Article VII Penalty, as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Ordinances.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for interest on same.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,725.00 for the Northwood Public Libraries.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,040.00 for Recreation, Parks and Playgrounds.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Band Concerts.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the care of Cemeteries.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,676.70 for the purpose of Street Lighting.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$779.75 for the purpose of Town Road Aid, the State share to be \$5,198.35.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to be used in addition to the joint T.R.A. fund.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$417.00 for the Concord Hospital.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,998.00 for Ambulance Service, to to be paid to the Barnstead Center Fire Department.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,549.00 for the Town's per capita share of the Rural District Health Council.

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Control of Pine Blister Rust.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$77.50 for the purpose of supporting the Rockingham County Community Action Program, Inc.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purpose of supporting the Portsmouth Mental Health Clinic.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purpose of increasing the established Highway Construction Machinery Capital Reserve Fund.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that part of the Canterbury Road beginning on the northerly side of Route 4 and passing through land now owned by Thomas H. Veinote and land of Lawrence Tasker to the easterly side of Route 107.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to sell, for the sum of twenty-four cents (\$.24), all of their 5/21's equity in the dam, flowage, and land embracing the dam site at North River Pond to the New Hampshire Water Resources Board.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to convey to George V. & Dorothy I. Linscott a right-of-way across land owned by the Town in Harvey Lake Estates at a location designated by the Selectmen. This right-of-way is to allow George V. & Dorothy I. Linscott to exercise their deeded equity to the Beaches in Harvey Lake Estates.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to remove the spruce trees in front of the Town Hall.

- 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds as the result of Tax Sales.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the price of lots in Pine Grove Cemetery from \$50.00 per lot to \$100.00 per lot.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of clause 6 of the last will and testament of Dana Woodman late of Northwood to wit: "I give and bequeath the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to the Town of Northwood in trust. Never the less, the income to be used for the perpetual care of the memorial to my son, Lieut. George C. Woodman, which is located at Woodman Park in said Northwood."
- 28. To transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking materials and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follows:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- 2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.



In September of 1969, six new faculty members joined the teaching staff of the Northwood Elementary School. Mr. Thomas Conway replaced Mrs. Juanita Parker as Principal and teacher of grade seven and eight; Mrs. Marion Lewis replaced Mrs. Louise Parker and was assigned to grades three and two; Mr. David Snell replaced Mrs. Christine Ching in grade four; Mr. Robert Yale replaced Mr. Michael Ching in grades seven and eight; Mrs. Marjorie Conway replaced Mrs. Mildred Chesley as part-time teacher; Mrs. Doris Anderson was added as a Teacher Aide and funded with Federal Funds under Title 1, ESEA.

In July and August a summer remedial reading program under the direction of Mrs. Bernice Omand and Mrs. Martha Bennett, also funded with Federal Funds under Title 1, ESEA, was successfully completed.

However, in evaluating the remedial reading program, it appears to us that prevention instead of remediation is, in the long run a less costly solution. This can be accomplished by: changing the entrance age; limiting the classroom size to twenty; recruiting the best of teachers for the primary grades; providing a Readiness Room between kindergarten and first grade to children who are developmentally 5 or 5½ years old. Preventative measures at this crucial turning point of life will pay off tremendously in terms of money spent on remedial and psychiatric care, stress to the children and families, and time and space wasted in the classroom.

The most urgent problem facing the district continues to be the need for additional classroom space, a nurse's room, a resource center and additional storage space. The lack of classroom facilities made it necessary to house grade 5 in the Fire Station. Recommendations from your Building Needs Committee, appointed at the last annual district meeting, should be supported.

In closing, the undersigned should like to express their appreciation of the cooperation they have received

from local citizens, school board, students and professional staff. Your continued cooperation to provide your children with the best possible education is greatly appreciated.

SCHOOL BUILDING COMMITTEE - 1969-70

The Northwood School Building Committee which had been appointed by the moderator, Mr. Robert Johnson, at the Northwood School District meeting in March 1969 met a total of eleven times.

At the first meeting, held in May, arrangements were made for members to tour the East Rochester School which makes use of the open classroom concept. On May 21 some members made the tour. At a meeting that evening they reported back to the rest of the group.

Mr. Lane, the chairman of the committee, called for reports by three members who had done some research on the growth projection for Northwood. The direction which the committee should take was discussed and the decision made to contact an architect.

At a meeting on June 26, Mr. Hersey of Hersey Associates and a member of his firm, Mr. Donald Sommers met with the committee. A tour of the Northwood Elementary School was made. Costs for renovating the auditorium to make it available for classrooms were discussed.

On July 15 members met with Mr. Tate of the State Department of Education to discuss state requirements which will have to be met in 1972 in new building programs. Also present were Mr. Donald Sommers of Hersey Associates, and Supt. of Schools Mr. Ramon Martineau and his assistant Mr. Charles Morgan.

At a meeting August 19 Mr. Donald Sommers brought in plans which expanded the kitchen facilities so that they could handle a proposed addition of four rooms and a resource center. Discussion of the plans and the cost of the addition ensued.

On September 16 Mr. Tom Eagle from Hersey Associates had more specific plans for the addition and

renovation of the kitchen facilities to present to the committee. For a November meeting Mr. Eagle would have cost estimates. A meeting was proposed between the Board of Trustees of Coe Brown and the building committee.

On October 17 the committee met with some of the Trustees of Coe Brown. The School Board briefly outlined the space problems at the Elementary School. The headmaster of the Academy presented the facilities and program which would be available.

At a meeting October 21 the committee decided to meet with the budget committee to inform them of the progress being made and to share with them information gathered by the committee; also present was Mr. Donald Sommers with a breakdown of cost estimates.

At a meeting November 18 with the Budget Committee, Mr. Tom Eagle of Hersey Associates presented some of the plans which the Building Committee had been considering. Dr. Harold Zoller, a structural engineer who had served the School Board in making necessary repairs to the Elementary School, was present at this meeting.

On December 20 the committee met with Mr. Ralph Theall, the representative for Mobile Classrooms, Inc. He provided information concerning size, construction, facilities and the cost of leasing mobile classrooms. Members of the committee visited classrooms in use in Littleton and Sunapee.

At a meeting of the building committee January 6, 1970, guests were Mr. Robert Johnson and Mr. John Leaders. Mr. Johnson outlined a building program which Coe Brown Academy Trustees would consider in the event that the seventh and eighth graders were sent to the Academy. Mr. Leader gave a brief talk as to the program of studies which could be provided for the students.

A discussion followed involving such ideas as length of contract required by Coe Brown; whether the Academy could be ready by September 1970; what position the school board would have in determining policy; what representation the school board would have with the Board of Trustees and what bussing problems might result.

The final meeting of the school building committee took place on February 5, 1970. The school board was interested in the committee's reaction to the special school district meeting held January 31. Out of the discussion the conclusions arrived at were that the townspeople wanted the prefabricated rooms to be leased and used on a temporary basis, with a long-range building plan to be determined by a school building study group and the school board.

The school board had written into the minutes of the meeting their thanks and appreciation to the building committee for all the work done and information obtained.

REPORT OF SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

To the School Board and Citizens of Northwood:

The past year at the Northwood Elementary School we have seen tremendous growth in student population.

It was anticipated that we would have 240 students but at the present time we have 275 students. This increase has caused many problems not only for the staff, but also for the existing facilities. We have been forced to use the fire house meeting room as a classroom which has its drawbacks.

We are anticipating 300 or more students in September which will mean adding teachers to the staff and additional facilities to accommodate them.

Present plans call for an ungraded elementary for grades 1-3 with five levels of instruction rather than grades.

We feel that the school has had a growing year educationally and we hope with improved facilities and smaller teacher loads, we can provide a much better education for the children of Northwood.

In closing I would like to express my appreciation to the local citizens, school board, students and staff for their cooperation this year.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The health program for the year 1968-69, was carried out in the usual manner with an annual physical inspection of each student by the nurse. When defects were noted, the appropriate referral and follow-up were made.

The Heaf Test for tuberculosis was offered in each school to the first and second grade students. A total of 324 children were tested, and 4 also received the Mantoux Test.

The students of Epsom, Northwood, and Strafford again received the benefit of preventive dental care through programs sponsored by the N. H. Bureau of Dental Public Health and one or more local organizations. Barrington, Epsom, and Northwood schools also provided corrective dental treatment through The Matching Funds Program.

142 children were registered for first grade at Preschool Clinics held in April and May. Mrs. Norma Keeler of Epsom again offered her services at these clinics, and her help was greatly appreciated by all.

The ever increasing school population has had its effect on the health program, as well as elsewhere, raising the case load to well over 1,000 students for one nurse. The recommendation of the N. H. State Board of Education is for a maximum case load not to exceed 750 pupils per nurse; and, ideally a full-time nurse for every 350 students.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to Mr. Martineau, Mr. Morgan, School Board Members, teachers and parents for their cooperation and support during the past year.
