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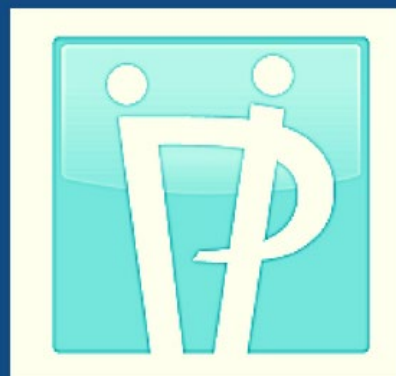

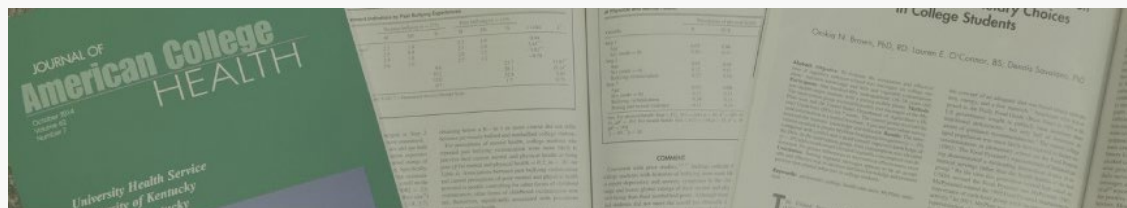
- Writing for Business New Hampshire Magazine, Jane and Sharyn outlined the steps involved in Changing the Office Culture to Be Better for Women

relationship violence prevention training, PIRC put on a Bringing in the Bystander® training for CSAPPNH colleges and their community partners. PIRC researchers and curriculum development specialists will be presenting at the 41st

Annual [Research Society on Alcoholism](#) Meeting to present research specific to their NIH-funded project, [Development and Pilot Trial of an Intervention to Reduce Disclosure Recipients Negative Social Reactions and Victims Psychological Distress and Problem Drinking](#). In addition to presenting pilot research that served as the foundation for currently funded project, the project team will present findings from other cutting edge studies including a UNH-conducted study on longitudinal associations among binge drinking and interpersonal violence among high school students. The project team will engage in a full-day meeting to finalize all aspects of the clinical trial set to launch at UNH in September 2018! The multi-disciplinary project team includes Associate Professor Katie Edwards (UNH), curriculum development specialist Caroline Leyva (UNH), postdoctoral research fellow Emily Waterman (UNH), and co-investigators Sarah Ullman (University of Illinois Chicago), Lindsey Rodriguez (University of South Florida, St. Petersburg) and Christina Dardis (Towson University).

Recent Publications



PIRC Researchers Sharyn Potter, Rebecca Howard, Sharon Murphy, and Mary Moynihan recently published an article in a special issue of the Journal of American College Health focused on sexual violence on college campuses. Researchers interviewed 32 survivors of college sexual assault to better understand the long-term impacts of trauma on a student's education trajectory and career attainment. Ninety-one percent of participants reported health problems related to the assault that they attributed to difficulties they faced in their attainment of their education and career goals. The findings suggest the importance of examining the human capital loss and mental and physical health problems attributed to campus sexual assault. Bringing in the Bystander[®] High School Curriculum

Our BITB family of products grows with a **high school curriculum (BITB-HSC)** out July 1. Comprised of seven interactive modules designed to fit into a high school class schedule, each module is co-taught to a co-ed group of participants and uses various teaching methods to actively engage participants. Preliminary evaluations suggest the program is well-liked by students and school staff and effective in leading to attitudinal and behavior change. We will be offering a two-day training institute at UNH August 6-7, 2018. Consultation is also available.

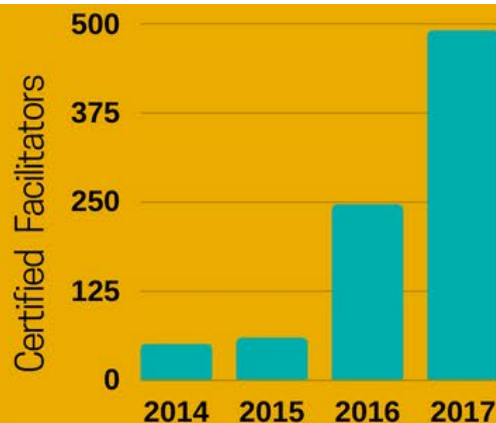
