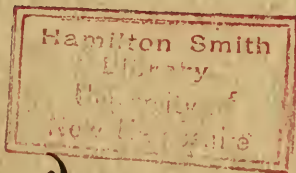

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the  
(L. S.) County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town  
Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To here the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing, and make appropriation for the same.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town highways and bridges.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction of highways.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and repair of Town buildings.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to offer discounts on taxes at the rate of 3% for payments by June 1st, 2% by August 1st, and 1% by October 1st.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
