# Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stewartstown on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next at Nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for for care of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the Town will raise \$800.00 for Street Lighting.
  - 7. To see if the Town will accept Highway State Aid.
- 8. To see what sums of money, in addition to that required by law, the Town will raise for the buildings and repairs of Highways and Bridges.
  - (a) Town Maintenance.
  - (b) State Aid Maintenance.
  - (c) Trunk Line Maintenance.
  - (d) Trunk Line Construction.
- 9. To see what sums of money the Town will raise to pay interest and principal on Town debt.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Winter Roads.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to buy a snow plow and make appropriation for same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to continue the Constructruction of cement road on Main Street in West Stewartstown and make appropriation for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to hire a Certified Accountant to audit the Town Books, and make appropriation for the

same.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

### February 1, 1929 to February 1, 1930

During this last complete year I have made 194 visits to the various schools of the town and have been in attendance at eight meetings of the School Board.

At the beginning of the school year in September an outline of the course of study based on the State program of study was placed in all the schools and it is though that where this outline is carefully followed, and the work accomplished, the different grades will more nearly approach their standard degree of accomplishment.

I have endeavered to check up on the work being done by the pupils both by giving Standard Achievement Tests, and by oral examinations of the pupils while visiting the school.

As a general thing the degree of success with which a year is ended in the school will depend upon the ability, interest, and whole-hearted endeavors of the teacher.

The State law now requires that teachers shall either be Normal graduates or have had at least three years of successful teaching experience. This should eventually result in bringing about better teaching in our schools.

The precent of attendance for the last complete school year was 93 which is exactly the same as for the preceding year. From present indications, this mark of attendance will be bettered during the present year. We hope eventually to have a mark of at least 95% in all our schools.

Next to good teaching, good attendance is one of the fundamental requirements in a good school. We have, however, had but a few inexcusable absences.

The buildings throughout the town are now in good condi-

tion, but in some of the schools new furniture will soon be needed. I believe that when the time comes to install new desks in our rural schools that the adjustable, and moveable chair desks will be satisfactory, and more durable in the long run.

A class of 16 pupils was graduated from the 8th grade of the different schools, and nearly all of these pupils have continued their work in high school.

We have a total of 33 pupils now registered in high schools at Canaan, Colebrook and Lancaster.
