### Superintendent's Report

The equalized valuation of this district this year is \$940,104 and the five dollar tax would be \$4,950 which is more than the estimated cost of elementary instruction for next year. The district will not be eligible, therefore, for state aid.

More pupils attended high school this year than was anticipated and the High School tuition bill will be \$1,500. The district raised \$1,000 for this item. Payment of high school tuition is a statutory requirement and the district will need to raise the balance of \$500.

In response to a petition containing about ninety names, the school board arranged for transportation beginning December 4 for eight pupils attending Bartlett High School. It is clearly within the power of the school board to do this but the arrangement will not be continued another year without the sanction of the district.

The proposal to discontinue the three schools and build one central school was not favorably considered at the last district meeting. If it is to be the policy of the district to continue the present schools, additions should be made to their equipment so that all schools will have chemical toilets, ventilating stoves and modern desks.

The benefits of a school nurse are so evident where one is employed that I recommend that the school board include in their budget \$125 for a nurse if ar-

rangements can be made with other neighboring districts to employ the same nurse.

All teachers employed this year are trained Normal School graduates with some experience and the schools are progressing well.

## BARTLETT SPECIAL

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### Superintendent's Report

The equalized valuation of Bartlett Special District is \$540,285 and the \$5.00 tax to be raised for elementary schools is accordingly \$2,701.43.

The rebuilding and rearrangement of the toilets at the Grammar School building during the summer is a decided improvement. The present lighting arrangements, however, are very undesirable and contrary to law. The state board of education may at any time withhold state aid unless proper changes are made.

Principal W. B. Hounsell and Miss Elinor Conant both resigned at the end of the year. Mr. Hounsell had given seven years of faithful service and Miss Conant had been an efficient instructor for two years. Their places have been very acceptably filled by Mr. Wilmot and Miss White, both graduates of New Hampshire University.

As in all approved high schools, sixteen units are required for graduation. With only two teachers it is necessary to provide the same curriculum for all pupils. We cannot claim that this is the best course of study for each and every pupil. It has been our judgment that under the necessities of the situation the curriculum adopted should be one which would meet the requirements for admission to the state university and to scientific schools of the same standing. There seems to be no way to make our course of study more adaptable to individual needs without adding to the teaching force.

I believe that the benefits secured would justify the school board in raising \$300 in the budget for the services of a part-time nurse. To offset this the state board of education would increase the amount of state aid by approximately \$125. Arrangements are com-

mon between neighboring districts for the employment of a school nurse who divides her time proportionately to the contributions of the several towns.

It is my belief that the schools are in excellent condition.
