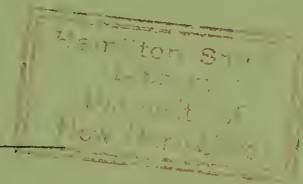

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the seventh day of March, 1908, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools.
8. To see if the School District will authorize the Board of Education to make a contract with some approved school for the higher education of our scholars.
9. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to unite with one or more town districts or special districts to form a supervisory district, for the purpose of employing a superintendent of the public schools therein, under the provisions of Chapter 77 of the Session Laws of New Hampshire, 1899, and to raise money for the same.

# School Report.

---

The number of scholars registered in our schools for the year is one hundred and one.

The number of children enumerated by the Truant Officer between the ages of five and sixteen, seventy-one.

During the past year the schools as a whole have been satisfactory.

We are convinced that our teachers are faithful in their work and are interested in the welfare and advancement of the scholars, but we deplore the fact that there are so many pupils who do not value the opportunity of getting an education as they ought, when the necessary text books and supplies are furnished free, and moreover it is surprising to know how little interest the parents take in the welfare and progress of their children's education.

It certainly would be beneficial to the teachers and scholars if all the parents, and those who are interested in education, would visit the schools during the ordinary routine of school work and, by so doing, be able to give valuable advice and make suggestions that would be for the betterment of our schools.
