You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the tenth (10) day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. Ta raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see what the Town will vote to raise for on the highway.
- 4. To see what the Town will vote ta raise for the extermination of the Pine Blister Rust.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for Highway and appropriate money for same.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Tumble Down Dick and Tibbetts Hill.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Books for the Public Library.

- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to move stone walls or build snow fences.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of One thousand (\$1,000) a year for two years to build State aid road if the State will raise five thousand (\$5,000) a year for two years.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Brookfield:

Gentlemen:—At the close of another fiscal year of the town I have the pleasure to submit my sixth annual report as superintendent of your schools.

The following table gives the statistics of the schools for the year ending June 30, 1924.

This table shows a marked improvement in the matter of punctuality, the number of instances of tardiness having been reduced by one-half, but the percent of attendance is lower than for several years past. The chief reason for this was pointed out in my report

one year ago. I am pleased to say that there is less reason for complaint at this time and that the percent of attendance has been high during the early months of the present year.

I believe that the action of the District in uniting the Churchill and Hackett schools this year is to the advantage of the pupils in both schools. By combining the two schools we had, at the beginning of the year, a school of twenty-two pupils. Eight of this number have since removed from town and, if we were now running the two schools as last year, there would only be seven pupils in each. That is too small a number for the best interests of the children. Where there are larger numbers there is more competition and more inspiration to do better work. Any competent teacher will do better work and obtain better results in a larger school.

After three years of faithful service in the Stone-ham school, Miss Laskey declined to accept a reappointment last June She has gone to a larger school in another town in the state. She is succeeded at Stoneham by Miss Ruby Farnham. We are more than fortunate to be able to retain Mrs. Willey in the Churchill school for the sixth successive year. Very few small schools in this state have been fortunate enough to retain the services of a teacher of her ability for any such a term of years.

Health work in the schools has continued under the direction of Mrs. Clow as for several years past. Her report will follow.

In closing I wish to express my thanks to all who have assisted in improving the efficiency of the schools.
