- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,060 to pay principal and interest of note due Carroll County Trust Company.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction on Robbins Hill Road and raise and appropriate \$349.50 for same. State to give \$1,000.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid in rebuilding the Bradley Brook Bridge and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the Town's share.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to buy the Ross plow and raise \$135.00 to pay for same. The \$250 rental which has been paid to be applied on purchase price.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase flags to decorate the graves of soldiers.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 9. To see whether beer or other alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act, Chapter 99, Section 22, Laws 1933.
- 10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing new equipment for plowing snow, and appoint a committee of two to serve with the Selectmen, to make negotiations.
