TOWN WARRANT

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,060 to pay principal and interest of note due Carroll County Trust Company.

4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction on Robbins Hill Road and raise and appropriate \$349.50 for same. State to give \$1,000.

5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid in rebuilding the Bradley Brook Bridge and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the Town's share.

6. To see if the Town will vote to buy the Ross plow and raise \$135.00 to pay for same. The \$250 rental which has been paid to be applied on purchase price.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase flags to decorate the graves of soldiers.

8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

9. To see whether beer or other alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act, Chapter 99, Section 22, Laws 1933.

10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing new equipment for plowing snow, and appoint a committee of two to serve with the Selectmen, to make negotiations.
