

TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

Carroll, SS.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of Carroll, qualified to vote in Town Affiairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House at Center Conway, New Hampshire, March 14, 1939, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes: Section A. Town officers' salaries.

- B. Town officers' expenses.
- C. Election and registration.
- D. Municipal Court.
- E. Town Hall and office expense.
- F. Damage and legal expense.
- G. Police Department.
- H. Fire Department.
- I. Payment on bond issue.
- J. Health Department.
- K. Vital Statistics.
- L. Deficit, 1939.
- M. Town maintenance of highways (summer).
- N. Town maintenance of highways (winter).
- O. Libraries.
- P. Town Poor.
- Q. Old Age Assistance.
- R. Memorial Day.
- S. Soldiers' Aid.
- T. Parks and Playgrounds.
- U. Interest.
- V. State Tax.
- W. County Tax.

Art. 3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to discounting taxes.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize

the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town, the sum of \$60,000 if needed.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds during the present fiscal year.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town a sufficient sum of money to obtain Federal or State Aid on any project agreeable to the Selectmen for which application may be made.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of the Class II road known as the River Road, North Conway, N. H., to Bartlett town line, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,751.25; or will accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$858.95 for said purpose.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to resurface about 8/10 of a mile of road in East Conway on the Green Hill Road, known as the Lewis Woods, agreeable to a petition signed by Bert E. Smith and others.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand dollars, (\$2,000) if necessary, to straighten, resurface and tar the road from the junction of the Gibson and Scribner Cottage road, so-called, to the foot of the Ivy Hill, a distance of one-half mile, agreeable to a petition signed by P. W. Mudgett and others.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for weekly band concerts during the months of July and August, 1939, by the Conway Band under the supervision of the Selectmen, agreeable to a petition signed by Herbert L. Yeaton and others.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to surface and tar the road leading from the Main street in Kearsarge near the residence of Lester C. Barnes to the top of the hill, past the residence of Norman A. Barnes, said piece of road being approximately 1000 feet long, agreeable to a petition signed by Norman A. Barnes and others.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75, its proportionate share relative to total valuation of Carroll County to cover deficiency in allotment for maintenance of County Extension Service Recreational Agent to end of fiscal year inclusive of July 31, 1939.

Art. 14. - To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be used for the observance of Memorial Day by the Veterans of Foreign Wars to be used in the Town of Conway, the same sum as was appropriated last year to the Veterans of Foreign Wars for this observance, agreeable to a petition signed by Parker Drown and others.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to be used and expended to grade and tarvia Mason Road in North Conway village, from its junction with Pine Street to its junction with Mechanic Street, agreeable to a petition signed by O. Douglass Macomber and others.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or appropriate and hire to put in shape and tar the remainder of Artist Falls Road from Frank Ashnault's residence to the Forest Glen Inn, agreeable to a petition signed by Mrs. Mary A. Thompson and others.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Tramp House.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$750 for the purpose

of establishing one or more public dumps, and to appoint a committee to arrange for same if they find suitable locations and report to the next town meeting.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800 to drain Seavey and Kearsarge streets in North Conway.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) to be used for the promotion and publicity of the Eastern Slope Region, agreeable to a petition signed by Robert N. Davis and others.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will appropriate \$301.00, based on 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, for town share of co-operative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to widen and improve the bridge and its approaches on Main Street, Conway village, agreeable to a petition signed by P. J. Littlefield and others.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars for the support of Memorial Hospital, North Conway, New Hampshire, agreeable to a petition signed by Ralph L. Crockett and others.

Art. 24. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent

To the School Board and the Citizens of Conway:

Because of resignations at the end of the school year last June, three new teachers were appointed to our present staff. In the high school Mr. Karl Seidenstuecker, a graduate of Dartmouth College, was appointed teacher of history and assistant coach, and Miss Hugena Dunbar, a graduate of Simmons College, was appointed to the Commerce position. The vacancy in the Shirley school at East Conway was filled by the election of Miss Ruth Banfill, a graduate of the elementary course at Keene Normal school.

During the summer the Redstone school was painted and considerable inside painting done at the high school. These were the major items in the repair program.

The increase in the school population continues. The registration in December showed an increase of about twenty-five over last year and since these statistical tables were compiled, we have had a number of admissions. The average registration exceeds that of ten years ago by about one hundred-fifty.

The North Conway school, the Redstone school, the Grammar school at Conway Center, and the Shirley School are filled to capacity. The situation at the Conway Grammar school has been relieved by the use of the Primary building, so-called, but this building is unfit for school occupancy and will not be used after this year when the seventh and eighth grades of the grammar school will be housed in the high school addition.

The situation at North Conway is the most serious. Here we expect over 200 pupils next year and fifty or more pupils in the two upper rooms as now organized. Another teacher is needed in this school and some plan can be worked out to relieve the overcrowding.

Additional and adequate school facilities will be afforded at the high school next year. The high school addition provides for a shop for manual arts, a cooking and sewing room for household arts, a cafeteria, a science laboratory, a commerce unit for bookkeeping and typewriting, a combination auditorium and gymnasium, new class rooms and accommodations for the seventh and eighth grades of the grammar school.

In the planning of the building we have had the services of a well-known firm of architects who have had wide experience in school construction. The building committee is spending a great deal of time and effort on the project. Every detail of planning is studied with experts and decisions on design and equipment are made solely on the basis of educational utility. The result should be a modern school plant.

It is not our purpose to incorporate any part of the grammar school with the high school. These grades will have their own teacher or teachers and the same course of instruction which they now have. The socalled junior high school organization is not adapted to the situation in Conway. It is an educational hybrid and is excessively costly in small towns and cities. Whatever contribution the junior high school idea has made to education both as to method and as to content has already been utilized in our grammar school organization with the exception of the manual and household arts. There is ample opportunity for pupils to avail themselves of the opportunities in the household and manual arts during their four years in high school.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER

John H. Fuller, Superintendent:

The total registration in the High School to February 1st, is 223, divided as follows:

- 4 post graduates
- 44 seniors
- 44 juniors
- 61 sophomores
- 70 freshmen

There are 108 boys and 115 girls registered. 16 students have left school, divided as follows: 4 seniors. 2 juniors, 3 sophomores, 7 freshmen; 9 boys and 7 girls in all. Of these, one is married, three have moved out of town, and twelve lacked ambition, courage or ability to do satisfactory school work of the kind offered.

The attendance record to Feb. 3 was 97.2%, an excellent record. There had been a total of 141 tardinesses at that time, the worst record in the history of the school.

At mid-year the following honors were announced, on the basis of college certificate grade, or better: 2 students in six courses, 3 in five courses, 32 in four courses, and 22 in three courses. No listing of honor grades in less than three subjects has been made. During the same period 41 pupils failed in 63 courses. The majority of these failures was due to lack of study both at school and at home. No pupil who fails to be included on the honor list should be excused from home study.

In June, 1938, a class of 30 was graduated: 15 boys and 15 girls. Of these, two boys and two girls are attending colleges or universities, two boys and one girl are attending junior colleges, one girl is at normal school, and three girls are attending nurses' training schools, two boys and two girls are doing post graduate work at the high school level; 15 of the 30 are continuing their education.
