THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danbury, in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Danbury on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to rescind the Australian ballot for Town Meetings as voted for in the 1936 Town meeting.
4. To see if the town will vote to adopt a Primary type ballot, wherein any legal voter may file for any elective office of the town, with the town clerk, six or more days before said Town Meeting.
5. To bring in your votes for a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the George Gamble Library.
9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise on the Trunk Line Construction Bond.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries.

13. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid money of \$2,680.53 and raise \$454.50 for the same.

14. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid Construction money of \$1,000 and raise \$454.50, the same to be expended on the North Road, so called.

15. To see if the town will vote to appropriate money for a play ground for the children of Danbury.

16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of one or more snow plows to be attached to trucks.

17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a flag pole to be erected in the town square.

18. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Highway from the Robert Ford place to the junction of Dean Road, so called.

19. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Pond Hill Road, from the residence of Arthur Ford to the residence of Francis Sheldon.

20. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Highway from the junction of the road near the western school house to the Wilmot line.

21. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Highway from a junction of roads near Lawrence Dickey's to the Hill line on the Lynch road, so called.

22. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Highway from the junction of the roads near Scott Ford's mill to a junction of roads on the Dean Road, so called.

23. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Highway from the Clark corner near Lawrence Huntoon's residence easterly to a former discontinued road leading to the Chase place, so called.

24. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

Inspection in Danbury showed the following defects:

96 pupils were examined.

20 pupils were 10% underweight.

8 pupils showed defective vision.

2 pupils showed a slight degree of anæmia.

5 pupils had enlarged or diseased tonsils.

20 pupils were in need of dental care.

Three children from Elmwood school, girl from Center school taken to Dr. Duplease's office in Franklin for eye examination and fitted with glasses.

Boy from Center school taken to Hanover Eye Clinic for examination.

Class room inspection was held at different intervals for symptoms of communicable diseases.

Children were weighed and measured twice during year.

65 visits were made in schools.

25 visits were made in homes.

I wish to express my appreciation to members of the School Board, Red Cross, and to thank the parents and teachers for their daily cooperation in making possible the health program.
