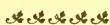

BOARD OF EDUCATION.



The school board, during the past year, have been very fortunate in securing for the several schools, first class teachers, with long experience as such, who have put in their whole time, and manifested full interest for the advancement of the education of the scholars in their charge, and we do not hesitate to say that there has been as much advancement in the education of the pupils in all of the different branches taught, as in any year within our remembrance.

The coming year we intend to secure the best teachers there are to be had, and we sincerely desire that we may have the co-operation of parents, guardians, and persons having the care or custody of scholars, in making each and every school a perfect success; manifesting an interest by sending their scholars, and seeing to it that they attend school all the time while it is in session.

We desire and kindly invite every parent, guardian and person having the care of scholars, to visit the schools in their district twice at least during each term, which will greatly encourage the scholars, and, by so doing, the parents can see for themselves the way and manner the teachers are conducting the schools.
