

Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of
Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, in said Town,
on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in
the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one selectman for three years
and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To hear all reports and act thereon.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be required for
the support of poor, building and repairing highways and bridg-
es, fire department, Memorial Day, street lights and all other
Town charges.

4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen
to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate
the sum of \$2,052.75 for State aid construction, upon condition
that the State allot the same amount of money, to be expend-
ed on "The Turnpike" so called, beginning where the work end-
ed last year, or will accept State aid for construction of Class
V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose
the sum of \$883.47, upon condition that the State allot the
sum of \$3,533.88, or act in any way relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to pay the firemen and
engineers at the same rate as last year, or act in any way re-
lating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen
to contract for the installation of a street light on Oak Street
near the residence of Charles H. Hill, or act in any way relating
thereto, as petitioned for by Arthur Duval and others.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate
the sum of \$800.00 to gravel and tar Oak Street, leading from
Main Street to K. K. Road, or act in any way relating thereto,
as petitioned for by Wilfred J. Varville and others.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate
the sum of \$675.00 to buy a front end pump and booster-tank
for the Chevrolet fire truck, or act in any way relating there-
to, as petitioned for by William T. Leighton and others.

10. To see if the Town will appoint a zoning commission
to consist of five members, to recommend boundaries for zon-
ing districts in said town and to recommend approximate reg-
ulations therefor, in accordance with the provision of Chapter
42, of the Public Laws.

11. To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of monev
for the expenses of the zoning commission if the Town votes to
appoint such commission under the preceding article.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for the purpose of advertising the resources and natural advantages of the town, said sum to be expended under the direction of the selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be expended on the fire house at Jaffrey Center as petitioned for by Charles E. Chamberlain and others, or act in any way relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$215.00 for the purchase of an Inhalator machine to be used for the rescue of victims of suspended or feeble respiration, as petitioned for by John Evans and others.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to gravel and tar the road leading from the Squantum Road to Contoocook Lake to the Rindge line, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by John Evans and others.

16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be expended for a sewer system in K. K. Village, or act in any way relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

Voted that the matter of a sewer on Charlonne St. be referred to the Selectmen with power to investigate and report at the next annual Town Meeting, or if necessary to an adjournment of this meeting.

Voted that the town close by gates and bars the road leading from the corner near the residence of Harold C. Royce and ending at the old Baker place.

Moved that the Town raise the salary of the Municipal Court Justice. The motion was lost.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Jaffrey:

I submit herewith my seventeenth annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the twenty-sixth in the series under union supervision. With this report I also include the report of Headmaster Beal of Conant High School, and the report of Mrs. Helen L. Towne, School Nurse.

The rearrangement of the supervisory unions of New Hampshire which dissolved ten unions in the state in 1933 and 1934, transferred Troy and Fitzwilliam from the former Jaffrey union to the Marlborough union. The Peterborough union was changed by the transfer of three towns to other unions, and the school districts of Dublin, Hancock and Peterborough were united with Jaffrey, Rindge and Sharon, forming the new Peterborough-Jaffrey supervisory union with the central office located in Peterborough.

As thirty-nine of the fifty teachers in the present union are located in Peterborough and Jaffrey, the larger part of the supervisory duties are devoted to these two towns.

Th only changes in the teaching force were caused by the resignations of Homer J. Forcier of the high school faculty and Miss Frances E. Jackson, teacher of grades 3-4 and 5 in the primary school.

Mr. Forcier was succeeded by Miss Elizabeth F. McCoy, and Miss Jackson by Miss Olive M. Lynch.

The total school enrollment for the school year 1933-34 was 579, and for the first twelve weeks of the present school year it was 574. All the single grades in the elementary school have enrolled at least forty pupils and grade eight with fifty-six pupils was divided into two sections.

Mrs. Whitcomb's work as supervisor of music has been carried on as last year, by coming to our schools only once in two weeks. While this arrangement is far better than having no music supervision, it is to be hoped that as soon as possible Jaffrey will be able to give the supervisor at least one day each week in our schools.

At the opening of the present school year arrangements were made for the employment of a resident school nurse. Mrs. Helen L. Towne was secured for this position, and her work has been carried on in a most efficient manner. Her printed report will be of special interest to parents.

The distribution of milk to underweight pupils, which was carried on last year, was resumed in November.

Classes in Adult Education, carried on as a Federal Emergency Education Project, were started in January. A large number desired to enroll in the courses offered in commerce, but the State Department of Education had no available teachers for this course. Classes were organized in English and Mathematics with Mr. John E. Bastille of Peterborough as teacher, and are meeting three evenings each week. Thirty-six adults have been enrolled and the interest in the work has been sustained.

In accordance with the vote of the town in 1929, that when the so-called Amos Fortune Fund shall have reached the amount of one thousand dollars, the annual income of said fund shall be awarded for prizes to pupils of the seventh and eighth grades and high school, for annual contests in public speaking, and also to establish and maintain a series of prize spelling matches for pupils of the lower grades upon such conditions as the school board may prescribe, we are this year starting the contests authorized.

It is important that the boys and girls of Jaffrey should know more about our town's first benefactor, Amos Fortune.

At a time when there is an agitation for the retirement of all persons over sixty years of age, it is interesting to study the life of one of the sturdy pioneers of our town, who was able to purchase his freedom from slavery when he was sixty years old, and who came to this town at the age of nearly seventy, and for more than twenty years was a leading citizen of Jaffrey.

When we recall that Amos Fortune died more than sixty years before slavery was abolished in the United States, we realize the great obstacles that he had to overcome, and his deep interest in the development of Jaffrey deserves a proper memorial to his life and character.

The most difficult problem in the Jaffrey schools at the present time is in the intermediate and junior high grades. With an enrollment of fifty-six in the eighth grade, fifty-two in the seventh, and forty-nine in the sixth grade it can be readily understood that the problem of dealing with the unadjusted pupil is an important one, and with such large grades it is difficult for the teachers to give these pupils all the individual attention that their cases deserve.

For a long time it has been recognized throughout the country that the problem of dealing with boys and girls in the junior high grades is sufficiently different from that of dealing with the lower elementary grades to justify a different type of organization. In the lower grades the purpose of education is very much the same for all children, and variations in the school's procedure with different groups of children arise largely because of variation in ability or individual handicaps of some sort.

With these older children new problems arise. They are approaching a time when they must make important decisions with regard to their future educational or vocational interests. They must be helped in making these important decisions.

We are attempting to strengthen the guidance program in these grades by individual and group conferences, and our teachers are making a careful study of the problem cases.

Achievement and intelligence tests are being used, but are not accepted as an exact measurement for guidance in teaching. The personal factor must be considered as well as the results of standard tests.

We have no desire to make supervisory methods burdensome because of the utilization of too much time of the pupils from their regular work for the measurement of results by mechanical educational devices.

The subject of school appropriations is one of vital interest to all tax payers. It is the duty of school officials to see that every dollar of school money is wisely expended. The years of financial stringency have necessarily affected our schools, although the situation in New Hampshire has been much less serious than in many sections of the country.

A recent survey of relief conditions throughout the United

States shows that New Hampshire and Vermont, with from six to eight per cent on the relief rolls, are the two states in the Union least affected. Many states have from fifteen to twenty-five per cent, and one state has thirty-four per cent.

No one appreciates the tax burden better than our school officials, and our teachers and supervisors have cheerfully borne their share of the necessary reduction in school appropriations.

During the past year, however, rapidly increasing costs of school supplies, and the general increased cost of living, makes it imperative to call for an appropriation sufficiently large to carry on the work without depriving the children of our community of their educational opportunities.

It is our aim to maintain the high standards our schools have already attained, and to carry on the work in accordance with the needs of an enlightened and progressive community.

In conclusion I desire to thank the school board, teachers, pupils, and all citizens whose co-operation and support is so necessary for the success of our schools.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF HIGH SCHOOL

To Lewis S. Record, Superintendent of Schools, E. Jaffrey, N. H.

The following is my fifth annual report as Headmaster of Conant High School:

Teaching Staff

There was no change in the number of teachers this year; five teachers did full time work in the High School and one teacher worked part time in the Junior High. Miss Elizabeth McCoy took over the work in the Social Sciences in the place of Mr. Homer Forcier.

Enrollment and Attendance

One hundred and twenty-four pupils registered in September. Of this number eight have left school, and one new boy has come to us from Lebanon, N. H. Thus on February 15 we had one hundred and seventeen pupils, forty-three boys and seventy-four girls, distributed by grades as follows:

The average attendance for the first twenty weeks has been 116.9 and the average membership 120. This is a per cent of attendance of 97.43 as compared with 97.76 for last year. The following pupils have had a perfect attendance record for the first twenty weeks of the current year. In this connection I want to explain that pupils who are late for any reason whatsoever are marked late in my School Register, but that tardinesses, which occur through no fault of the pupil, do not appear on the report cards.

Tuition Pupils

We have six tuition pupils attending Conant High this year. All are from Rindge, N. H., and include two seniors and four sophomores.

Extra-Curricula Activities

1. MUSIC. Mrs. Mildred Whitcomb of Keene, N. H. has the supervision of the High School music again this year. She has organized the chorus and Glee Clubs and is working with a small orchestral group. Mr. Winfield Farr of Keene has been working up interest in grade and High School pupils in a school orchestra. A joint musicale with Troy High School is planned for the spring.

2. SCHOLARSHIP At graduation last June the following awards were made: For highest honors in English, Elizabeth Flannagan; in the Literary Contest made possible by the offer of Miss Alice Lehtinen, first prize was won by Christine Buckwold, and second prize was won by Hubert O'Neil; as the best all-round girl, Kathleen Cournoyer; as the best all-round boy, Hubert O'Neil. The Parent-Teacher Association scholarship of \$100.00 was awarded to Edward Shields, and the first de Barbey Scholarship of the same amount was made to Aina Hyrk. The seniors who took part in the Scholarship Day at Keene Normal School last May made a creditable showing, and the reports from the State Department last August showed that these Seniors made a very fine record in the three state tests taken during the school year.

3. WASHINGTON, D. C. TRIP. Fifteen seniors with Miss Cournoyer and Mr. Beal made the Washington trip in the April vacation. An innovation on this trip was the bus accommodation from New York. This enabled the group to visit Gettysburg Battlefield and Valley Forge. The same route has been selected by this year's class, twenty-five of whom are planning to go this spring. The cost is forty dollars half of which will be met by the class and half by the individual.

4. ATHLETICS. Lack of funds and also any teacher to assist in the program has kept our athletic activities and schedules curtailed. It will be necessary to have someone to help with the seventh and eighth grades in this capacity in the future, and also to find ways and means to finance our athletics better. Both the girls' and boys' teams have done better than usual this fall in the basketball League, winning a good proportion of their games.

5. DRAMATICS. Early in December the Senior Class gave the play "Girl Shy" to a good sized audience and realized seventy dollars toward their Washington trip fund. In February the Junior Class gave their play "Philip for Short"

and cleared around sixty dollars. Both of these productions were under the direction of Miss Margaret Cournoyer.

6. MISCELLANEOUS. **School Night** under the auspices of the Jaffrey Parent-Teacher Association brought out nearly one hundred and fifty parents and friends to visit school classes. This year is the 300th anniversary of the founding of the first high school in America. A new Office safe of the cabinet style has been purchased this year. This enables us to keep all records together in a fire proof protection. Our new Visible Records Book contains the individual records of each pupil in grades 7-12. It is being planned to use the income from the Amos Fortune Fund for a Prize Speaking Contest this spring for High School pupils. The senior class held a Valentine Supper which brought pupils and parents together on various committees, and which proved very successful socially and financially.

CONCLUSION. The Headmaster of the High School has the administration of the whole building, grades 5-12, in his charge. As I have studied the situation in the grades this year, I am convinced that we need a man teacher in the seventh or eighth grades. If he could have a course in shop work or agriculture so much the better! What he teaches is not so important. What is needed is his contact with boys, his aid in their disciplining, and his help through organizing their athletics in showing them how to keep their bodies and minds clean. In this connection, and for the good of all pupils, we need some shower baths installed. These would help materially in the conditioning of all who go out for sports.

We have continued our Testing program this year carrying it into the lower grades. I think these tests are going to be more and more helpful in diagnosing individual cases and helping to place pupils in the classes and groups where they are best adapted.

Finally, I want to thank the teachers and you, Mr. Record, for your cooperation in meeting our school problems this year.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE, JAFFREY SCHOOLS

To Lewis S. Record, Superintendent of Schools:

The following is my first report—from October 1, 1934 to January, 1935.

Pupils of the High School, as well as those of the lower grades, have been examined.

When this condition was brought to the attention of the parents, many pupils were able to obtain glasses. Nine needy and worthy pupils were cared for, and were taken or sent to Dr. Eaves who fitted them to glasses.

Defective hearing cases 4

Pediculosis—Several cases were found and attended to.

On examining the teeth, I found 492 pupils who needed dental care. Many were able to attend to this defect. Through an arrangement made with Miss Elizabeth Murphy (State Health Supervisor) and Dr. Wilkins, a Dental Clinic was held during the month of December. Special care was given to 43 pupils through Federal Aid Funds under the Child Recovery Program. The work consisted of cleaning, filling and extracting.

Clothing was distributed to several needy pupils.

During the fall term, 3 pupils were taken violently ill in school with symptoms of acute appendicitis. They were taken home and parents advised to consult a physician, which they did. The children were sent to the hospital for emergency operations.

An outbreak of scarlet fever and mumps occurred during the early winter months, with five scarlet fever cases and four cases of mumps.

Milk has been distributed in the schools this winter and many of the children took advantage of this opportunity. This is especially beneficial to those children who are frail and underweight.

I found several children who had not been vaccinated and these cases have been attended to.

All pupils have been thoroughly examined, defects reported, and follow-up work carried on.

The East Jaffrey Woman's Club donated \$15.00 toward an operation for a pupil who needed it very much. The operation was for the removal of tonsils and adenoids.

The Red Cross donated funds for an examination for eye defects.

The Recorder Fund gave \$8.00 for glasses for a worthy pupil.

Recently, the Ladies' Aid Society of the Universalist church donated \$50.00 toward the work for glasses for needy pupils. Several children have been given glasses with the aid of this donation.

In conclusion I want to thank the School Board, Teachers, Parents, Doctors and Dentists, Health Officer, Woman's Club, Red Cross Society, the Ladies' Aid Society of the Universalist Church, Recorder Fund committee and all interested citizens for their valuable support and cooperation which has been a great help to me in making this work possible.
