REPORT OF SELECTMEN

1976 proved to be a most eventful year. Due to unforeseen circumstances the reappraisal remains unfinished.

August saw the Planning Phase of the Route 9 relocation come to a close. As a result of the Highway Department and your Selectmen's choice of Corridor C for relocation, strong citizen action forced a reconsideration of that choice. Many trips to Concord lay ahead as the heat of the summer extended long into the winter snows. The result is a compromise route which your Selectmen feel is a very agreeable solution that most townspeople can accept.

Another heated issue remains unresolved--that of subdivision regulations. Discontent with strict state statutes as they pertain to subdivision regulations, and misunderstanding about how these regulations affect our private lives are problems which need studying in depth. Hopefully the issue of planning will be put before us next March and we will be able to vote on the regulations which will govern us. Home rule is the seed on which our country is founded. Your Selectmen strongly favor planning, but we too are not ready to abdicate our right to vote on issues which directly affect our town.

We look forward to a busy but fruitful year ahead.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

NELSON TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, at 7:00 of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles:

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,710.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1977.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Nelson.
6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to receive monies from the State under the Highway Grant, these monies to be use to supplement summer and winter road maintenance.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,568.00 for the support of the Town Library.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day; the sum of \$175.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Memorial Day.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the care of the Town Common.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for the maintenance of the Cemetery.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.00 as its fair share of the operat-

ing expenses of the Cheshire Hospital.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$180.00 as its fair share of the operating expenses of the North Cheshire Home Health Services.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$180.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family Mental Health Services.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$299.20 as the Town's share for the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$205.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Board of Adjustment and the administration of the Nelson Land Use Plan.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Conservation Commission.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to defray the cost for the printing and distribution of the Subdivision Rules and Regulations to all taxpayers of the Town.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Planning Board.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PROTECTION

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for rubbish removal.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to fight forest fires.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to pay for damages done by dogs.

26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, March 15, 1977 to March 15, 1978, it being understood that townspeople will still be

charged for individual calls.

27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for necessary expenses of the Nelson Rescue Squad.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to be matched by a Federal grant of \$951.00 for the purchase of a portable radio, this equipment to be used by the Nelson Police Department for operation away from police vehicles with fixed radio equipment. If approved, the portable radio would also be available for use by the Nelson Rescue Squad.

29. To see if the Town will vote to join the Cheshire County Emergency Medical Services Board and charge the Selectmen with the appointment of the Town delegate to said Board. This board receives its funding through Federal and/or State grants, educational courses, and sale of course material, and does not charge its member towns or services with dues or any other fees. (By petition.)

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,000.00 for the maintenance of the roads and bridges.

31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to crush gravel.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for General Highway expenses--gas, repairs, and supplies.

33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$492.55 as its share of the TRA construction costs, the State's share being \$3,283.67.

34. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by vote of the Town for purchase of road equipment and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee.

35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to pave the West Shore Road around Granite Lake. (By petition.)

ARTICLES OF A SPECIAL NATURE

36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the repair and repainting of the Town Hall.

37. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw the funds from the Dump Capital Reserve Fund and to transfer those funds to either the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund or the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, or re-

turn them to the General Fund.

38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Town Hall and/or the Old Schoolhouse, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the Fund except by vote of the Town.

39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 for the Reassessment of the Town.

40. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 for a property map of the Town, the next step toward meeting the 1980 State deadline for a tax map of each town.

41. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action thereto.

42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to help make up a deficit in our budget.

43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$500.00 to make the small 2nd-floor room of the Old Schoolhouse suitable for a Selectmen's office.

44. To see if the Town will vote to elect the members (5) of the Planning Board.

45. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Committee on the Arts, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition.)

46. To see if the Town will vote to elect Town Officers by official ballot.

47. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$25,098.97 for the restoration of the Old Brick Schoolhouse. (The entire amount will come from the Nelson Schoolhouse Fund, a privately funded account.)

48. To transact any other business or discuss other Warrant proposals as they may legally be brought before the meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

It was another busy year at the Olivia Rodham Memorial Library.

The winter and spring sessions of Adventure Time attracted an average of eight youngsters. Because we seemed to run into competition with so many other Monday afternoon activities for the young people, we decided not to start Adventure Time in the fall. Perhaps we will pick it up again at a future time.

Many thanks to Sydney Plant and Beatrice Warner for carrying books to the Munsonville Preschool, and to Dorothy French, Celia Wiechert, and Joan Warner for helping the Librarian carry books to the Munsonville Elementary School.

During the spring and fall terms at Keene State College, the Librarian completed two Library Technique courses. One entitled Book Selection for Adults and Young Adults, and the other, Services for Adults and Young Adults.

The Librarian is serving another year as Vice Chairperson of the Southwest District Advisory Council and Chairperson of the Planning Board. She attended two District Advisory Council meetings held in Hanover and Peterborough; three Planning Board meetings; two meetings of the District Advisory Council Chairmen, Vice Chairmen and Past Chairmen, held in Concord; four Service Center meetings in Peterborough; the spring New Hampshire Library Conference in Bedford; and the fall New Hampshire Library Conference in New London; a Censorship Workshop in Walpole; and a Vertical File Workshop in Peterborough; the Annual Friends of the Library Meeting in Salem; and two Bookmeetings in Keene. Three Trustee Meetings were held during the year at the Library.

Once again our Library received a Certificate of Merit for meeting state requirements in 1975.

Twenty-one young people took part in the summer reading program entitled, "Nelson Summer Olympics." Our thanks to Nancy Stretch for her help in putting the "Olympics" together. A party was held for all of those who took part, with a film and the awarding of the medals. Ice cream was served to the eighteen in attendance.

The Librarian showed the film, "Marlborough America," during Old Home Week, in the Town Hall. We are also still showing excellent films the second Wednesday of each month in the Library at 7:30 p.m. The attendance has improved and everyone seems to enjoy the evening out--and the "yummy" refreshments.

The Bookmobile made four visits and left 2,986 books during the year. Thanks to all of those who helped pick out the books and stayed to help shelve them after.

Sixteen people took part in a Ski Touring program held at the Library in November. A lively discussion fol-

lowed a film on cross-country skiing. My thanks to Maury Collins who led the discussion period.

Sixty-three books were obtained on Interlibrary loan.

Books were taken to two shut-ins during the year. Please let me know if this service can be given to anyone else in town.

The Librarian wishes to thank Vera Balch who has been most helpful and has spent many long hours on the inventory and the card catalog.

Thanks also to the Frenches who are always willing to lend a hand, and for the new screen door which made the Library more comfortable during the summer.

Four hundred forty books were catalogued during the year, one hundred seventy-six last year.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY BOARD

1976

Since the report and audit of the accounts and records of the Town of Nelson by the New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration as of January 8, 1976, certain changes have been made affecting several town departments including that of the Cemetery Board.

Prior to this report the Cemetery Board handled all cemetery funds including all receipts and expenses. But in 1976 all cemetery funds were paid to, and all cemetery transactions passed through, the hands of the Selectmen in accordance with the State report and recommendations. Consequently the Cemetery Board has no basis for a detailed financial report except to report money received from the sale of lots and from cemetery trust funds. Further cemetery financial details, therefore, must be found in the Selectmen's report.

REPORT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The year 1976 proved to be a most disheartening one for this department

Nelson, as did all of her neighboring communities, suffered the greatest number of crimes against homes and property that can be remembered. These in spite of increased patrols by the members of this department, State Police, Selectmen, and interested citizens. It seems inconceivable that with all these observant people that nothing was seen and no clues were developed to indicate the person or persons responsible. Checking with other law enforcement agencies finds the same situation existing as in Nelson and the sad part is that when persons are apprehended and taken to court they are released with little or no punishment.

Your Constable and this officer were privileged to attend a series of lectures on various phases of law enforcement sponsored by Cheshire County Peace Officers Association at Keene State College at which specialists from the F.B.I., State and local police departments and attorneys addressed the group. The purpose of these seminars was to enable part-time police officers to do a better more efficient job.

It is also felt that with the recent change in the office of the Sheriff much more cooperation and help to local departments will be available and willingly given.

As always our work would be much more difficult were it not for the willing and welcome help and cooperation of the other law enforcement agencies--Mutual Aid, for their help in communications, State Police, for their willingness to respond to requests for assistance in accident or robbery investigations, and to our neighboring departments who are always willing to be of help.

In closing may we again request you people, residents and non residents to be especially alert to any unusual activity you might observe, in the case of a strange motor vehicle the registration noted, location, etc., reported to this department is often a great help in checking the presence of unauthorized persons.

It seems too bad that in Nelson we have to suggest that when leaving your home for even a short time you lock your doors. We also suggest that in your absence at night time several lights to be left burning--it is an inexpensive way to give a possible intruder second thoughts about attempting a break-in.

REPORT OF NELSON FIRE DEPARTMENT RESCUE SQUAD

Since 1967, improvement in Emergency Health Care has seen the development of new approaches to pre-hospital care and transportation. A part of this development has been the training and implementation of non-physician (ambulance and/or rescue) personnel to provide advanced life support service in an emergency setting which is remote from a hospital or patient-care facility.

In July of 1976, Nelson became part of this developing field with its own Rescue Squad. It was small, but it was a start. We now have five qualified members as well as the basic equipment needed to render emergency care and first aid in the time of an emergency. All members are qualified Fire Department members as well as Emergency Medical Technicians. Some of our members have also qualified as American Red Cross Advanced First Aid and Emergency Care instructors and as C.P.R. instructors.

All these qualifications were obtained by attending schools--3 month E.M.T. courses, 2 month Advanced First Aid instructors courses, C.P.R. instructors courses and Fire Schools (spring and fall). All this training is on a continual basis, with renewal and recertification classes every 2 or 3 years. Each of our members gives many hours of their time to volunteer for these courses for the benefit of Nelson and its people.

As was the case last year, all monies were obtained through gifts and fund-raising activities with no expense to the town.

This year we have responded to seven official rescue calls, as well as to all fire calls.

Hopefully we will be starting an Advanced First Aid and Emergency Care course this winter, now that we have qualified instructors. If you are 18 years or older and are interested, please contact us.

At the present time the Nelson Rescue Squad has been approved by the State Civil Defense Agency to obtain a small four-wheel drive vehicle for rescue purposes, if and when one becomes available. There is a long waiting list. Before we can obtain any further equipment such as heavy rescue tools for vehicle accidents, ropes, lights, etc., we need a truck to carry them in.

Hopefully, by next year's report we can add to this growing story by saying we have this vehicle.

Before finishing this report, I'd like to express the heartfelt thanks we all have for those who have helped us with their time and money through 1976. THANK YOU.

NELSON SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING MINUTES

MARCH 5, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by the moderator, Ethan Tolman at the Nelson Town Hall. The checklist was handed over to the clerk, Dorothy Zeller and signed by the clerk and the supervisors.

ARTICLE 1. Polls were opened by the moderator from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. for the election of school district officers.

The moderator reconvened the meeting at 8:00 p.m. and introduced Mr. Donald Bennett, chairman of the school board; Mr. H. Charles Larracey, Assistant Superintendent; Mr. Ralph Caye, Business Manager. He moved that they be allowed to speak during the meeting. Motion seconded and prevailed.

ARTICLE 2. Mr. Bernie Pierce moved that the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen be accepted and placed on file. The vote was affirmative.

ARTICLE 3. Rose Tolman moved that the District vote to authorize the school board to make application for, and to accept and use in the name of the district such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for the educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire or any department or Agency thereof, or any federal, state, or private agency.

ARTICLE 4. Donald Bennett moved that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 to send the fifth grade (10 pupils plus one adult) to Otter Lake Conservation School (Camp Union). Discussion ensued. The moderator called for a standing vote--Yes 29; No 11. Motion prevailed.

ARTICLE 5. Mr. Bernie Pierce moved that we pass over the article. Motion seconded. After some discussion, Mr. Pierce withdrew this motion and made an amendment that the article be accepted as read, except to insert "to allow voluntary recitation of the Lord's Prayer and other Prayers." Mr. Pierce withdrew his amendment, however, when he understood the legality of the article, Mr. Bennett informed the meeting that if we struck the words "Lord's Prayer" from the article it would not be in accordance with the state statute. The moderator called for a voice vote. Reconsideration of the vote was called for from the floor. This motion was seconded. A standing vote was called for by the moderator to vote on the reconsideration--Yes 27; No 10.

Russ Thomas' amendment was read by the clerk: "that the District will authorize the school board to permit the voluntary recitation of a Prayer in the elementary school of the District." The moderator called for a standing vote --Yes 10; No 27.

A motion was made that we accept the article as read, that the district authorize the school board to permit the voluntary recitation of the Lord's Prayer in the elementary school of the District in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated 194:25-a of the State of New Hampshire. Seconded. Jack Zeller requested a written ballot--Yes 39; No. 10. Motion prevailed.

ARTICLE 6. Charles Howard moved that we pass over the article. Motion seconded. The question was raised as to whether the article was legal since no specific money amount was included in the article. The moderator and supervisory union administrators concurred that their legal advices declared it was legal. The moderator called for a vote on whether to pass over the article as read. A voice vote was taken. The ayes prevailed. The article was passed over.

ARTICLE 7. Charles Howard moved that the District raise and appropriate \$136,888 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District. Motion seconded.

There was much discussion on budget specifics. Donald Bennett pointed out to the meeting that if we cut the budget we will either incur a deficit or have to lose a teacher. Terry Upton said she felt it was deplorable that we have to cut the budget of our local school when the main increases came from an increase in tuition for students sent to Keene. Jack Zeller asked why the school board continued to raise increased sums of money when the voters last year requested a cut in expenditures. Terry Upton said she felt that someone should be at the meeting to tell the town how the tuition to Keene is spent. Donald Bennett said that supervisory administrators were not answerable for this, but the Keene school board was. John Bunce said he thought Nelson citizens should attend Keene School District meetings to try to cut the budget. He also said that he felt we should not cut teachers salaries. Charles Howard pointed out that Nelson citizens would not be allowed to speak at Keene District meetings.

Bernie Pierce asked for a breakdown of the budget for teachers' salaries: Head Teacher, \$8,582; Lower Teacher, \$7,822; Associate Teacher, \$5,900; Clerical Aide, \$972; Music Teacher, \$642; Art Teacher, \$325.

Mr. Howard made an amendment that we accept the article as read, except to change the amount of money to be raised and appropriated to \$134,888. A motion was made that we accept the amendment. The motion was seconded. Vote on the amendment--33 in favor, 15 opposed.

The moderator then called for a vote on whether to accept the article as amended. A written ballot was requested by Jack Zeller. The vote was: Yes 35; No 11.

The article was passed, as amended, that the District raise and appropriate \$134,888 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

ARTICLE 8. John Bunce suggested that we select a committee of three to investigate the hot lunch program and to work with Stoddard and other towns on this question. Richard Stewart made an amendment: that we appoint a committee of three to investigate the hot lunch program and that the committee should report to the school board by the end of the school year. The moderator called for a voice vote on the amendment. The aye's prevailed and the amendment prevailed. The moderator called for a vote as to whether we should nominate members to the Hot Lunch Committee at this meeting. A voice vote was taken. The aye's prevailed and the following members were nominated: Ronald McCormick, John Bunce, Donald Bennett. All three accepted the nomination. Jack Zeller was also nominated, but declined.

ARTICLE 9. Charles Howard moved that the District recognize with deep appreciation the services of Mr. Donald Bennett, member of the Nelson School Board since 1970. The motion was seconded and a round of hearty applause was given.

It was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The vote was affirmative.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

The school boards of Supervisory Union 29 have completed a comprehensive analysis of the services and functions to be delivered by the administrative personnel in Supervisory Union 29. Following the resignation of the superintendent of schools and the business manager, it was decided to conduct this study.

The reorganization that resulted from this study insures that all functions of the supervisory union are accountable to appropriate school administrators.

Under this reorganization the Superintendent of Schools is responsible for policy development and administrative procedures, school board services, community information, program evaluation and facilities.

An Assistant Superintendent has been designated as responsible for the educational services and programs in the towns. There is also an Assistant Superintendent responsible for the educational services and programs in Keene. It is felt that this type of organization clearly identifies responsibility so that when problems or concerns do arise that it is understood who is to be contacted.

In order to meet federal and state statutes relative to handicapped children, a position of Educational Consultant for Special Services has been established. All children are now guaranteed an equal opportunity to pursue to the very best of their ability, programs and studies which will enable them to improve their quality of life and become a productive member of society.

The position of Manager of Personnel Services has been created. Over 600 people are now employed by Supervisory Union 29. This position will be responsible for the development of personnel policies, negotiations, inservice training, recruitment, contract administration, staff development, teacher certification, fringe benefits, and maintenance of personnel records.

The position of Business Manager has been redefined. This person will be responsible for payrolls, accounting, purchasing, central storage, budget planning, transportation, new building projects, and legal services.

Since the last annual school district meeting the Cheshire Vocational Center was completed and opened in September with an enrollment of 900 students. Approximately 300 of these students are from the school districts of Fall Mountain, Monadnock Regional, Hinsdale, Winchester, and Marlborough. The remainder of the enrollment is from students at Keene High School. We are proud of this facil-

ity and are certain that the Cheshire Vocational Center will provide significant educational opportunities for our students.

Your school board continues to be concerned about legislation as it relates to the school lunch program. Senator Clesson Blaisdell has introduced legislation which provides if a local school district votes to discontinue a meals program in its school then the State Board of Education shall grant a non-expiring waiver to such a school board. Such a waiver will terminate only upon notice by the school board to the state board that the school district has voted to resume such a meals program. Your board will be participating in legislative hearings that will be held on this proposed legislation.

This year the Nelson School Board identified five goals to work toward:

1. Reading and individualized instruction.
2. Pursuit of school lunch issue.
3. Study of facility needs for the Munsonville School.
4. Improve public relations with Nelson School District.
5. Health Education.

The board has adopted a policy for rental and use of school facilities; has moved forward on the school lunch issue, and the board has continued to provide the educational resources and services necessary for the students in the district.
