REPORT OF THE HIGHWAY AGENT

We came out very good on our budget for 1964. The overdraft noted being in part due to the increase of Highways to be maintained and unexpected expenditures on the grader. Although we have not asked for an increase on our maintenance appropriation for the past two years, we have had the following sections of road turned back to us by the State: In 1963 Lower and Upper Main Streets, Old Fremont Road and Epping Street, approximately three miles. The section around the center of Town consists of a number of catch basins that require a great deal more maintenance than ones on outlying streets and roads. In 1964 a section of Route 101 was also turned back to us. This meant extra maintenance of over a mile more road consisting of plowing, salting and patching. I note that this section, being cement, takes a lot more salt than our tarred roads.

The monies spent on the grader was for brakes and transfer case. At this time it is in very good shape but we will need tires before another winter. If we do not have any other unexpected repairs I feel we can budget for them out of our 1965 appropriation. I think the Town is very fortunate to own this piece of equipment.

Our Town Road Aid project last year was the construction of approximately eight-tenths of a mile on the Green Road. The section completed was a twenty foot asphalt mix with two foot shoulders on each side. We have received many compliments on this project from the Selectmen, Taxpayers and Citizens. Another

section of this road is now under construction for the coming year.

The appropriation for Tarring was spent very accurately with the following being done:

Roads Tarred — Upper and Lower Main Street, Epping Street, Francesca Drive, School Street, Gould St., One-Way Street, Depot Street, Old Fremont Rd., Long Hill Road, Sun Hill Drive and Wright Street.

Sections of — Governor's Lake, Prescott Rd., Plains Road, Old Manchester Road, Batchelder Road, Lane Rd., OnWay Lake Road and Schribner Road.

Real bad spots were patched and sealed and in some instances honed with the grader and a road mix used. I think that in the future some of our Tarring monies should be used to improve conditions of some roads that are in poor traveling condition and require more than the regular tarring procedure.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the Selectmen for their co-operation, the Town Treasurer for her continued services, and the men who have worked with this department both summer and winter to keep our roads in the best possible conditions.

RAYMOND POLICE DEPARTMENT

This is the fourth resume' of the Police Department activities that I am privileged to prepare.

The year 1964 was by far the busiest of the past four. There was an increase in almost very duty that it is summoned to preform.

Motor Vehicle accidents and complaints are the most increased phase of our ward, accidents in 1964 increased approximately 40 percent over 1963. It is safe to assume that with the increase in motor vehicles each year this will continue to be a problem.

Property loss due to Breaking and Entering and Larceny was at a minimum again this past year. The low loss rate can only be attributed to the many hours spent on night patrol and the constant checking of subjects at these late hours. A continuance of this policy will keep this loss rate low.

School dances and functions by different organizations and parents continued at about the same pace and will continue to get coverage by this Department.

I feel that through the cooperation of the Selectmen and the Highway Depatrment that a vast improvement was made in the parking situation on Main St. This new arrangement has increased the number of parking spaces and definately lessened the hazards and the conjection that was caused by the old arrangement.

I would like to thank Officer Robert Elliott, Officer Robert Richard and other Special Officers, the Selectmen and the citizens of Raymond for their cooperation and assistance they have provided this Department.

Submitted herewith is the Audit Report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, as requested by the vote of your Town.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

All Departments of the Town Government were audited: Including the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library and Water Department.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Exhibit A-1 contains a Comparative Balance Sheet for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1963 and December 31, 1964. The Exhibits show Assets and Liabilities at the close of each year. The financial condition of Raymond shows a Net Debt of \$40,545.11 at the close of 1964, a decrease of \$2,233.83. Exhibit A-2 reflects the details of the decrease.

Exhibit A-3 shows appropriations as raised by the Town vote, receipts and reimbursement of appropriations, expenditures and balances unexpended or over-expended. The final over-expended balances of appropriations was \$3,733.05.

Exhibit A-4 shows anticipated revenues and amounts actually received by the Town. The final revenue surplus was \$4,332.38, minus appropriation overdrafts of \$3,733.05, gives the Town a budget surplus of \$599.33 for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964.

DEPARTMENTS

Exhibits B-1 through G shows various Town Officers' accounts. Exhibit H shows Long Term Indebtedness and Exhibit I shows Town Officers' Surety Bonds.

All monies were accounted for by reconciling with depository banks.

Verification notices were sent on all delinquent taxes for the 1964 levy.

GENERAL COMMENTS

The Town Officials are to be commended for the manner in which they conducted business during the year. All officers' records were in excellent condition.

The Water Accounts Receivables increased during the year to \$5,925.48, an increase of \$1,143.98 over 1963. These accounts are much too large and many of them are several years old and will be outlawed by State statutes.

My appreciations to the Officials of the Town for the assistance given to our staff during the course of the audit.

- 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.
- 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Hydrant Rental.
- 17. On petition of John Bongiovanni and eleven voters, to see what action the town will take in regard to paving a section of the Green Road, starting at the intersection of Scribner Road running westerly for eighteen hundred feet up the Green Road.
- 18. On petition of Frank G. Case Jr. and ten other voters, to see what action the town will take in regards to tarring the town road section of West Shore

Drive from Lot 3R to Lot R2-16, a distance of eleven hundred feet and to raise and appropriate money for the cost of same.

- 19. On petition of Burgess Chase and eighteen other voters, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$10,000.00 for the purchase of a new motor tank truck for the Fire Department, and to authorize the issue and sale of bonds or notes of the Town therefore, under and pursant to the municipal Finance Act.
- 20. On petition of the Selectmen' Police Department, Fire Department and Ambulance Association, to see if the Town will vote to turn over to the Selectmen the entire amount of money, plus any accumulated interest, in trust for the Police and Ambulance Capital Reserve Fund, to be used for expenses to build an addition on to the Fire House to provide space for the Police Department and Ambulance Association.

- 23. To see what action the town will take in regard to widening and resurfacing a part or all of Harriman Road from Route 101 to Governors Lake entrance, and, to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1963 and June 30, 1964, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$7,699.44 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1964.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1964, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the

Budget Summary (Exhibit D), a revenue surplus of \$661.79, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,305.96, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,967.75.

Summary Statement of Receipts & Expenditures: (Exhibit E-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1964, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, in included in Exhibit E-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1964, is indicated in Exhibit E-2.

Statement of School Lunch Account: (Exhibit F)

A summary of the School Lunch Account is included in Exhibit F.

Student Activities Fund: (Exhibit G)

The Student Activities Fund Accounts were examined and a summarized statement of these accounts is presented in Exhibit G.

Statement of Bonded Indebtedness: (Exhibit H)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1964, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

Statement of School Tax Account: (Exhibit I)

A statement of the School Tax Account with the Town of Raymond is included in Exhibit I. As indicated therein, as of June 30, 1964, the School District had received from the Town the total amount of the 1963-64 School Tax of \$143,025.86.

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of Total Assets over Current Liabilities) decreased from \$3,201.50 to \$2,901.44 during the fiscal year as shown by the following statement:

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

It is a plasure to write this brief report because we like to see progress. Many times progress takes place in education without it being apparent. Physical additions to a school plant are ,however, visible. We bebelieve you will be pleased with and proud of the new wing which will make the Raymond plant very adequate. quite impressive, and well maintained. Not only can one see housing facilities, but also count the increased faculty members. We now have twenty-six full time teachers, with reasonably sized classes for the most part. With a minimum salary last spring of \$4,500, the hiring of new and capable teachers became a bit easier. The heart of a school system is still the individual teacher. Anything which will secure, keep, and improve a good staff is well worth doing and must be our primary concern.

Co-operative Schools: Remarkable strides have been made in the past year or so in creating co-operative schools. I believe the Legislative Interim Commission's report has had much influence. I also believe that within a relatively short time all school districts, except the very large ones, will be part of a co-operative or area school. As you know, studies of this area are actively taking place at this time. What the final study will show, only time can tell. Public meetings are required, and eventually district voting. Give these your active participation; only this way can you become well informed.

Increased Enrollment: There was a considerable increase in enrollment this year. We are living in an area

where it seems to be impossible to predict growth, which we seem sure to have. Our present facilities should be adequate for some time to come.

Legsilative Year: This is again a legislative year, with everyone after their share of the state dollar. There will be many bills concerning education. We should be interested in securing more state support for education to absorb some of the increased costs, if not to slow the increase in the property tax rate It would be better still if enough state aid could be received to stabilize the property tax rate. New Hampshire still is second from the bottom in percentage of state aid for education. Even with the sweepstakes money, it is doubtful if this relative standing will change. Raymond received \$11,216.09 from the sweeptakes, all of which was used to reduce the tax assessement. It is expected that more will be received in 1965-66 but there is no way of knowing. Tax rates may not be set until this amount is actually known.

Raymond has the right to be proud of its schools and the support it has given them. We express our thanks for this support and hope that continued progress may be achieved.

PRINCIPAL REPORT

To the Superintendent and the School Board:

I beg your indulgence that I might digress from the usual format of this report. I would like to discuss some developments that seem readily apparent and some others not so apparent.

Since "Sputnik," there has been a greater ferment taking place in education, especially in the area of the curriculum, than in many previous generations combined.

However, in spite of this, "the person on the other end of the log" continues to be most important single element in the process of education — the process of changing behavior. This is a process complicated by the fact that the teacher must help the individual to identify and maintain him to cope with change.

Each individual must acquire the capacity for self-teaching and self-adaptation; for, each individual must be self-respecting, self-directing and self-supporting. He must learn how to learn, how to attack new problems ,how to discover new facts. He must develop the ability to learn under his own initiative and have a continuing interest in doing so.

The long held idea that the development of the individual takes place according to a pre-determined timetable is obsolete. Development and adjustment can both be better served when parents get behind the child and push. The desires for good education and good mental health are quite compatible providing

we do not expect the impossible. In other words, we cannot let the push become abuse. However, the push we must have. We must work together, teacher and parent. We must recognize that our responsibilities do overlap. Hence, we must strive to complement one another.

If the teacher, complemented by the parent, is the most important element in education, then the curriculum must be the second most important element. Webster defines the curriculum as a course of study, a body of knowledge. However, to provide a body of knowledge today that will serve the needs of any individual a single decade from now is impossible. Therefore, the curriculum must provide for the discovery of facts rather than their memorization. The truth in this statement is borne out in the fact that the first doubling of knowledge took place about 1750, the second in 1900, the third in 1950, and the fourth, ten years later in 1960. Change has been and will continue to be the watchword. Each of the major learning disciplines has been undergoing this change.

With changes in curriculum come charges in methodology and programming. In this country, at present, we are in the process of developing new concepts of time, space and instructional resources; and the most efficient utilization thereof. The following concepts should give some indication of the direction in which we are moving. We are moving from group concerns to greater concern for the individual; from memorization to inquiry; from a listless climate to a zest for learning; from the graded school to the ungraded school; from the self-contained class to the self-contained school. from rigidly scheduled classes to independent learning; from the teacher as telling to teach-

ing as guiding; from a conceentration of time and effort n the classroom to more spent in research, planning and development.

These are challenging times; these are exciting times, in which we live. I hope that you are as excited and enthused about them as I am. I hope and I trust that we may transmit this excitement and enthusiasm to those in our charge.

Our first attempts at this are embodied in the following changes in curriculum and methodology; (1) We have adopted the new mathematics, which develops understandings through discovery, rather than the traditional learning by rote; (2) In science we have adopted an approach that begins in the laboratory, here again we experience the excitement of discovery through experimentation; (3) in foreign languages we are using the auraloral approach which means we begin learning by listening to and speaking the language first; (4) in social studies the approach is geared to making responsible individuals and more effective citizens; (5) in the language arts the approach is toward mastery of skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking.

We are eagerly anticipating completion of our expansion program which will make it possible for us to explore new frontiers of inquiry in our never ending quest to aid the individual cope with the inevitable change.

To Mr. Holt for championships in girls' basket-ball and softball.

To Mr. Brown for another Soccer championship.
To Mr. Combs for a championship Mathematics team.

To Mr. Gould for our picnic tables, our music cabinet and so many other conveniences he has made possible.

To Mr. Carrier for six All-State musicians: Kathleen O'Brien, Mary Colligan, Jean Dickinson, Ann Thompson, Edward Erwin and Charles Chase.

To Mrs. Cross for the fine program she has carried on under trying circumstances of limited space.

To Dr. Abell, Dr. Dionne, Mrs. Lavoie and Mrs. Goodnough for a forward loking program of health services.

To Mrs. Lord, my willing and able administrative assistant.

To the Superintendent and Board for their unselfish devotion to a labor of love.

January 28, 1965

To the Superintendent and the School Board:

May I take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks for the new sink installed in the Health room, as this is one of the most basic needs in any health department.

In September, a new club was formed for those interested in "Health Careers." It is called the "Future Nurses Club," and we have just received our National Charter. The present sixteen members have already made one field trip and have many things planned that will be most helpful and interesting to these students. Mrs. Cynthia Lord, Vice-principal, and I are co-advisors.

We are now using the Sterneedle instead of the patch test for the Tuberculin Testing. This has proven a more satisfactory and accurate method, and will be given to grades 1, 4, 8 and 12 each year.

Space does not allow for the listing of all the many and varied work of the school nurse, but I would like to give a general idea of some of the things accomplished this past year:

STUDY COMMITTEE REPORT

On Saturday May 9, 1964 a Special School District Meeting was held, and a Cooperative Study Committee was appointed by the Moderator. The Committee consisted of John Ornell, Reed Carver, and Thomas G. Abell, M.D.

The study committee was officially organized into the Deerfield-Epping-Raymond Cooperative Planning Board on September 15, 1964 at a meeting in Epping. An open meting was held September 30, 1964 to present to the surrounding towns information about the State Department of Education's experience with the Cooperative Movement. As a result of this meeting considerable new interest in the cooperative effort was shown.

During the next four months considerable activity was carried out in an effort to have other towns join into the study group. This activity was culminated by a meeting held January 27, 1965 at the Raymond Consolidated School. The study board was reorganized to include Candiaas an official member, and Nottingham and Chester as unofficial members. Thomas G. Abell, M.D., of Raymond, was elected chairman of the Study Board, with Mr. Leonard B. Chase, of Candia, being elected co-chairman, and Mr. James L. Leary, of Deerfield, Clerk-Treasurer, Mrs. Mildred Guptill, of Raymond, was appointed secretary.

A study will be carried out over the next few months to gather information concerning the feasibility of forming a cooperative school district. When all the facts and figures have been gathered, they will be presented to the members of each School District involved.
