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WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools in addition to the amount required to be raised by law.
- 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways in addition to the amount required by law.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-five dollars for Memorial day.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the common.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars for the pur-

chase and maintenance of street lamps to be used in and between the villages of Rumney and Rumney Depot.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars to buy a hearse to be used for the benefit of the town's people at the expense of the town, and appoint an agent to buy the same, unless said agent can make arrangements with Mrs. Abby D. Merrill to donate the hearse originally intended for the town.
- 9. To see what amount the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Rumney Public Library in addition to the amount required to be raised by law.
- 10. To see what action the town will take in regard to the bequest for the benefit of the Public Library left by William G. Doe.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint not less than three or more than five men voters of the town as a Board of Trade, and raise fifty dollars to be expended by them in advertising the resources of the town.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to have the inventory blanks distributed at the time of taking the appraisal of property.
- 13. To see what action the town will take in regard to building a new bridge near L. H. Loveland, Jr's. mill.
- 14. To hear the reports of Officers, Agents, and Auditors heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

In submitting our report for the year ending February 15, 1901, we are confident that our schools have not only maintained their usual standard of improvement but they have made a very satisfactory advancement. the school report should be to enlighten and stimulate public sentiment in regard to the public schools. There should be progress from year to year in everything that pertains to the building up of a true system of public education. have endeavored, during the school year just closed, to secure the services of those teachers having the ability and desire to impart the instruction most needed by their pupils. In two or three instances the same teachers were retained during the year, and while all of our teachers gave satisfaction circumstances prevented their return much to our A frequent change of teachers is a disadvantage to the schools in which they have taught.

In nearly all of our schools language has had a large place and has been taught with excellent success. A great deal of written work has been given pupils, so that they are able to present neat and carefully arranged papers, testing their knowledge of English. Great care, too, has been given to punctuation and arrangement of sentences. I believe this is becoming one of the prominent features of school work, and rightly so. I am glad to see any improvement along that line. By so much written work, we find pupils improving in penmanship and we think written exercises on paper greatly aid in this branch, as pen and ink

work brings better results as far as neatness and accuracy are concerned, than the careless slate work. I was very much pleased with the written examinations in the various studies. They gave evidence of thoroughness and neatness, two very essential traits in a successful pupil. To write English quickly and with ease is something not easily or quickly acquired. Training to speak and write should have a definite place in every school, and not be left to a general exercises several times a year.

As in years past we have maintained six schools of thirty weeks each, except where noted in the statistical table. I am in favor of opening our schools in the early part of the month of April, because I believe it much better for pupils to attend school at that time rather than during the month of February. For the past few years our schools have closed just when it was nearly impossible for the pupils to get to school on account of the inclemency of the weather, therefore the last two or three weeks of school are of little value to the pupil. I was unable to visit the schools at the close of the winter term, much to my regret. I am confident that both pupil and teacher have done their best to make the school year a profitable one for all interested in the prosperity and progress of the schools of Rumney.

The roll of honor shows a falling off of perfect attendance, especially for the year. This is in part due to pupils being late to school rather than actual abscences. There are many pupils who have failed to have their names on the roll of honor because they were five or ten minutes late or were of necessity absent one half day. These deserve honorable mention. The attendance of pupils between the ages of six and sixteen has been unusually good.

The board of education are always glad to welcome any suggestions which any one may desire to make to them, and to treat them with due respect. In this way a mutual benefit is obtained.
