REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of the School District of Springfield:

I submit herewith my second report as Superintendent of schools.

I feel that the schools are running smoothly. It is with a great sense of relief that I think of the situation as it exists in the school district.

The teachers are earnest in their work, the school board is alive to the responsibilities it has in making the schools good, and the parents are aware that co-operation is necessary to the successful operation of a school system.

I am glad to know that our State Aid for the coming year has been increased. This increase of some six hundred dollars assures us that we may keep up the standard that has been set.

The attendance and tardy record for the current year up to date is very good indeed, and is only another evidence of the co-operation of the parents that I have mentioned before, which is doing so much towards making the schools effective.

I have given reading tests to all the pupils in grades 4-5-6-7-8. The results are satisfactory. I am making a drive in all my towns to make the reading better and your teachers are cooperating in a very commendable manner.

I hope that the district will be able to improve the boys' toilets at the Center, to do some necessary outside painting to the two buildings, and inside painting of the building at the Center. The lighting of the Maxfield School House should be bettered. It may not be able to do this all in one year, but by doing a little each year the cost will not be too great for any one year.

I should like to acknowledge the gift of the two splendid books presented to the school at the Center by Mr. and Mrs. Fairfax Downey. This is the start of a reading library and will serve as a great source of enjoyment to the pupils.

The people of Springfield need not be ashamed of their schools. The money raised by taxation, and that received from the State is spent wisely by the board. The board is well versed in school finances, and the District is to be congratulated upon the fact that it possesses this ability.

May I thank all concerned for the part they are playing in making the schools of Springfield good.
