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SHAHEEN & HASSAN POPULAR IN STATE; PAPPAS MOST WELL-KNOWN CANDIDATE TO REPLACE SHEA-PORTER

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DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen continues to be the most popular member of the state's congressional delegation, closely followed by her colleague Senator Maggie Hassan. Executive Councilor Chris Pappas is the most well-known candidate among those seeking to replace outgoing Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter.

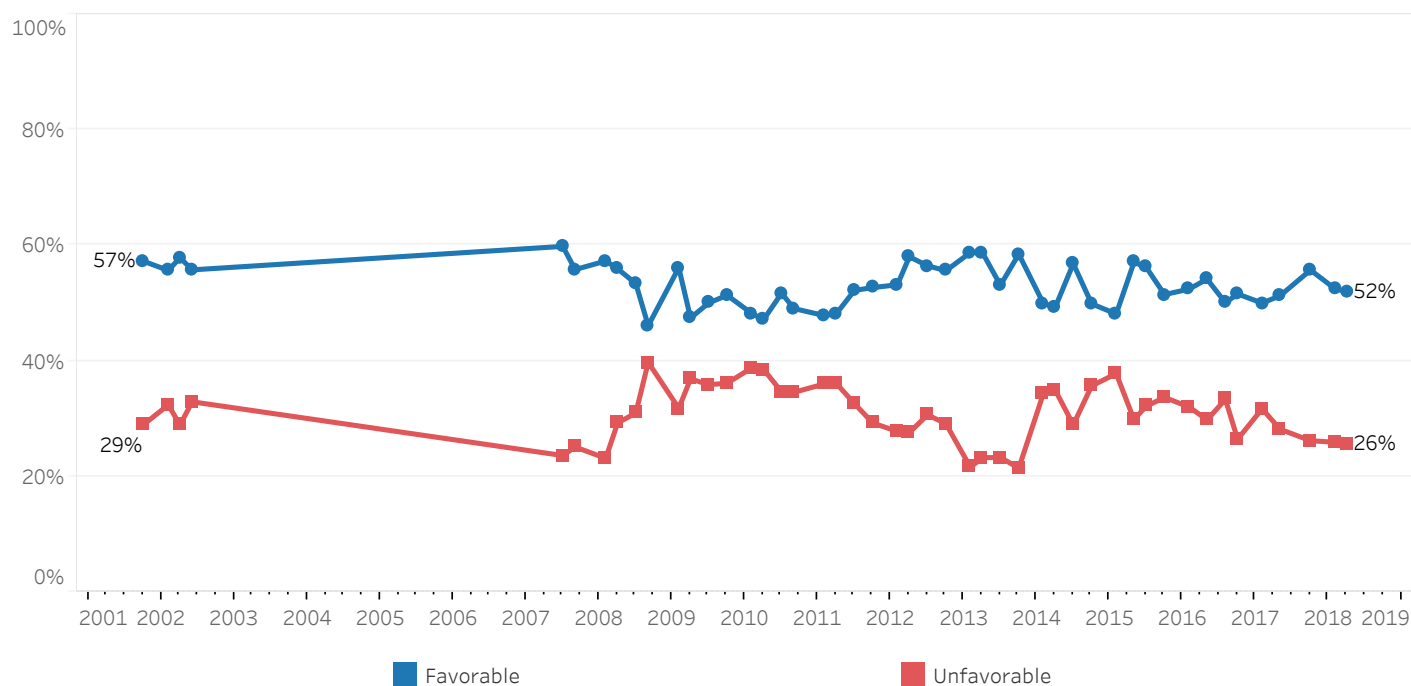
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and forty-eight (548) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 13 and April 22, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. Included were 278 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.9%) and 270 from the Second District (MSE +/- 6.0%).

Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire senior Senator and former Governor Jeanne Shaheen continues to be popular in the state. Currently, 52% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 26% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral, and 14% don't know enough about her to say.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-identified Democrats, self-described liberals, those who have completed postgraduate work, NHPR listeners, *Boston Globe* readers, and those aged 65 and older are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-identified Republicans and Independents, and self-described conservatives are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen.

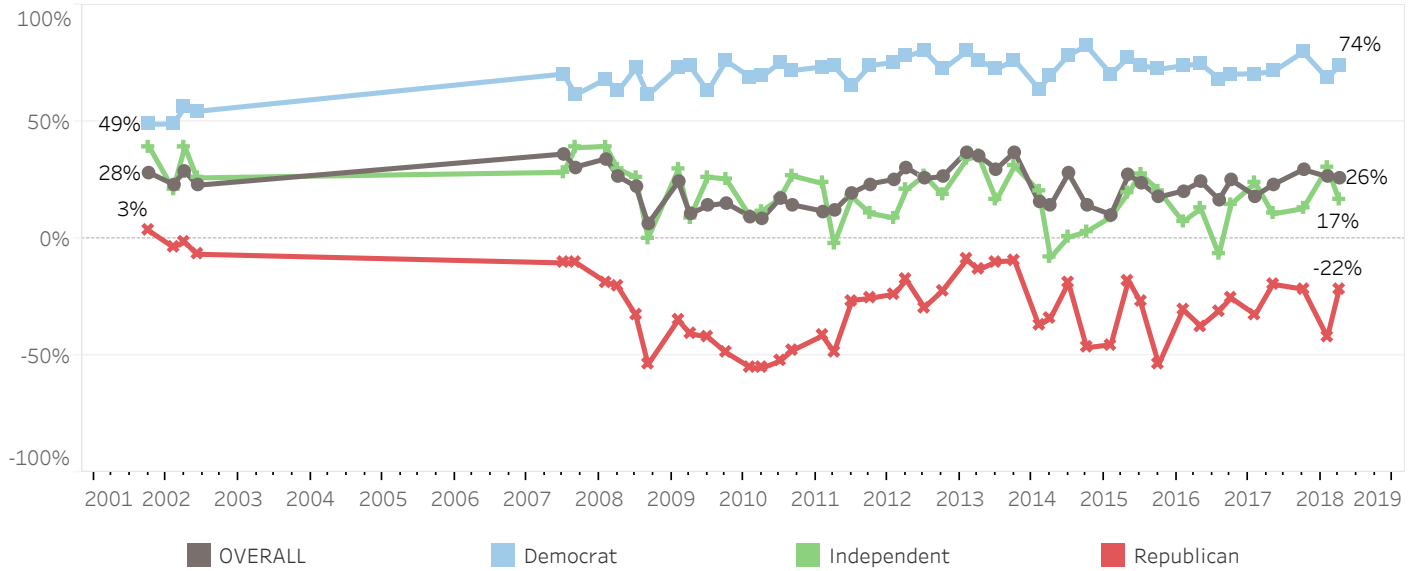
Shaheen Favorability Rating

Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have a unfavorable opinion) is +26%, unchanged since February (+27%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +74%) and somewhat popular among Independents (+17%), but somewhat unpopular among Republicans (-22%). Shaheen's net favorability has declined among Independents (30% in February, 17% currently) but improved Republicans (-42% in October, -22% currently).

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

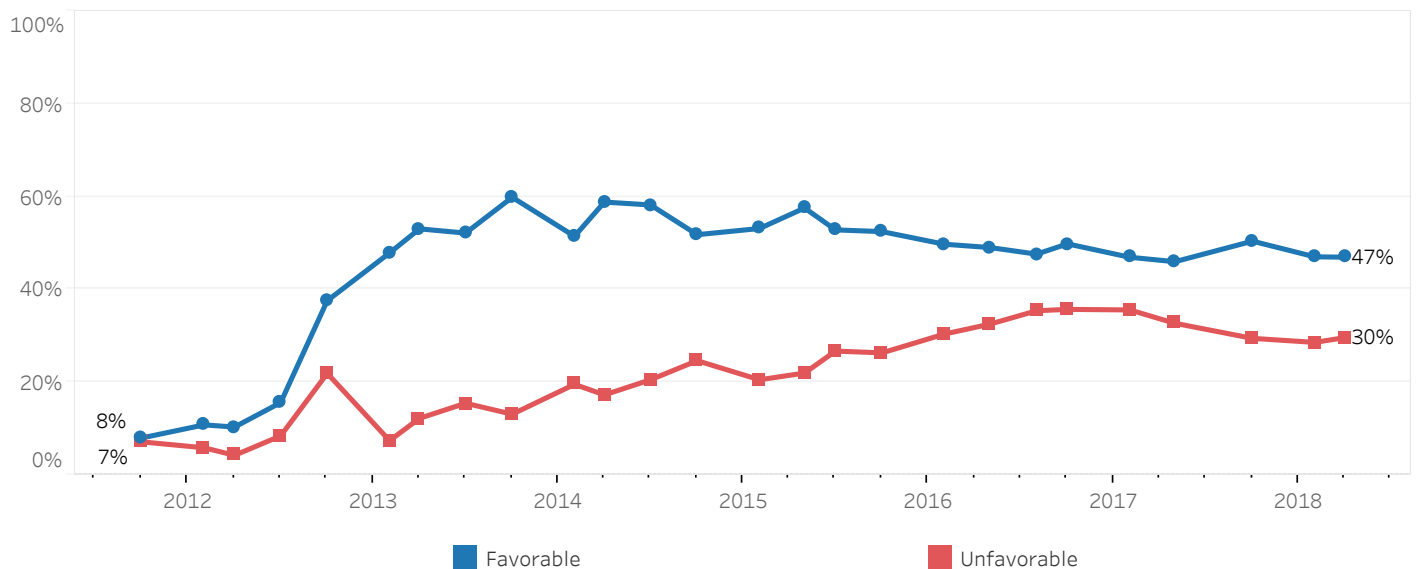


Favorability - Maggie Hassan

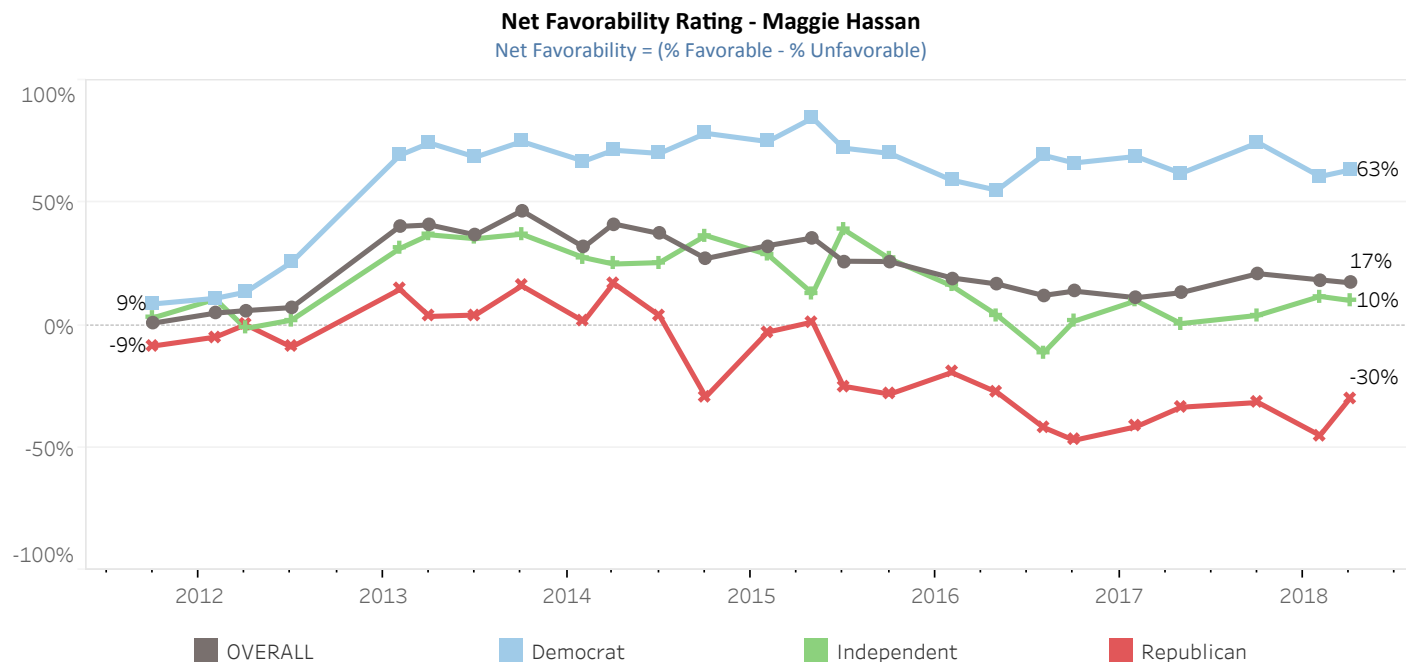
New Hampshire's junior Senator Maggie Hassan is slightly less popular than Shaheen. Currently, 47% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 30% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 15% don't know enough about her to say.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, those with a college degree or more education, self-identified Democrats, NHPR listeners, *Boston Globe* readers, and Connecticut Valley residents are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Conservative talk radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump or did not vote in 2016, self-identified Republicans, self-described conservatives, and those who went to technical school or have some college education are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.

Hassan Favorability Rating



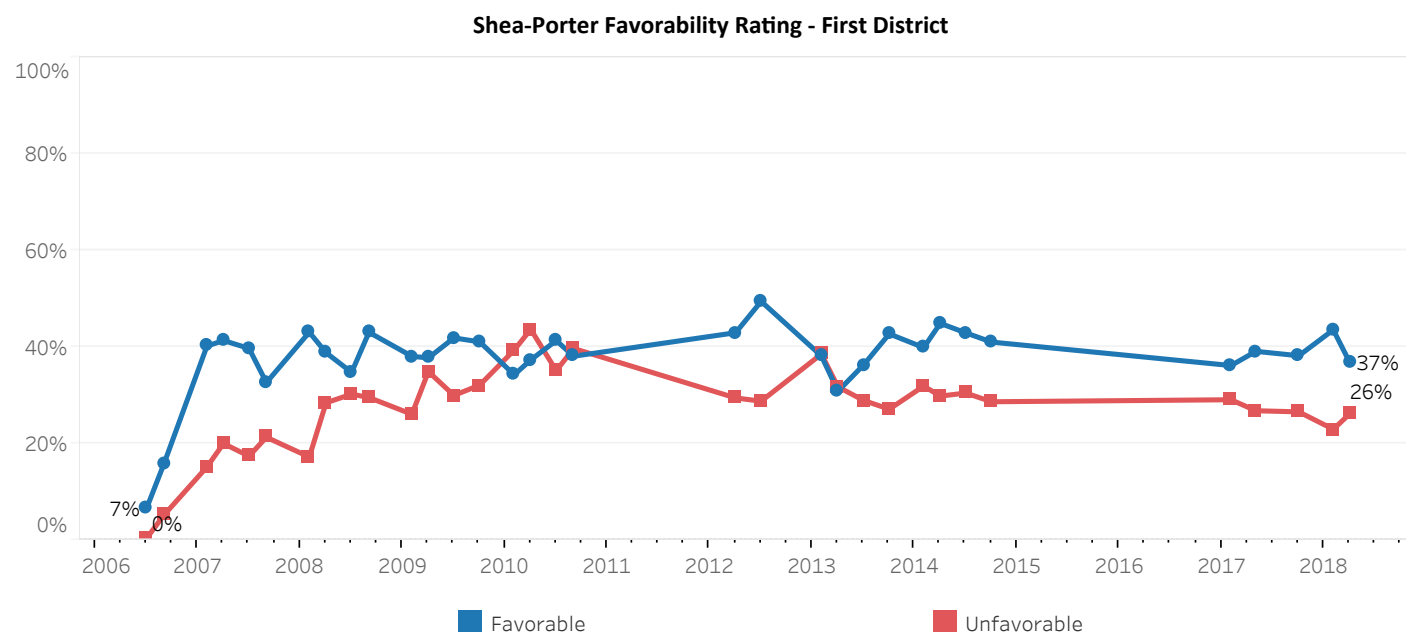
Hassan's net favorability rating is +17%, largely unchanged since February (+18%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +63%) and somewhat popular among Independents (+10%) but unpopular among Republicans (-30%). Hassan's net favorability has stayed largely the same among Democrats and Independents and has increased somewhat among Republicans (-45% in February, -30% currently).



Favorability - Carol Shea-Porter

Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who will be retiring from Congress at the end of her current term, is somewhat popular in New Hampshire's First District. Currently, 37% of residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District have a favorable view of Shea-Porter, 26% have an unfavorable view of her, 12% are neutral, and 26% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +11%, slightly lower than in February (+21%).

Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +57%), somewhat popular among Independents (+15%), and unpopular among Republicans (-42%).

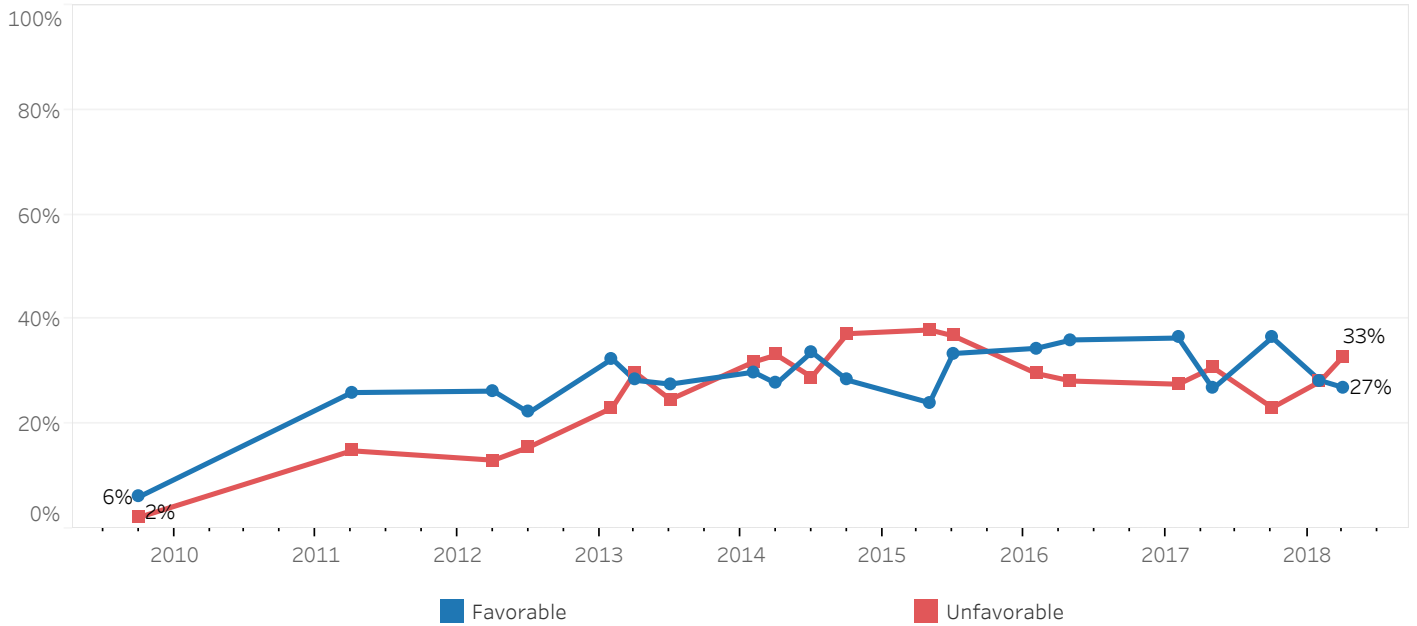


Favorability - Ann Kuster

Second Congressional District residents remain divided in their opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster, with many saying they don't know or are unsure about her. Currently, 27% of residents of New Hampshire's Second Congressional District have a favorable view of Kuster, 33% have an unfavorable view of her, 8% are neutral, and 33% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is -6%, down from 0% in October.

Kuster remains popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +42%), is somewhat unpopular among Independents (-21%), and unpopular among Republicans (-48%).

Kuster Favorability Rating - Second District

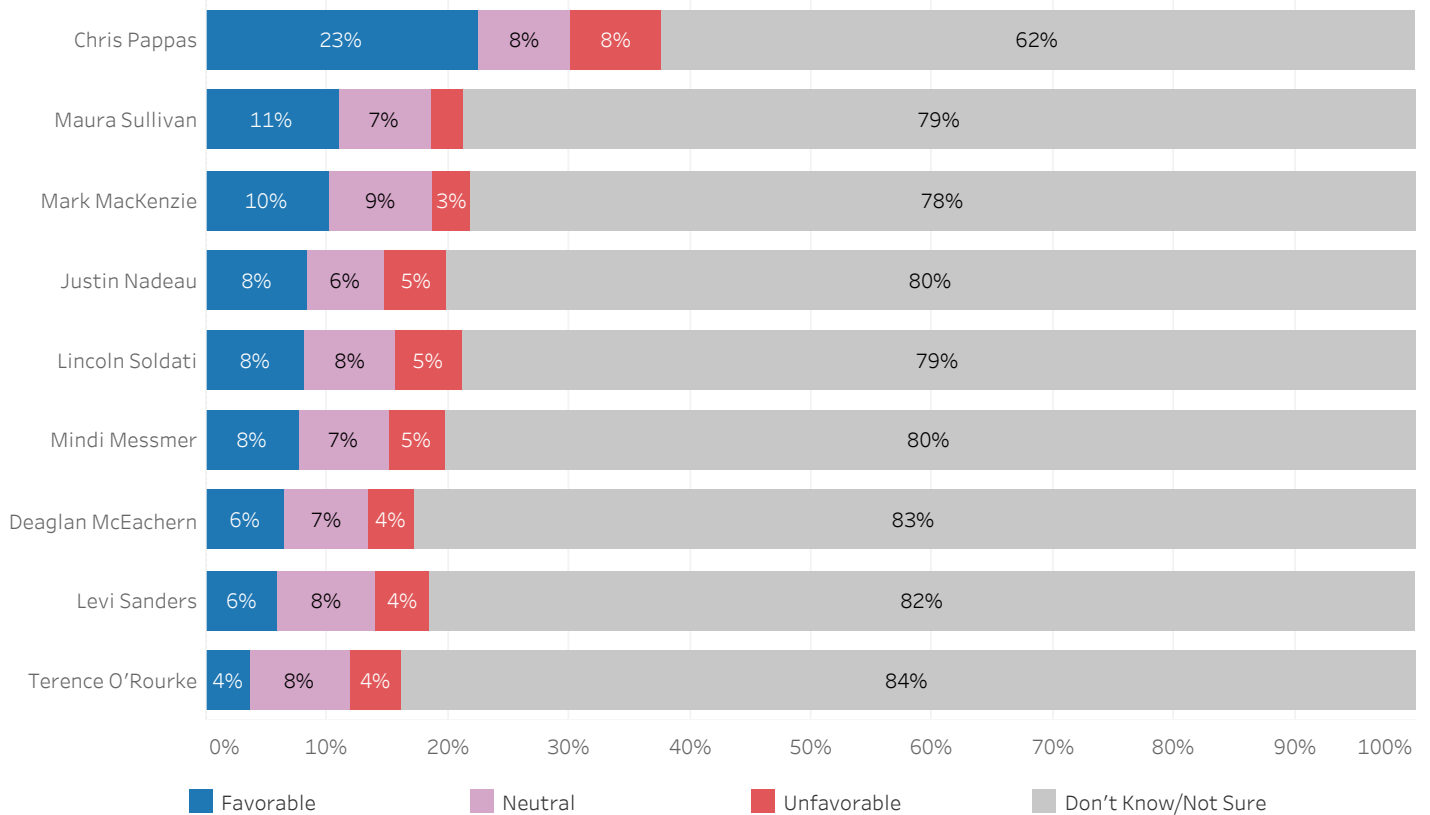


Favorability - 1st Congressional District Candidates

With Carol Shea-Porter retiring at the end of her term, the race for the Democratic nomination for the seat is being contested by many candidates, none of whom are well-known to New Hampshire First District residents.

Nearly a quarter (23%) have a favorable opinion of Executive Councilor Chris Pappas, 8% are neutral, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, and 62% don't know or have never heard of him. Fewer residents have a positive opinion of former US Defense Department Official Maura Sullivan (11%), State Representative Mark MacKenzie (10%), attorney Justin Nadeau (8%), former Somersworth Mayor Lincoln Soldati (8%), State Representative Mindi Messmer (8%), businessman Deaglan McEachern (6%), attorney Levi Sanders (6%), or Rochester City Attorney Terence O'Rourke (4%). Three-quarters of respondents or more don't know or have never heard of each of these candidates except for Pappas.

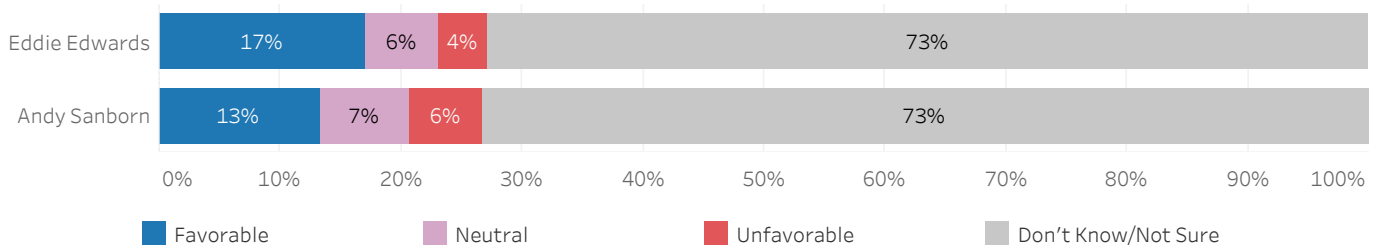
1st District Democratic Candidates Favorability



Two candidates seeking the Republican nomination for the 1st Congressional District are unknown to nearly three-quarters of First District residents.

Seventeen percent have a favorable opinion of former NH Liquor Enforcement Chief Eddie Edwards, 6% are neutral, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, and 73% don't know or have never heard of him. Thirteen percent have a favorable opinion of State Senator Andy Sanborn, 7% are neutral, 6% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 73% don't know or have never heard of him.

1st District Republican Candidates Favorability

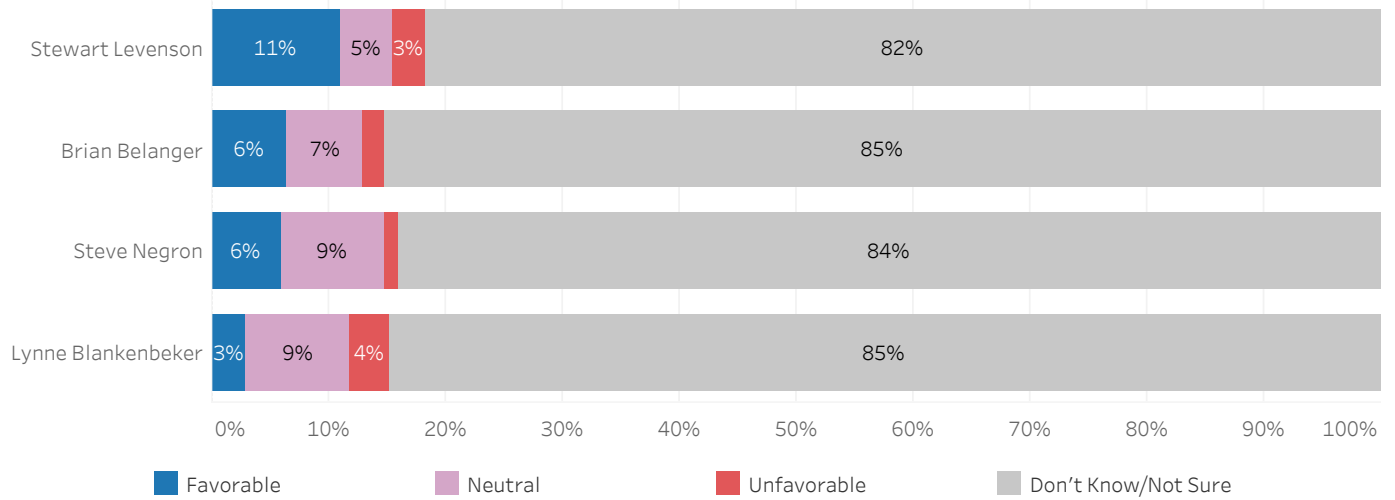


Favorability - 2nd Congressional District Candidates

Four Republicans have announced their candidacies for the Second Congressional District, challenging Kuster. These four candidates are not well-known in the district.

Eleven percent have a favorable opinion of former Veterans Affairs Physician Stewart Levenson, 5% are neutral, 3% have an unfavorable opinion, and 82% don't know or have never heard of him. Slightly fewer New Hampshire residents have a favorable opinion of Businessman Brian Belanger (6%), State Representative Steve Negron (6%), or former State Representative Lynne Blankenkemper (3%). More than 80% of respondents don't know or have never heard of each of these candidates.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and forty-eight (548) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 13 and April 22, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. Included were 278 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.9%) and 270 from the Second District (MSE +/- 6.0%). The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
