17. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to borrow the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing the mortgage now or formerly held by the Lakeport National Bank on the homestead formerly owned by Ernest J. G. Rowe and/or Gertrude M. Rowe, and presently owned by the town and to authorize the selectmen to purchase said mortgage and the

obligation which it secures for and in behalf of the Town.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine and Blister Rust Control in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Commission of the State of New Hampshire.

19. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to sell and convey the former school house and land at Tamworth and to authorize the selectmen to determine the price, terms, conditions, and manner of sale.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for painting and repairing the old school building if Article 19 is not adopted.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute inventory blanks at the time of assessment on April 1st.

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of any property acquired through tax collector's deed.

24. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting and to vote at what hour to close the polls.

COOK MEMORIAL LIBRARY

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Dear Mr. & Mrs. & Family:

Once again our region is covered with snow and the forest fire hazard has disappeared, but to your local forest fire warden it is just a time to check over his equipment and check the causes of the fires he has had. We know that our biggest cause of forest fires are careless people burning rubbish, brush or debris without a permit or in an unsafe place. When this fire gets away from them and help is needed to put it out they then plead that they did not know a permit was required for the incinerator or this type of burning. Well, the old saying, ignorance of the law is no excuse, fits in here very well. The forest fire laws have been in the newspapers, on the radio and on television and are on some posters, and there should be no excuse for not knowing a permit is required for all outdoor burning. In this year's report we are going to quote the law of the State of New Hampshire in regards to permits, this is found in Chapter 233 - Section 35 revised laws, State of New Hampshire.

Permits

- 35b No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or shall burn or cause to be burned any material, and no city or town shall kindle or maintain a fire or a public dump in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste, or cutover land or where fire may be communicated to such lands, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written permit from the forest fire warden of the town where the burning is to be done unless the same is in the presence of the warden or his agent.

Liability for fires without permit.

- 36 Any person causing or kindling a fire without

permit of the forest fire warden when such permit is required and any person by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, shall be liable in a civil action for the payment to the town or the state or both, of the expenses incurred by the forest fire warden or his deputy warden in attending or extinguishing such fire.

Penalties

- 38 Any person violating any provisions of section 35 shall be fined not more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than sixty days.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Tamworth qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Tamworth School in said district on the 4th day of April 1959, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district,

and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for transportation of high school pupils from Bennett's Corner to the Quimby School in Center Sandwich.

10. To see if the district will vote to raise the sum of \$212.40 as the district's share of the operating expenses of the New Hampshire educational television broadcasting station Channel 11.

11. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new classroom; and to authorize the School Board to borrow on credit of the district a sum not to exceed \$7,500.00 by the issuance of serial notes or bonds therefor; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which such notes or bonds are issued including their sale, and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and any amendments thereto.

12. Resolved that the Tamworth school district petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district which may include in addition to this district the following districts; namely Brookfield, Effingham, Freedom, Madison, Ossipee.

13. To elect two representatives of the district to serve on an interim committee to prepare a financial budget for the operation of the proposed cooperative school district.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Tamworth:

During the school year 1957-58 the teachers in the Tamworth School were:

Mrs. Johnston resigned shortly after mid-year and Mrs. Henrietta Kane, who had retired from the staff the previous year, completed this year in her place. Mrs. Kane was succeeded by Mrs. Eva Young of Center Harbor, N. H., at the beginning of the current year. Mrs. Young is a graduate of Plymouth Normal School and did work at the teachers college last year.

During the year the Tamworth School enrolled 191 pupils and had an average membership of 179. The school opened the current year with an enrollment of 171 and several other pupils have entered since that date.

There were 67 pupils enrolled at Kennett High School. Currently there is an enrollment of 65 at

Kennett High School and 6 at the Quimby School in Center Sandwich. Of this number 12 are seniors, and there are 15 eighth grade pupils to enter high school next September. The tuition rate at both schools this year is \$350.00. Announced tuition rates for the next year are \$355.00 at Kennett High School and \$350.00 at the Quimby School.

The school health program continues under the competent supervision of the community nurse, Mrs. Thelma Roberts, R. N., with the annual physical examinations made by Dr. Remick.

Because of the increasing enrollments the gymnasium was used for a classroom part of the time last year, and full time during the current year. An estimated enrollment of over 190 pupils next year makes necessary additional classroom space next year. With one additional room the gymnasium will have to be used again as a classroom. With this arrangement it is impossible for the gymnasium to be used for the purpose of which it was intended and the educational program for the entire school is made much less effective.

In anticipation of the possible formation of a cooperative school district of nearby towns, with the construction and operation of a high school in 1960-61, grades seven through twelve, the board recommends the construction of a temporary classroom adjacent to the present building to house one grade. Should the proposed cooperative high school be realized rooms for grades seven and eight would no longer be needed at the Tamworth School. The temporary room could be used for other purposes, or disposed of, as the district may wish.

During the past year several of the school districts of this supervisory union have been conducting a co-operative school study. Representing Tamworth on the study committees are the three school board members, with Miss Julia Hathway, Mr. Emmons Heald, and Mr. Wilbur Smith. Mr. Smith was recently succeeded by Mr. Charles Remick. The study committee members are to be commended for their faithful attendance at the many meeting and their contributions to the study. A report of the study has been published and distributed to the citizens of the districts involved.

My report would not be complete without tribute to the many people and organizations that contribute so effectively, and in so many ways, in making the Tamworth School a fine school and a great asset to the community. Among others there include our fine teaching staff, Custodian William Hidden, our cooks who serve such fine meals day after day, the Tamworth Foundation, the P. T. A., The Tamworth Outing Club, and last, but not least, the members of the school board who put in uncounted hours of thought and effort to provide the best possible educational opportunities for the boys and girls of the community.

Mrs. Harry Damon, Mrs. Myrick Crane, Mrs. Rolf Spicer, and Mrs. Edward Moody served as librarians, with two or more on duty from 8:30 to 12:00 one day each week. We wish to thank these good neighbors for a very thoughtful and helpful service.

A collection of several science books, donated by Mr. Ormsby Buck, is much appreciated and the books are in frequent demand. Each month this year we have received from Mr. Theodore Johnson a book from Best In Children's Books. Subscriptions to Popular Mechanics and Seventeen have been donated and each month a copy of National Geographic and of Audubon Magazine are brought in for us to use. Through the use of a gift of \$100.00 and the donations of several books the total number of volumes has increased to approximately 700.
