TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in town on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a town clerk, one selectman for three years, and all other town officers.

Article 2. To see what action the town will take upon the budget submitted by the budget committee.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town charges for the ensuing year:

- a. Town officers' salaries.
- b. Town officers' expenses.
- c. Election and registration.
- d. Town hall and other buildings.
- e. Parks and playgrounds.
- f. Legal fees and vital statistics.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for snow removal and sanding.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for oiling and general maintenance of highways and bridges.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for construction and maintenance of Class 5 roads, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$309.05 for same to which the State will contribute \$2,060.35, if appropriated.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to trade in the town's present front-end loader and A-C tractor for a new Front End Loader for a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00, payment on the same to be spread over three years, to transfer \$3,000.00 from the unexpended balance in the previous year's bridge funds to make the 1954 payment, and to borrow the balance to be paid one-half in 1955 and one-half in 1956.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$675.00 to defray the town's share of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivors Insurance), or take any action relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for street lighting.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor and old age assistance.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes, excepting poll taxes, paid on or before dates designated at this meeting.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the police department.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to appoint a constable, instead of electing him as at present, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the water system.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for testing and developing a Gravel Developed well for an auxiliary water supply, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to pay water bonds at maturity and \$1,845.00 interest.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the employment of a district nurse.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 toward the support of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care of the town dump.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care of shade trees.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00, to be used in cooperation with State and Federal funds, for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the town.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial program.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to allow the American Legion the use of the Town Hall one night each month without charge.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the public library.

Article 27. To see if the town will allow the use of the Library to organized town groups providing this use does not interfere with the regular library hours, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

Article 29. To see if the town will take action as to the fee for digging graves, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$182.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to defray the cost of the Civil Defense program now being conducted in the State of New Hampshire, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Article 33. To hear the reports of agents, officers, or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

The dedication in June of Troy's new Public Library marked another step forward in reading and education.

As yet the facilities have not been completed as monies from the Trust Funds were only sufficient to finish the building. Painting of the building had to be partically financed with town funds.

A large reading table was available from the old library room in the Town Hall and the Troy Women's Club donated a dozen high quality folding chairs.

Mrs. Cora Ripley Sylvester has given \$50 which will be used toward the purchase of a librarian's desk and chair.

A small table for the children's side, as well as more chairs, are still needed.

The basement room has been used by the Boy Scouts for their weekly Monday meetings as the heating problem in their club house had become acute. The Christian Youth Fellowship held one meeting when their usual meeting place was occupied. This brings up the question of the advisability of allowing groups to use the basement of the library with the permission of the Trustees. Use means wear and tear with extra expense for light. Disuse means a waste of existing facilities.

An article in the Town Warrant will leave this policy decision to the vote of the Town. Permission for use of the library will come from the Trustees.

Much more service is rendered by the District Nurse than the visits as listed. Much welfare work is done. In 1950 blood typing was done, in 1952 the Mobile Chest X-ray Unit was in Troy. Well children and baby clinics have been held, with the giving of immunizing and booster shots of toxoids. Patch tests for T.B. has been conducted in the school, with the taking of children who showed a reaction to the Keene Hospital for X-rays.

Glasses have been obtained through the State and Lions Club of Keene, for those who could not purchase them and these children have been transported by the nurse for examinations and then back for the fittings.

A Tonsil Clinic was held at Keene Hospital and the nurse took them to the hospital and staid several hours with children and then back the next day to bring them home.

Clothing, shoes, rubbers and overshoes have been donated by the townspeople and the nurse has mended cloth-

ing, had footwear repaired and then distributed to those who were in need of same.

Dental work is much needed by the children and we only wish we could obtain a dentist who could do work on a clinic basis for those who can not afford the regular rates.

WAR MEMORIAL RECREATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Memorial Recreation Program for children closed its 1953 session after ten full successful weeks. This was the first ten week season. All previous seasons had been for eight weeks.

Many things occurred to make the summer a memorable one. Morning programs made all time high records because of a crafts program given by Mr. Ralph Staples and the opportunities for daily athletic contests with Keene children. The Troy youngsters were able to play all games at home and much time, effort and money was saved in this department alone.

The utilization of the Sand Dam Area by the Keene Recreation Department resulted in much favorable publicity for the town of Troy. The \$400.00 paid by Keene was put to use in expanding the athletic field and repairing storm damage to the beach. Because of the presence of at least two and often four life guards from Keene to help supervise the water activities, it was possible for either Mr. Staples or Mr. Dunn to be available for supervision of land sports and activities during swim periods.

No appreciable inconvenience to the Troy children was caused by the presence of Keene and, on occasion, Marlboro children at the Sand Dam and these small difficulties were more than offset by the above mentioned benefits as well as the fun of having more children for playing games.

Under the direction of Mr. Littlefield, the Troy High School class of 1956 erected a small building from which they dispensed soft drinks, ice cream, candy and popcorn. This venture proved a tremendously valuable lesson in business management to the class and they just about broke even financially for the season. It is hoped that this

school project will continue to be a permanent thing at the Sand Dam.

Equipment added this season includes two picnic tables made at the High School, one row boat—a gift of Charles Starkey and named “Flo,” two playground units for use by very small children.

Some mention should be made of the expenditures of considerable funds obtained from sources other than town taxes.

The athletic program consisted of team sports and individual activities. There was no transportation problem this year in regard to the baseball team as a different recreation park team from Keene came down every week day and the games were scheduled with them. We also played baseball with Marlboro children's teams. The

games averaged in number at three per week. The age groups were eight years to twelve years and twelve years to sixteen years. Troy teams had what could be considered a successful season.

The first, and what we hope will be an annual, tri-town swimming meet was held at the Sand Dam. It consisted of swimmers from Troy, Keene, and Marlboro. Troy made a clean sweep of all the events.

Several special events were held during the summer. Among these was the annual bike rodeo, the frog race, peanut hunts, and a track and field day.

Our new tennis courts will be a valuable addition to the summer program. We are badly in need of new bath houses and this addition should complete the area. The season was ended with a water show with a fine ballet display given by the girl swimmers of Troy. Red Cross beginner, intermediate and junior life saving cards were awarded to the classes that earned them. These achievements represent a considerable amount of work by the boys and girls of Troy.

The staff wishes to express its thanks to all the people who contributed to the success of the program.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF THE TROY HIGH SCHOOL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my third report as principal of the Troy High School.

School Staff Relatively small turn over of our teaching staff has strengthened greatly our program. Circumstances did make it necessary to obtain replacements for the following teachers. Mrs. Ann Gaseau our commercial teacher for four years resigned in June to devote more time to household tasks and was replaced this fall by Miss Leah Femino, a recent graduate of Salem Teachers College, Salem, Mass. Miss Femino is teaching the commercial courses and coaching girls' sports. Mrs. Rose Land who had established the Art department at Troy left in June to accept a position in the West. Her position was filled by Mrs. Stella Eaton recently graduated from Massachusetts School of Art. Mr. Gordon Decato who taught last year in the junior high grades left Troy to assume the principal's position at Chesterfield and he was replaced by Mr. Donald Fletcher a graduate of New England College and Keene Teachers College.

An important development during this year has been the use of student teachers from Keene Teachers College. This has benefited our large classes particularly in the elementary grades where classes of 35 are common and the extra teachers are an added value

Last year the Troy teachers founded a loose association for the purposes of professional growth, program improvement, and social activities. This year the association has been renewed and strengthened. Leonard Littlefield our Industrial Arts teacher was elected as president and through his guidance the association has been very active. The real highlight of this year was the faculty pro-

duction "Faculty Frolics" put on to establish a fund for the improvement of the school program. The work of this association is only one of the many indications of the willingness of the Troy faculty to devote extra hours for the improvement of our school program. The ultimate result being the betterment of our children's education.

School Program Operating on the now familiar two session schedule our program has seen little change from last year. I do believe the following points are appropriate as an indication of the focus of our attention during the previous year.

Special reading is continuing in elementary grades under the supervision of Mrs. Elva Rawding. This program has been designed for those needing more individual help in reading than is possible from regular classroom teachers. Reading tests together with teacher observation determine those pupils who should receive the attention in addition to regular reading instruction.

Miss Joslin, high school English teacher, has taken an added course (Reading Laboratory) onto her schedule in an attempt to provide help for pupils who are not up to grade level in reading. It has been found that each pupil has his own individual reading difficulty thus this course is very highly individualized. This year there are 18 pupils receiving instructions in this course and the progress that is being made we feel will justify the continuance of such a course.

Our Guidance program has continued to improve under the supervision of Ralph Staples with greatest achievements being made in the area of testing. The following guidance report outlines what we believe to be an essential testing program commensurate with the budget. This program will be effective and useful only if followed closely every year.

GUIDANCE REPORT TROY SCHOOL SYSTEM 1952-1953

The following testing program endeavors to find the student's interest, intellectual ability, and educational

achievement. The purpose of this program is to enable the individual student to make a success of his scholastic work and help him establish himself in work which takes advantage of his abilities and interest.

The secondary purpose of such a program is the measurement of how well the educational needs are being met. It should be emphasized, however, that the testing program is just one phase of the total guidance program. Below is a table illustrating the twelve year testing program of the Troy School System which we believe will satisfy the above mentioned needs.

“How well we **understand** and **assume** our responsibilities as citizens will determine the future of our nation.” Regardless of his or her future career, everyone of our graduates will have equal responsibilities toward citizenship. With this in mind the staff has cooperatively developed a social studies program designed to provide all children with experience and study that will lead to an understanding of:

- (a) the basic code of living in a democracy.
- (b) the functions of our local, state, and federal governments.
- (c) our economic system and the interdependence of its various parts.
- (d) the position of our country in world affairs.
- (e) the customs and cultures of other lands and the interdependence of all nations.

Our twelve year program is as follows:

- Grades 1-7 Social Studies each year (Follet Series)
- Grade 8 U. S. History and Geography
- Grade 9 Civics
- Grade 10 World History and Geography
- Grade 11 U. S. History
- Grade 12 World Problems

To create more interest and provide experiences in citizenship training more emphasis is being placed on activities such as:

Student Government — Leadership courses — Girls' State, YMCA Youth and Gov. Program—American Legion Oratorical Contest—United Nations Study and Contest—trips to legislature, court, industrial plants, banks, etc.

Halloween Festival For the third year our halloween activities have continued to become larger and better. Financed by the contributions of local businesses and organizations this festival is providing entertainment for young and old. The parade is becoming more colorful each year with prizes being given for best floats and individual costumes. The Class of 1956 won the first leg on a rotating trophy given for the best float in the parade. Other highlights which have proved of real interest and value are (a) Halloween Dance for adults (b) Party at Grange Hall for children. Refreshments were served to all free of charge and real credit is due Mrs. Anna Atkins and her Girl Scouts for their splendid job of handling this part. The success of the Halloween Festival is another tribute to our fine teaching staff, particularly in the handling of 200 children at the Grange Hall party.

Athletics The winter program of athletics at Troy was centered on our interscholastic basketball program. During the 1952-53 season a total of 17 games were played. Much more impressive than the record of 8 and 9 was the spirit of fair play demonstrated by the teams. At the close of the season the Troy Trojans were invited to participate in the tournament at Keene Teachers College. The Trojans

made an impressive showing particularly in the semi-final game when they broke all tournament records for team high scoring and Donald Johnson broke all individual scoring records when he gathered a total of 39 points for the one game. Troy lost in the final game to Marlboro.

The girls played a schedule similar to the boys and in most cases played the preliminary events.

History was made on the baseball diamond for Troy High in the spring of 1933. The team went through an undefeated season and then went on to win the New Hampshire State Class C championship. This honor was the first of its kind for Troy. The team was honored with a banquet given by the I.O.O.F. of Troy. A group of loyal fans also collected funds enough to present each member of the team with jackets. The 1953 champions were as follows:

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The past school year and the first part of this present year have been busy times indeed in the Troy School District. After the cooperative school idea faded and attendance at Keene was rejected; a bond issue to build an addition to the Troy building was voted. This issue has now been sold at a sound interest rate of 2.4% and the money re-invested in government notes until needed. Plans and specifications have been completed for the building and are now out for bids. If all goes well, the Troy pupils will have the advantages of the new addition when school opens in the fall. It is felt that the educational program of the entire school will be enriched through the availability of the facilities of the new structure.

During the past summer, three four-room apartments were constructed in the Ripley Homestead property and the entire building is occupied by teacher's families. The availability of desirable living accommodations for teachers at the Ripley homestead is an important factor in obtaining and retaining teachers.

The school system continues to operate smoothly under the capable leadership of principal Corridon Trask. The school is offering a broad curriculum designed to meet the needs of pupils; and good, sound principles of teaching are being used in promoting the education of our pupils.
