THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to transfer from its existing surplus to the Trustees of Trust Funds, as Capital Reserve Funds, in accordance with Chapter 160, Laws of 1943, for the following purposes:

1. For the purchase of Highway Maintenance Equipment.

2. For the improvements of the road leading from Main Street to Pine Grove Cemetery.

3. For the repair and improvement of Kearsarge Street Extension and sidewalk, and for the repair of the Cemetery wall bordering said street.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

5. To hear reports of Officers of the Town heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of publicizing the natural advantages of the Town, in connection with other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in the Town, in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of Sawtell Hall, subject to the conditions as outlined in letter of January 14, 1944 from the donor Mr. Frank W. Sawtell.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

For the first time in several years the number of half-days in session has dropped below 360. This was due to the severe weather and insufficiency of heating system. The percent of attendance is lower. This may be due in some

degree to the weather. However, we feel that some parents are not as careful to keep their children in school as they should be. In order to keep up his school work and understand it a child needs to be in school every day. Illness and death in the family are the only really good excuses for a pupil's absence. Tardiness has also increased, being more than double that of the previous year. Every effort should be made to reduce the amount of tardiness for the present year. This is the duty of both teachers and parents.

For the past two years the number of pupils registered and the average membership have steadily declined. In 1940-41 the total registered was 289. In 1942-43 it was 224. Of the latter 53 were high school and elementary tuition pupils. Two pupils in this district attended school in Bradford. This makes a total of 173 pupils residing in the district and attending public schools. This is 25 less than the previous year.

For the present year 1943-44 the district was fortunate in retaining nearly all its teachers. For the coming year there are several probable changes unless the attraction of higher salaries in larger places is neutralized by a corresponding increase in the salaries paid by the district. Steady pressure is maintained to move the best teachers from the smaller towns and villages to the cities.

The number of teachers available is daily becoming smaller. In the United States 200,000 teachers have left teaching since Pearl Harbor. Teachers College enrollments have dropped 60 percent below 1940-41. Some of the reasons for these changes are (a) The pay check of the average factory worker is today at least 80 percent above the year 1939. Workers in shipyards have doubled their earnings since the last prewar year. The net income of farmers will be this year nearly three times larger than the prewar figure. (b) Meanwhile teachers' salaries have advanced an average of less than 10 percent, and the cost of living 26 percent.

In this district the increase in the total amount of the present salaries of the high and elementary teachers is 9.2 percent above the total for 1940-41.

Much credit is due the Warner Woman's Club for the continued support of school lunches and the 4-H Club for canning. With the regular appropriation of the school district for lunches and the aid of the Federal Government we

are able to furnish substantial lunches for pupils in both high and graded schools. This includes one half pint of pasteurized milk daily at a cost of one cent to the pupil. The State Board of Health requires that pasteurized milk must be furnished where it is obtainable.

Through the aid of the State Department of Education a considerable amount of new equipment has been put into the farm shop of Simonds Free High School without cost to the district. This includes a band saw, bench saw, sander and many hand tools. Pupils taking the practical and important agricultural course will be enabled thereby to obtain much better training. The use of this equipment will also be available to those farmers who wish to take the O. S. Y. A. course in Repair and Maintenance of Farm Machinery, and those who wish to bring in broken farm tools for repairs.

We wish to thank the School Board, the Simonds Prudential Committee, and all parents and teachers who have in any way contributed to the advancement of the interests of our schools.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Crises like the present test the quality and sincerity of everyone's patriotism and citizenship. The times make such unavoidable demands for universal cooperation in the many lines of essential regular and emergency public endeavor that the response given may well be assumed to be the real measure of one's love of country and his appreciation of the opportunities it offers. Ranking high in the list of public endeavor is the protection of our forests from fire. It calls for full and generous cooperation by each of us. Fire statistics indicate that better than 98 per cent of all fires in New Hampshire are man-caused. If human carelessness could be eliminated from the problem, the number of fires would drop to a mere minimum of less than 2 per cent of present figures and fire costs and losses would reduce in proportion. While this goal will not be achieved because of the perversity of human nature, the record can be vastly improved through individual discipline, alertness and cooperation.

Discipline calls for personal restraint from following unrestricted natural impulses to do as one pleases with regard to fire; alertness in cautioning others against imprudent and illegal burning and in promptly reporting fires to the local forest fire warden; cooperation in complying with laws, rules and regulations governing the kindling and care of fires, smoking, safety of mechanical units using fire in and near woodlands and assisting the local warden in extinguishing such fires as may occur.

The possibilities of disastrous and expensive woods fires are constantly becoming more real. The hurricane felled an estimated one and one-half billion board feet of standing timber, much of which was never cleaned up. To this hazard has been and is being added extensive areas of slash from additional hundreds of millions cut to produce vitally needed wood for the war effort. With the stage so set, greater caution is increasingly necessary. It will pay substantial dividends in unburned forest areas and the saving of unnecessary fire expense.

The year 1943 was an extremely fortunate one because of favorable weather conditions. Many towns had no fires, some had minor fires while a few had expensive ones. The public controls the answer to the 1944 and future years' fire records. If the public is careful and cooperative the record will be good.

Your town warden is, perhaps, more perplexed and anxious during these war years than ever before because of increased forest fire hazards and diminishing supplies of available man-power. He looks directly to you to aid him. Will you? You can aid him most effectively by always securing the required permit before attempting to burn and by complying fully with permit requirements; by being patient when he advises of departmental restrictions on permit burning or that he deems it unsafe to burn; and by giving him the needed assistance in extinguishing fires when he needs your help. To do so is to meet one real test of citizenship.

BUILDING CODE AND ZONING ORDINANCE TOWN OF WARNER

In pursuance of authority conferred by Chap. 92 of the 1925 Laws of New Hampshire, and Chap. 42 of the public laws of New Hampshire, and for the purpose to promote the health and safety, convenience and general welfare of the Town of Warner, and to make it an attractive place to live, the following ordinance and building code is enacted by the voters of the Town of Warner.

For the purpose of this ordinance the Town of Warner is divided into zones A and B. Zone A includes the precinct and trunk line line from Hopkinton Town line to Bradford Town line. Zone B includes the rest of the Town.

Article I. Nothing in this ordinance shall apply to existing structures or to the existing use of any building, but it shall apply to any new structure or to any substantial alteration of an existing building.

Article II. In Zone A the following provisions shall apply.

Section 1. The roof of every building hereafter erected or recovered in whole or in part, shall be covered with fire resisting material, except that this section shall not be construed to prohibit the use of wood shingles in repairing any section of roof now covered with wood shingles.

Section 2. Chimneys shall be constructed of stone, brick or cement to the ground, and extend 2 ft. above the roof to which it belongs, and shall have a cleanout opening at the base; no smoke pipe shall be allowed to pass through floors or partitions separating rooms, and all entrances to said chimneys shall be of fireproof construction.

Section 3. Every dwelling shall have a minimum ground area of 400 sq. feet inside measurement for each family unit.

Section 4. All public buildings and all dwellings constructed or repaired in the future shall be equipped with cesspool, septic tank, sanitary chemical closet or approved vault.

Section 5. Every building shall be set back from the front property line not less than 30 ft. or such distance as shall conform with the average line of existing buildings 500 ft. on either side, and all buildings shall be set back at least 20 ft. from the side lot line.

Article III. In Zone B all the provisions of Zone A except section 4 (sewerage) and section 2 (signs) shall apply.

Article IV. The owner of any plot of ground intended for development or subdivision into building lots not fronting upon a public highway, shall file with the board of Selectmen a plan or map of the proposed subdivision, and shall obtain the approval of the board of Selectmen thereon before proceeding with the development or sale of lots in said subdivision. It shall be the duty of the board of Selectmen to inspect the site of such proposed subdivision, and to require such roadway and other areas for common use as will eventually be acceptable to the Town for maintenance by the Town, and to approve the same when satisfied that such proposed plans are in harmony with and conducive to the general welfare of the Town and the neighborhood, and not detrimental to existing values, but in no sense shall this be deemed an acceptance by the Town of the street or streets.

Section 2. No signs shall be permitted except the following: Town and State Highway and directional and regulatory signs, historic signs, and those signs to advertise the profession or goods dealt in by the owner or occupant of property on which placed. No sign or group of signs shall exceed 20 sq. ft. outside dimensions, and shall not be placed so as to obstruct view on highway. Locations of signs shall be governed by same rules as apply to buildings in sec. 5.

Article V. Any structure destroyed by fire, explosions, flood, storm or other act of God, may be rebuilt or reconstructed within one year of its destruction except that if a non conforming use is destroyed to a degree of 75% or more as determined by assessed valuation, it must, when rebuilt, conform to the terms of this ordinance in its location and construction.

Article VI. The Moderator shall appoint one person to serve as Building inspector, his duties to be the enforcement of the above-mentioned provisions. Any person before

commencing work on the erection or alteration of any building or structure, must first obtain a permit duly granted for such erection or alteration by the Building inspector. Before a permit shall be issued the Building inspector shall determine that the proposed construction or alteration conforms to all the conditions of this ordinance.

Article VII. For the purpose of this ordinance the Board of Selectmen shall appoint a board of adjustment of 5 members as provided for in Chap. 42, Public Laws and amendments thereto, with the duties designated in the various provisions of this ordinance. The board of adjustment may, in appropriate cases, and subject to appropriate conditions and safeguards, to protect the community interest, make special exceptions to the terms of the aforesaid regulations and restrictions, in harmony with their general purpose and intent, and in accordance with general or specific rules therein contained, and the Laws of the State applicable thereto.

Article VIII. Whoever violates any of the provisions of the above regulations shall be punished upon conviction by a fine not exceeding \$10.00 for each day of each violation. It shall be the duty of the Selectmen to see that this ordinance is enforced and to take appropriate steps to correct any violations of this ordinance in accordance with public laws Chap. 42, Sec. 67.

The provisions of this ordinance may be amended or changed at any regular or special Town meeting, by a majority of the voters present as provided by the public laws.

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
