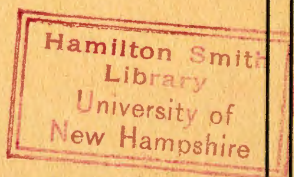

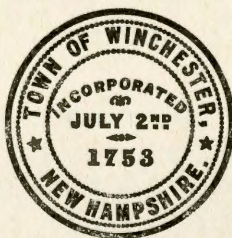

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE WINCHESTER PUBLIC LIBRARY

The trustees of the Winchester Public Library herewith present to the voters of Winchester their thirty-seventh annual report.

During the past year about 350 new volumes have been placed on the shelves besides the replacement of worn out books.

Miss Grace Alexander presented a gift to the Library in the form of five volumes of "The History of New Hampshire" by Pillsbury. Twelve other books were also given by various interested persons.

Of the new books about 140 are fiction and 110 juvenile and 80 adult non-fiction and 35 juvenile non-fiction.

The books loaned were 8,392 fiction, 7,530 juvenile, 2,031 non-fiction and 2,548 magazines, total 20,500. It is interesting to note that the circulation of non-fiction has increased over last year by 509 volumes and magazines by 590.

Miss Alexander resigned from the office of treasurer after fifty years of faithful service, and was presented with a gift of appreciation.

The town appropriation is being reserved for needed repairs and improvements.

The total district debt as of this date is \$24,000.00. Note No. 3 of the 1926 emergency appropriation will be taken up on May 1, 1929, leaving a net indebtedness at the close of this fiscal year of \$23,000.00.

To cover maturing notes and bonds during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1928 the budget carried an item of \$6,000. For interest on notes and bonds the budget carries an item of \$1,450, or a total of \$7,450 for debt and interest. This sum represents 17.88% or more than 1-6 of the total appropriation of \$41,653.

It is comforting to note that this is the last year of the Ashuelot bonds and thereafter the fixed charges of the District will be reduced by \$3,000 though the District will not be free from debt till July 1, 1935.

STATEMENT BY THE SCHOOL BOARD

At the annual school district meeting held March 13, 1928, the district by unanimous vote instructed its school board "to clear the title to the Forest Lake school property." In pursuance of this mandate from the district, the board had delivered to Mr. Wilfred Wood, who appears to be occupying the property, a communication requesting him to vacate the premises by Nov. 1, 1928 and deliver the keys to the school board. Upon his failure to do so the board placed the matter in the hands of Attorney Roy M. Pickard of Keene. Mr. Wood also took counsel and at this writing it would seem that if some agreement cannot be reached between counsel, the case will have to be adjudicated by some proper tribunal.

It perhaps should be stated in justice to Mr. Wood, that the proceedings thus far have been entirely amicable. He feels that he has a claim to the property that is prior to that of the school district, and it is just this point that must be adjudicated in some way.

HEADMASTER'S REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I hereby submit a brief report covering the work in Thayer High school for the past year.

The enrollment in the High school last fall was practically the same as for the preceeding year. This, in spite of the fact that an unusually large class was graduated last spring. The number in the Junior High this year is larger than for the previous year. The enrollment by classes and courses is as follows:

Two new teachers began work with the opening of the fall term. Miss Alma Southard in the Domestic Arts department continues the work formerly under the charge of Miss Grace Emery. Mr. Ian Walker fills the position left vacant by the resignation of Charles P. Read, instructor in Agriculture, Manual Training, and athletics. The new teachers have worked in exceptionally well and with the continued good work of those who returned we can justly continue to take pride in the personnel and quality of our teaching force.

While this school is not working primarily to prepare for college, since a smaller number go to college, the work done by those who do continue their education in institutions of such rank is indicative of the work of the school. In June 1927 we graduated a class of twelve and in September seven entered institutions of college rank. This was an unusually large percentage. At the end of the half year the state, as is customary obtained the record of all such students from all the schools of

the state and compared their records. Our seven graduates returned to us the second highest score of any school in the state. Last June a record class of twenty was graduated and of this number more than half have continued their work in various training and post-secondary schools.

Mr. Walker took his agricultural boys to the State judging contest at Durham last fall and although the team was made up of new material the boys did excellent work, bringing back the cup for dairy judging. All the agricultural boys are developing their individual projects and are making extensive plans for their work this spring and summer.

The school grounds have been improved during the fall by the building of two cement approaches from the roadway to the two main entrances. This work was done by Mr. Kendrick. During the late fall and early winter Mr. Kendrick has also built an additional class room and work shop for the agricultural department. The room that was formerly used as a play room was partitioned off and black boards put in place. The work was well done and the result is a real addition to our plant.

REPORT OF DISTRICT NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools:

During March and April 1928, 200 children had their teeth cared for at the school dental clinic. 138 children had their teeth cared for at the school dental clinic ending February 6, 1929.

Twelve children were taken to Keene Hospital in July for tonsil and adenoid operations.

In September and October the nurse assisted the school physicians with the physical examinations of all the pupils. The table showing the results is printed elsewhere and shows that the number of defects has been greatly reduced.

Previous to the dental clinic the nurse assisted the dentist with an examination of all the pupils for dental work.

All the schools have been equipped with first aid cabinets, a number of which were made by the manual training department of Thayer High school.

A large number of tooth brushes were purchased by the pupils from the Prophylactic Brush Co., at 8c and 10c per brush. A supply of tooth paste and a "Clean Teeth Chart" for each child was sent by the Colgate Company.

Through our local Red Cross organization a portable dental chair was purchased to be used for the benefit of the Winchester school children. Through the same organization a first aid cabinet was procured for the new car recently purchased by the District Nursing Association.

214 school child visits were made mostly for the treatment of cuts, scratches, sores, etc.

166 school visits were made.

About once in two months all pupils in the grade schools were weighed and results recorded on a chart and posted in the school room. Pupils who averaged 10 per cent or more underweight were advised as to diet, etc.

Careful attention has been given to the detection of communicable diseases including "scabies" and pediculoses, and whenever such cases have been found, pupils are excluded from school until all danger is over.

On July 9, 1928 a pre-school child clinic was conducted by Mrs. Hasham, a State Welfare worker, at which 53 children were given a physical examination by our local doctors and parents were notified of defects found. Another pre-school child clinic will be held here by Mrs. Hasham July 9, 1929.

Plans are being made to have a school vaccination clinic in the near future, and also attention will be given to defective vision cases.

I wish to express my thanks to you, to our local Red Cross organization, to the teachers, parents and children for the interest and cooperation in the health work in the school.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Winchester, N. H.:

I have the honor to submit herewith my fourth annual report.

Buildings and grounds. Another stride has been made in the program of the School Board to get the buildings in as good state of repairs as possible. In addition to the usual minor repairs, the following larger pieces of work were done.

Scotland School. This building was jacked up and new timbers and cement supports placed underneath.

Lower Ashuelot. The school room in this building was thoroughly renovated and painted. The pump was repaired and a new box placed around it so that now the school has its own water supply.

Upper Ashuelot. Two rooms were repainted and varnished.

Center School. Two rooms were repainted. An electric bell system and fire alarm gong have been installed.

Thayer School. Two rooms repainted and varnished. Two cement walks leading to the main entrances were laid and a new room partitioned off in the basement for an agricultural laboratory. This work was done by Mr. W. W. Kendrick without cost to the District except for the cost of materials used. I desire to give public expression of my appreciation to Mr. Kendrick for his interest and labor in behalf of the District. He had general supervision over all the repair work and was assisted at various times by Mr. Finn and Mr. Lebarge.

During the next summer I would recommend the following major projects:

- (1) Completion of the interior painting and renovating in the Upper Ashuelot school.
- (2) That the yard in front of Thayer school be graded.

(3) That at least two rooms be refinished at Center and Thayer schools.

Teachers and Pupils. The following changes in the teaching staff were made. Miss Dorothy White, who had served us with distinction for a period of five years, resigned to accept a much more lucrative position in Waltham, Mass. Mrs. Margaret Connors was transferred to Grade II and Miss Isabel Pittman to Raymond, N. H., a graduate of Plymouth Normal school was secured for Grade IV. The music work that had been done by Miss White was taken over by Miss Webster. At Thayer High school, Mr. Reed resigned to accept a more lucrative position at Glens Falls, N. Y., and Miss Grace Emery was attracted to Taunton, Mass., for the same reason. To fill these vacancies Mr. Ian M. Walker, of Providence, R. I., a graduate of Rhode Island State College, was secured as sub-master, to teach Agriculture and Manual Training and to coach athletics. To succeed Miss Emery the Board elected Miss Alma Southard of Claremont, N. H., a graduate of Keene Normal school, as teacher of Home Economics. Thus equipped in teaching staff we embarked upon the work of the year.

We have been unfortunate this winter in having epidemics of gripe and measles among the children and two instances of scarlet fever, which were completely isolated. At this writing the worst seems to be over and we shall set to **work now** to repair the educational losses before the end of the year.

In Mr. Grupe's report you will find reference to the high record of Thayer High school. Both he and his staff can take just pride in that, as well as the community. But equal praise must be given to all of the elementary teachers as well for sending to our high school pupils well trained and well equipped in the fundamentals of education. I want to express here my appreciation to the teachers, one and all, for their efficiency and loyalty and to the pupils for their cooperation in all that we do.

Health. You will find elsewhere in this report the results of physical examination of the children and the report of Miss Harris the District nurse, in regard to her work in the schools. Without her diligent efforts the epidemics, referred to above, would undoubtedly have assumed much more serious proportions. Miss Harris has rendered excellent service to the schools.

Note the report on the two dental clinics. Last year 200 children were treated and 179 received complete treatment. This year 139 pupils received treatment. I am more than delighted at this response to this work on the part of parents, and I wish to express to Dr. Qualters my appreciation for his very deep interest in this work and the high quality of service he renders with practically no profit to himself. I have seldom if ever known of any more successful dental clinics.
