**TOWN WARRANT****The State of New Hampshire**

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Windsor, in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at the North School House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear reports of Auditor and Agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$90 for State Aid construction.

6. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes.

7. To raise and appropriate money for repairs of Town Highways and Bridges.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for white pine Blister Rust.

9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools for the ensuing year including all sums legally applied for the purpose and determine how the same shall be divided.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100 for Doctor and other expenses for the Woodrow family while confined with Scarlet Fever.

11. To see what action the town will take on the Electric line.

12. "Is it expedient to alter the Constitution?"
