TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said town on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the town will accept state aid construction of the Class II road known as North Chatham and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of **\$393**; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of **\$165.33**.
4. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the municipal Budget Act.
5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100 for Pine Blister Rust control.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to induce a doctor to settle in the vicinity and how much.
8. To see if the town will vote to discontinue labor on the town road leading from State Highway to land owned by George Hill.
9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the snow rollers to make room for housing snow fence.

10. To see if the town will vote to use the Australian Ballot at the annual March meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

Our schools are continuing for another year under the direction of the same excellent corps of teachers. Our total registration does not vary much from year to year and there can be no great change in our school situation. A considerable number of our pupils go on to high school and are a credit to their training in our schools. The following are attending high school in other towns: Louise Garland, Clyde Garland, Abbie Weeks, Marilyn Hill, Ralph Hill, Ruth Head, Eva B. Anderson.

The amount of state-aid money which will be paid us next year is \$2,421.50. This can be used to reduce the budget assessment but it should be noted that the

sum raised for elementary schools exclusive of high school tuition and statutory requirements must equal five dollars on each thousand of equalized valuation. The equalized valuation is set every two years by the legislature and the figure is not available for this report but will be known before the school meeting.

If the health service is able to arrange a toxin-anti-toxin clinic, parents should inform themselves and take advantage of the opportunity. This section of New Hampshire and Maine is rapidly approaching a very desirable situation in the matter of immunization against diphtheria and there is no reason why this disease cannot be entirely wiped out.
