

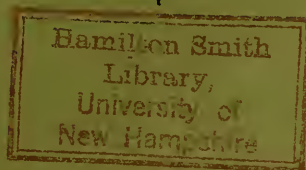

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Columbia, in the County of Coos, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on Tuesday the 10th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for three years ensuing.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more auditors for the year ensuing.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote Library Trustees for the year ensuing.
5. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers for year ensuing.
6. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.
7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of Highways.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to plough the Daniel Webster Highway through said Town, for the Fall and Winter season of 1931 and 1932.

TOWN REPORTS

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct its selectman to take such action regarding, rolling, plowing or otherwise, in keeping open winter roads in said town for the year ensuing, as in their judgment seems most conducive to the best interest of the Town, and appropriate money for the same.

10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and maintenance of State Roads.

11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the upkeep of the cemetery.

12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Public Library.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of Columbia Bridge.

14. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers and to pass any motion relating thereto.

15. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.
