

Warrant for Town Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dummer in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Pontook Schoolhouse in said Dummer on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March next, at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessaay for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along town roads.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for State Aid Construction.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Libraries.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of cemeteries.
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Poor.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise any sum of money for the celebration of the anniversary of the ratification of the Federal Constitution by the State June 21, 1938, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen.

- 11. To give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of taxes and renew notes.
 - 12. To see if the town will vote to give discount on taxes.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Dummer School Board:

Herewith is presented the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools together with the school statistics for the year.

During the past year two schools—Willis and West Dummer—were maintained. Pupils from the Pontook District were again transported to the West Dummer School.

In June last year two pupils were graduated with appropriate exercises from the Willis School and two from West Dummer Schools. Two of these four pupils are now furthering their education in Berlin High School.

In all nine pupils, residents of your town, are now continuing school work in High School.

Both schools were in operation during the past year for the period of 36 weeks as is now required. Subtracting holidays and other no school days, the schools were actually in session for 170 days. The average attendance for this period was 93.2%—a very good percentage and almost exactly the same as for the previous year.

The Superintendent has found it possible to visit your schools about once in every two weeks. Standardized tests have been given and the work of various classes inspected and an attempt has been made to give helpful suggestions whenever it needed. The school work is in accordance with the State Program of Study. Pupils in general are up to grade and doing the work which they are capable of doing.

This present year the schools have as teachers Miss Ruth Wells, a teacher of considerable successful experience, at the Willis and Miss Elizabeth Merrill, a recent graduate of Plymouth Normal School, at West Dummer.

The medical inspection has this year been done by a graduate nurse and a report made on this work.
