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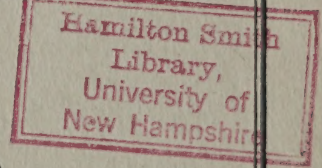

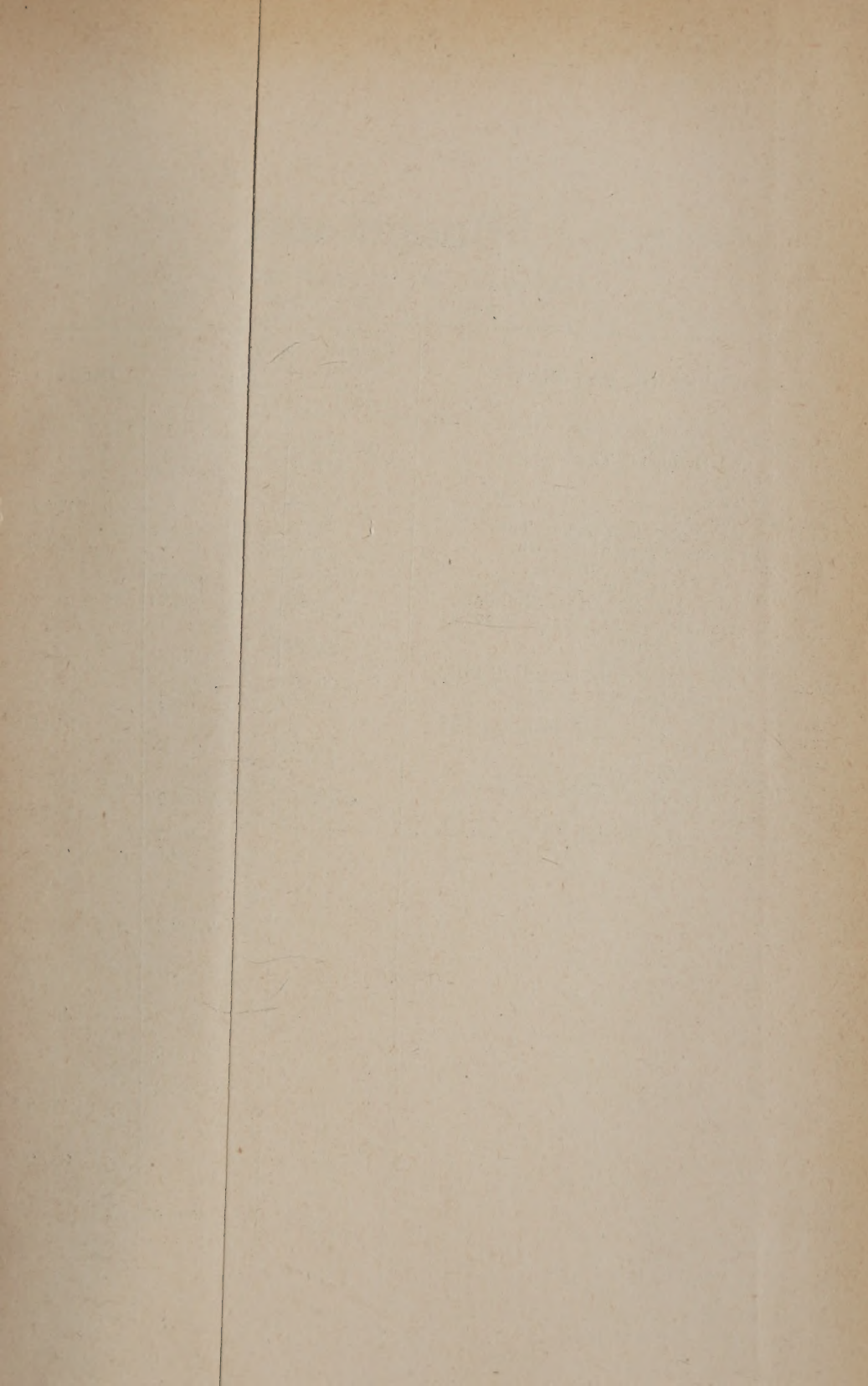

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

The State of New Hampshire

(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the Second Tuesday of March next at 8:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First—To see if the town will vote to adopt the provision of the Municipal Budget Act, and to elect a committee for the same. Their duties also shall be to advise the Selectmen in regard to town affairs.

Second—To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Budget Committee and vote to accept their recommendations as printed.

Third—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the construction and repairs of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.

Seventh—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Eighth—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to provide free Hospital Service for needy people, or act thereon.

Ninth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association.

Tenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library.

Eleventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library.

Twelfth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Eldridge Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Thirteenth—To see if the town will raise the sum of fifty dollars for the benefit of a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Fourteenth—To see if the town will continue the inspection of milk and raise money therefor.

Fifteenth—To see if the town will accept state aid for construction of the Class II road known as Butmanville Road and Mt. Support Road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$2,886.85; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,065.84.

Sixteenth—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Seventeenth—To see if the town will take any action in regard to control of the White Pine Blister Rust, and raise money for same.

Eighteenth—To see if the town will vote to give prescription permits from May first 1935, to May

first, 1936, according to Section 99, Laws of 1919, to druggists who are registered Pharmacists doing business in Lebanon, to sell liquors for medicinal, sacramental, scientific or mechanical purposes.

Nineteenth—To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Zoning Commission appointed by the Selectmen as provided in Section 53 Chapter 42 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire and act thereon.

Twentieth—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to request the New Hampshire Public Service Commission to investigate the rates and charges of the Grafton County Electric Light and Power Company and to reduce their rates so as to conform with the rates established by the Public Services' recent ruling in other parts of the State to take effect March 15.

Twenty-first—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to make a survey and build a sidewalk on the north side of the cement bridge over the Mascoma River in Lebanon center village, beginning on the Lindsay Estate on the east side of the river extending on said bridge to the town land in front of N. A. Jette's Shoe Repair Shop. That the Selectmen be instructed to build said sidewalk if in their judgment the price of said construction is satisfactory.

The above article is inserted at the request of A. J. Plamondon.

Twenty-second—On petition of Annie Bombard and others:

“To see if the town will vote to have one or more electric lights placed on Fellows Hill and raise money for the same.”

Twenty-third—On petition of Ralph Manley and others:

“To see if the town will vote to extend the sidewalk from Davis Street along Water Street to Spring Street.”

Twenty-fourth—To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Twenty-fifth—To choose one Selectman for the ensuing three years.

Twenty-sixth—To choose one Tax Collector for the ensuing year, and one highway agent for the ensuing year, two library trustees for the ensuing three years, and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Twenty-seventh—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

Twenty-eighth—To transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

Comments

Wherever possible we first determined the amount of money that should have been received by the different departments, officers and agents of the Town and then compared our findings with the records kept by the Town Treasurer and Selectmen. For example, in verifying the amount of money that should have been received from tax collections, we made a detailed analysis of the tax blotter, thereby determining the amount turned over to the Collector for collection. Discounts given were investigated with respect to the dates on which payments were received.

The funds that should have been received from the State and County were verified by direct correspondence with the State Treasurer and County Commissioner. The receipts of other departments such as the Municipal Court and Town Clerk were verified through an audit of the records of the departments in each case.

We found satisfactory vouchers to support all disbursements.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

During the past year we have had more contagious diseases reported than for several years, but fortunately most of them were of a very mild form; The following cases were reported by the Doctors and Nurses: 1 case of Trench Mounth, 10 of Mumps, 11 of Chicken Pox, 21 of Scarlet Fever, 28 of Whooping Cough, and 338 of Measles. Cards were posted and removed in all cases requiring cards, which took a lot of time and travel. We have had 3 cases of Typhoid Fever with one death resulting. There have been 18 cases of Venereal diseases reported and some of them have been given Hospital Treatment. One of the perplexing things that we have had to contend with this year has been the large number of complaints of "Dumps", some on private grounds and some beside Streets and Highways; I have investigated every complaint and made recommendations or given orders to clean them up; this condition is due somewhat to the fact that the Town Dump is so far off, and the expense of hauling so great, that people dump their rubbish in any place away from their homes. The matter of installing an "Incinerator" in or near Lebanon, should be attended to in the near future.

We have one of the best water supplies in the State, and by vigilance, we have tried to keep it so, but heedless people are constantly throwing rubbish of all kinds into the River between Lebanon and East Lebanon, although Legal Notices are posted all along the Banks. The State Board of Health, Division Maternity, Infancy and Child Hygiene, cooperating with organizations of the Town, Doctors and the Local Hospital, has carried on the following Activities in Lebanon for the year 1934. April 12, 1934 Child Health Conference for physical examination, 18 children attended; this was a very rainy day. 29 defects were found. 1 defect had been corrected since last conference, 2 placed under treatment. Under the Child Recovery Program 14 tonsil and adenoid corrections were made. Home visits to

Mothers, babies and Preschools were also made by the Nurse. Lois W. Barton, R. N., State Nurse was in charge.

Again I wish to thank all Town Officials and Citizens who have in so many ways assisted me in the performance of my many unpleasant duties.
