TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Middleton, in the county of Strafford, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Middleton on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for same, as budget below:

Election and registration	30.00
Town hall expenses	5.00
Support of poor	100.00
Library	31.00
Police department	6.00
Fire department	25.00

Article 3. (a) To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for town roads and make appropriation for same. (b) Six hundred dollars to be used for summer work; four hundred dollars to be used for snow removal.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$171.00 for state aid construction, state to appropriate \$1,000.00.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$528.17 for state and county taxes.

Article 6. (By petition.) To see if the town will vote to return to road district system.

Article 7. To see if town will vote to raise rent of town hall from \$3.00 to \$4.00.

Article 8. To see if town will vote to give selectmen power to hire money, if necessary.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the "Municipal Budget Act."

Article 10. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collectors' deeds.

Article 11. To see if town will vote to pay health officer salary of \$5.00 and make appropriation for same.

Article 12. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and committees and elect same; and to transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Middleton:

I have the pleasure of submitting to you my sixteenth annual report as superintendent of the schools of Middleton.

The usual statistics relating to the schools will be found in the following table:

The percent of attendance is lower than for the preceding year because of an unusual amount of sickness and the most severe winter experienced in many years. The names of those pupils who were neither absent nor tardy for one or more quarters during the year are as follows:

Three quarters: Alden Jenness, Arthur Kinney, June Tufts.

Full year: Clarence Jenness, Priscilla Tufts, Fred Tufts, Ruth Eastman, Willard Young.

HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

This year eight Middleton pupils have enrolled in High Schools. Four of these are in Rochester, three in Nute High School, and one in Concord.

This number is two more than we had expected and as a result our appropriation for high school tuition for the present year will run short by about \$150.00

Also, the tuition rate in Concord is somewhat higher than the average for the state, and the district will be expected to authorize the school board to pay this additional amount.

THE BUDGET

The school board's budget for next year is slightly larger than for the present year. This is chiefly due to three causes entirely beyond our control. First: The charge for high school tuition, which must be assessed. Second: An additional transportation route besides the ones which we had anticipated for the present year. This is already established. Third: The amount of state aid to be paid next December is somewhat less in amount than we received for the present year. We regret the necessity even of this slight increase, but we assure the voters that there are no items in the budget which can be reduced without causing a corresponding reduction in the amount of state aid which we should receive, and result in absolutely no saving to the district.

At the beginning of the present school year the Corner school was placed in charge of Mrs. Dorothy Cook, and the Ridge school was placed in charge of Mrs. Gladys Whitehouse. Both have previously taught in Middleton. Mrs. Cook resigned in December and her place is now filled by Mrs. Nellie A. Baker of Manchester. Work is going on smoothly in both schools.

Medical inspection in the schools is continued under the supervision of Miss Maude McBride. Her report will follow.

For fifteen years Middleton formed a part of supervisory union No. 41. Last May this union was broken up and the towns of which it had been composed were grouped with three separate unions. Middleton is now a part of supervisory union No. 64, composed of Wolfeboro, Wakefield, Brookfield, Middleton, Moultonboro and Tuftonboro.
